EMU 2019-2020 ACADEMIC YEAR OPENING CEREMONY AND FIRST LESSON IS ON THE 14TH OF OCTOBER



The Eastern Mediterranean University's (EMU) 2019-2020 Academic Year Opening Ceremony and First Lesson is taking place on Monday, the 14th of October 2019 at the Mustafa Afşin Ersoy Hall. This year's first lesson is going to be delivered by Mediterranean Universities Union Honorary President, European Women Rectors Association President and former Istanbul Technical University Rector Prof. Dr. Gülsün Sağlamer. Established in 1979, the Eastern Mediterranean University

(EMU) is honoured to be celebrating its 40th year. After graduating more than 3 thousand associate, undergraduate, master's and PhD students in the previous academic year the total number of EMU graduates has reached approximately 60 thousand. EMU featured in the 801-1000 band of the UK based Times Higher Education University rankings for 2020. This year EMU will continue to be a world renowned leading academic and social institution.

EMU AND POLICE DEPARTMENT SIGN A COLLABORATION PROTOCOL

A collaboration protocol was signed by the Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) and the TRNC Police Department on Thursday, the 10th of October 2019 in Nicosia. The said protocol which includes joint scientific work, education and cultural collaboration between the two parties was signed by EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam and TRNC Police Chief Süleyman Manavoğlu. In areas that the Police Department are in need, EMU will establish private classes to provide all kinds of education if a minimum of 10 Police Department personnel are to attend.

20% Scholarships for Police Department Personnel and Their Families

As a result of the protocol, Police Department personnel, their children and their spouses can attend all of EMU's postgraduate courses (except those delivered



by the Faculties of Medicine, Pharmacy or Dentistry, Pedagogical Formation and Joint Programs) with a 20% scholarship. The Police Department will support EMU with security matters. The Police Department will help with the identification of security strategies for EMU's facilities as well as helping with the education of academic and administrative personnel. The two parties will be able to work together in developing and implementing education programs. The protocol will enter into effect in the 2019-2020 Academic Year.

EMU WELCOMES WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP BRONZE MEDAL WINNING ATHLETE AT THE AIRPORT

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) athlete Ese Brume won a Bronze medal at the 2019 Doha World Athletics Championship long-jump competition with a jump of 6.91 metres. Upon her return from the World Athletics Championship which took place between the 27th of September and the 6th of October 2019, Brume received an enthusiastic welcome at Ercan Airport on Tuesday, the 8th of October 2019 at 11:00.

EMU Sports Affairs Director Cemal Konnolu, Ese Brume's coaches Yaya Kayode and Hasan Maydon, Sports Affairs Directorate personnel and hundreds of students from student clubs operating under the EMU Social and Cultural Activities Directorate met Brume at the airport with placards and enthusiastic chants such as "You are the best Ese Brume!" Proudly carrying her bronze medal on her neck, Brume was delighted to be reunited with her friends and EMU family. Delivering a short speech at the airport Brume noted: "I would like to thank everybody very much. You made me very happy. I was moved by this enthusiastic greeting. I love you all and I love EMU."

Visit to Rector

Despite being only 23 years old Ese Brume is already one the biggest favourites of the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games. After returning to the island Brume visited EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam in his office. During the visit, Prof. Dr. Osam stated that he is proud that an athlete of Brume's quality is an EMU student whilst highlighting how important her achievement is for the university and country. Prof. Dr. Osam concluded by congratulating Ese Brume for her great





success. Meanwhile, Brume thanked EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam and the EMU Rector's Office for their invariable support and dedicated her achievement to EMU and her home country of Nigeria. The visit came to an end with a photo being taken to immortalize the moment.

"She Is Going To Be Olympic Champion"

Brume is continuing to prepare for the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games with her EMU Sports Affairs Directorate coaches Hasan Maydon ve Yaya Kayode. Coach Hasan Maydon had the following to say after Brume's recent success: "Ese Brume was a

three year long project. EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam and EMU Sports Affairs Director Cemal Konnolu played important roles in bringing such an important athlete to our country and university. Our aims is for an EMU student to be the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games champion. We would like to thank the EMU Rector's Office for their moral and material support. I believe that our athlete will become Olympic champion. Her continuous improvement is indicative of her upcoming success." As well as her sporting achievements, Ese Brume continues to be successful in her studies at the EMU Tourism Faculty.

"Zero Tolerance to All Types of Violence!"

In her opening speech following the screening of EMU's promotional film and a musical recital by Education Faculty, Department of Fine Arts Education, Music Teaching Program academic staff, EMU-CWS Director and Conference President Assoc. Prof. Dr. Süheyla Üçışık Erbilen touched upon their founding purpose and activities. Indicating that they set off with the slogan "Zero Tolerance to All Types of Violence",



Assoc. Prof. Dr. Erbilen emphasized that 220 papers have been presented at their annual conference which is "Gender, Space, Place & Culture" themed this year. In a speech of her own, EMU Vice Rector for Administrative and Technical Affairs Prof. Dr. Naciye Doratlı provided information about the university. Stating that EMU-CWS shines like a star Prof. Dr. Doratlı wished everyone a fruitful conference.

