



## EMU ANNOUNCED AS A TOP UNIVERSITY FOR PHYSICAL SCIENCES



On Tuesday, the 19th of November 2019, UK based Times Higher Education (THE) released its 2020 World University Rankings for physical sciences (mathematics, physics and astronomy, chemistry and statistics). The rankings featured giant universities such as Princeton University, California Institute of Technology, University of Cambridge, Stanford University and Harvard University. By featuring in the 601-800 band of the rankings, Eastern Mediterranean

University (EMU) became the only university from the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC) to feature on the rankings.

### **A Total of 1054 Universities Made it to the Rankings**

A total of 1054 universities made the rankings. EMU was sixth amongst Turkish universities, featuring behind Bilkent University in the 401-500 band, Boğaziçi University, Koç University and Sabancı University in the 501-600 band

and Atılım University in the 601-800 band. A total of 26 Turkish universities made the rankings. EMU was third amongst Cypriot universities following two universities from South Cyprus that appeared in the 401-500 and 601-800 bands.

### **First on the Nature Index Rankings**

The Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Faculty of Arts and Sciences had previously been ranked first in all of Cyprus in the Physical Sciences category of Nature Index's European University Rankings, which has been annually announcing success rankings by country and academic institutions since 2015. In the period covering August 1, 2018 - July 31, 2019, EMU was ranked 2nd in Cyprus (including South Cyprus) in the European University Ranking of Nature Index 2019 in all fields with its publications and academic

achievements. By ranking within the top 35 institutions in Europe and the top 10 in Turkey, EMU earned the Nature Index Badge.

### **EMU on World Rankings**

The Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) also featured in the 501-600 band of THE's 2020 rankings of universities providing engineering and technology education. A total of 1008 universities featured on the list in which EMU was fifth amongst Turkish universities, second amongst Cypriot universities and the only university from the TRNC. In addition, on the 6th of November 2019, EMU featured in the 201-250 band of THE's ranking of universities for Business and Economics education in 2020. EMU was the only university from the TRNC to feature on the list. EMU ranked higher than any Turkish university or university from South Cyprus.

## EMU HOSTS A WORKSHOP TITLED JOINT ADMINISTRATION FOR TRNC FISHERY



The Workshop on "Joint Administration for TRNC Fishery" was organized by the Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Underwater Research and Imaging Center in collaboration with the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC) Ministry of Agriculture and Natural Resources, Department of Husbandry and the Society for the Protection of Turtles (SPOT). The workshop was hosted by EMU and commenced on the 21st of November 2019

at the Mustafa Afşin Ersoy Hall with the contributions of MAVA Foundation, World Wildlife Fund – Turkey (WWF – Turkey) and EMU.

Speaking at the opening of the workshop, Society for the Protection of Turtles President Kutlay Keço touched upon the foundation and activities of the society indicating that they have reached an important place in the world with their internet broadcasts.

In a speech of his own, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam stated that EMU is a university that places importance on the ecosystem whilst adding that human beings are at the core of negative changes in the ecosystem. Highlighting the importance of the workshop being concerned with problems relating to fishery Prof. Dr. Osam noted that waste from ships and micro plastics are leading to marine pollution. Prof. Dr. Osam concluded by relaying his



belief that the conclusions of the workshop will contribute to universal literature.

TRNC Minister of Agriculture and Natural Resources Dursun Oğuz highlighted the importance of the workshop regarding the preparation of a plan, statute and legislation on fishery. Minister Oğuz went on to underline his belief that the conclusions of the workshop will greatly contribute to the development of fishing in the country. Stating that the seas



are everybody's Minister Oğuz noted that their true owners are fishers who earn their living from the seas.

Minister Oğuz highlighted the importance of protecting the seas all together. Indicating that fighting against marine pollution and protecting the seas is a societal challenge Oğuz stated: "We can't go back in time and get rid of pollution. The ecological balance of the

sea is being destroyed. Marine life is changing. A project that doesn't include fishers cannot be successful." Minister Oğuz concluded by inviting fishers to participate in the workshop and to express their opinions.