The Conference Attracts Great Interest

Following the opening speeches, European Women Rectors Association (EWORA) Honorary President and Former Istanbul Technical University Rector Prof. Dr. Gülsün Sağlamer delivered a talk titled "The Role of Leadership in the Promotion of Gender



Equality in Higher Education and Research". This was followed by a talk from Ankara University, Faculty of Languages, History and Geography, Department of Geography Vice-Chair Assoc. Prof. Dr. M. Murat Yüceşahin titled "Is It a Man's World? Understanding Feminist Geographies". The conference which attracted great interest will continue for three days with parallel sessions. Until Saturday, the 12th of October 2019 the 7th International Conference on Gender Studies will feature the contributions of numerous valuable speakers. THE CYPRUS PROBLEM AND DEVELOPMENTS IN THE MEDITERRANEAN DISCUSSED IN EMU





The Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Cyprus Policy Centre (CPC) and Business and Economics Faculty, Department of Political Science and International Relations organized a discussion panel titled "Quo Vadis Cyprus Conflict and the Eastern Mediterranean" The said panel took place on Wednesday, the 9th of October 2019. Nicosia University academic staff member Prof. Dr. Hubert Faustmann and EMU Political Science and International Relations Chair / CPC Director Prof. Dr. Ahmet Sözen attended the panel as speakers. The panel was moderated by EMU Business and Economics Faculty Vice Dean / Political Science and International Relations academic staff member Asst. Prof. Dr. Umut Bozkurt. During the opening speech, Asst. Prof. Dr. Bozkurt thanked everyone in attendance for their participation and stated that they are going to examine the Cyprus problem and issues in the Mediterranean via different paradigms.

"There is Desire for a Solution but No Belief"

Prof. Dr. Sözen started his talk by touching upon how Cyprus intersects with many regions geopolitically before providing a general evaluation of the events which led to today. Drawing attention to public opinion on both sides island, Prof. Dr. Sözen stated that there is desire for a solution but no belief. Prof. Dr. Sözen then stated that the disconnect between politicians running the peace negotiations and other segments of society and a lack of trust is decreasing the possibility

of a solution. Prof. Dr. Sözen underlined that it is not easy to plan a solution that will make both sides and the guarantors happy, to get this plan accepted at a referendum and to implement such a plan. Indicating that after the discovery of hydrocarbon in the Middle East actors such as America, Russia, Israel, Egypt and Lebanon have become included in the Cyprus problem Prof. Dr. Sözen stated that it is very difficult to predict the future because of rising tensions in the region.

"No Natural Gas in Cyprus Before a Solution"

After Prof. Dr. Sözen', Prof. Dr. Faustmann, the invited speaker of the panel, started his speech by explaining the historical development of the Cyprus problem and stating that the control of the island by England in 1878 resulted with the Greek Cypriots' desire to self-govern. Prof. Dr. Faustmann added that the Cyprus problem is not related to religion, and that neither community is in favor of living under the direction of the other party. Among the problems experienced in the solution of the problem are the Greek Cypriots' inability to absorb the political power of the Turkish Cypriots with a 50% of power and a population rate of 18%, their belief that Turkey's would use its guarantorship for intervention any time they wish and, last but not least, their EU membership. Prof. Dr. Faustmann also pointed out that whilst the international community justifies the gas extraction by Greek Cypriots, it does not approve the exclusion of the Turkish Cypriots from the proceeds.

Prof. Dr. Faustmann added that on the other hand, the Greek Cypriots did not include the Turks in the decision-making authority and only stated that they would gather the Turk's share in a fund and hand it to them after a possible solution. Prof. Dr. Faustmann concluded his speech by stating that there would be no solution for the natural gas issue without a solution to the Cyprus conflict.

BLOOD DONATION CAMPAIGN FROM EMU ACADEMIC UNION



Eastern Mediterranean University Academic Personnel Union (DAÜ-SEN) organized a very meaningful campaign. DAÜ-SEN organized a blood donation campaign due to the decrease in the stocks of our country's blood banks. This

campaign was specially arranged for cancer and thalassemia patients who need to take blood regularly. On 7-8-9 October 2019, between 10:00-16:00, many EMU staff and students participated in the campaign at the entrance of the EMU Atatürk Square

by donating blood. This blood donation campaign was organized in collaboration with DAÜ-SEN, the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC) Ministry of Health Blood Bank and Northern Cyprus Turkish Red Crescent.

THE INTERNATIONAL EX-LIBRIS COMPETITION JURY EVALUATION WILL BE AT EMU

The jury evaluation of the Ex-libris Competition organized by the Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Communication Faculty, Department of Visual Arts and Visual Communication Design and Poland's Silesia University is taking place on the 1st of November 2019. The ex-libris work of approximately 100 artists from 30 countries is going to be evaluated by an international jury.

The theme of the contest is free but, one of the four awards will be on the special subject of "Spirit". Certificates of participation will be delivered and a selection of the best art work will be included in a catalogue published by Silesia University. The artwork will then

consecutively be exhibited at EMU and Silesia University in Katowice, Poland. 