After the opening speeches the following sessions took place: "Small Scale Fishery and Joint Management" / "The Current Situation in the TRNC: Where We Are & Where We Are Going". Republican Turkish Party (CTP) MP Erkut Şahali and EMU Vice Rector Prof. Dr. Hıfısiye Pulhan were also present at the opening of the ceremony. The workshop came to an end on the 22nd of November 2019 with group work that was carried out to identify appropriate methods for sustainable fishery.

Under the moderation of former Republic of Turkey Minister of Foreign Affairs Şükrü Sina Gürel, Asst. Prof. Dr. Göktürk delivered a visual presentation titled “Ankara University Political Science Graduates in the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus National Struggle”. During the presentation of his declaration, Asst. Prof. Dr. Göktürk emphasized that the Turkish Cypriot National Struggle is a historic saga. Asst. Prof. Dr. Göktürk stated that the Turkish Cypriot

community formed the Turkish Resistance Organization (TMT) to defend themselves after the Greeks formed the EOKA terror organization in 1955 with the aim of the planned eradication of Turkish Cypriots. Asst. Prof. Dr. Göktürk stated that there were Ankara University Political Science Graduates who became a part of TMT during this difficult period, taking up honorable roles in the Turkish Cypriot struggle which eventually led to the formation of an independent state.

Asst. Prof. Dr. Göktürk noted that the fundamental concern of his declaration were Ankara University Political Science Graduates İsmail Bozkurt and Taner Etkin who acted as commanders in the Turkish Cypriot National Struggle and worked at different ranks of the state after the Cyprus Peace Operation, playing a part in the political process as state representatives and ministers.

## EMU HEALTH SCIENCES FACULTY RELEASES A STATEMENT ON WORLD COPD DAY



Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Faculty of Health Sciences Dean Prof. Dr. Mehtap Malkoç released a message on the occasion of World Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD) Day. Stating that organized by the Global Initiative Against Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (GOLD) group, the World COPD Day is held on the third Wednesday of November

each year, Prof. Dr. Malkoç conveyed that the World COPD Day is a global effort trying to boost people's understanding of this global health problem.

Prof. Dr. Malkoç's statement reads as follows "COPD is a disease that is not fully reversible and is characterized by progressive airflow restriction which makes people with this disease progressively unable to breathe. The incidence of COPD is 15-20% in adults over 40 years of age. In other words, one out of every five people over 40 in our society has COPD. Today it has become the third cause of deaths worldwide."

### Smoking is the Largest Cause

Highlighting the fact that smoking is the most important risk factor for COPD, Prof. Dr. Malkoç added that "apart from individuals who smoke 1 pack of cigarettes a day for approximately 20 years, exposure to intense cigarette smoke is an important risk factor, even if they do not actively smoke. In addition, exposure to chemical dust and gases, air pollution, environmental pollution, and especially coal, wood, and bush used in homes for cooking and heating purposes and genetic factors are all important factors in the development of COPD in individuals. Individuals who smoke have cough and

phlegm as well as shortness of breath. Physical activity is reduced due to the shortness of breath and this decreasing physical activity reduces daily tasks, significantly affecting the quality of life of an individual and leading to the death of a person."

### How can We Avoid COPD?

Stating that there is a 30 to 40% decrease in the mortality rates caused by this disease in the hospital admissions of COPD individuals who walk for at least two hours a week or more. Dr. Malkoç continued her statement as follows: "The amount of physical activity plays a major role in the prevention and progression of COPD. The importance of multidisciplinary approach is once again highlighted on World COPD Day. If we can raise awareness about the symptoms of COPD with doctors, physiotherapists, dieticians and other health personnel with the slogan 'Increase COPD Awareness Worldwide', people with symptoms can receive appropriate treatment and stop the rapid destruction of their lungs, resulting in low mortality rates due to COPD as well as reduced numbers of hospitalizations and new COPD patients. As a result, regular exercise, regular and balanced diet, keeping the environment clean, and avoiding harmful fumes and gases all protect you from COPD."
