The Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus Minister of Labour and Social Security Zeki Çeler visited EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam at 3:00 p.m. on Wednesday, 27 February 2019.

During the visit, two important topics were discussed, namely Social Security Amendment Draft Act and Social Insurance Amendment Draft Act. Minister Çeler stated that they have been working on the draft act which was prepared during the period of former Minister Ersan Saner and that they have increased the number of provisions. In this respect, Minister Çeler provided information to Prof. Dr. Osam on the issue of compulsory registration and improved provisions. Putting forth that serious revisions protecting the rights of workers have been implemented on the aforesaid draft acts with amendments,



Minister Çeler invited the Eastern Mediterranean University's technical support towards the draft act. Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam stated that EMU has always fulfilled his duty of public services and

will continue to do so. At the end of the meeting, Prof. Dr. Osam stated that the university will provide full support to the TRNC Ministry of Labour and Social Security.

EMU HOLDS A PANEL ON KHOJALY MASSACRE



A panel titled “Human Rights, International Law and Khojaly Massacre” commemorating the 27th anniversary of Khojaly Massacre was held under the auspices of the Eastern Mediterranean University with the joint efforts of EMU Azerbaijani Student Society, Azerbaijan Diaspora Youth Association and Cyprus Azerbaijan Diaspora Center.

The panel which took place at Mustafa Afşin Ersoy Hall at 2:30 p.m. on 27 February 2019 was attended by notable officials including the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus Deputy Parliamentary Spokesperson Zorlu Töre, Azerbaijani Member of the Parliament Nagif Hamzayev and EMU Vice Rector for International Affairs and Promotion Prof. Dr. Cem Tanova.

After the observation of a moment of silence, the National Anthem of Azerbaijan and the Turkish National Anthem, President of Famagusta ‘Ülkü Ocakları’ Sinan Öztürk provided information on Khojaly Massacre and stated that the Turkish Nation will never forget what happened to their cognates. Commemorating all martyrs with respect, Öztürk ended his speech by saying “We haven’t forgotten and we will never forget”. In a speech of his own, Prof. Dr. Cem Tanova

stated that they have gathered to commemorate Khojaly Massacre, which is an affront to humanity. Prof. Dr. Tanova also put forth the fact that towards the end of the 20th Century, a great shame of humanity took place in 1992. Professor Dr. Tanova emphasized that the pain of the Khojaly massacre, during which a total of 613 people were massacred, is felt by all who are human. Putting forth the fact that “We both have one language and share a single fate”, Prof. Dr. Tanova added that Turkey, TRNC and Azerbaijan are stronger together and these three states will get stronger and have tighter bonds in the future. Expressing his hope that such an affront to humanity is never encountered again, Prof. Dr. Tanova commemorated all martyrs with respect.

Following the opening speeches, Azerbaijani Member of the Parliament Nagif Hamzayev presented TRNC Deputy Parliamentary Spokesperson Zorlu Töre ‘Azerbaijan Service Award’. Following a documentary screening featuring the images of Khojaly Massacre martyrs, “Human Rights, International Law and Khojaly Massacre” panel moderated by the President of the Azerbaijan Slavic Youth Association Sabuhi Abbasov was held.



EMU OFFERS WORKSHOPS FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS



Workshops offered by Eastern Mediterranean University for high school final year students of the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus have commenced. Expected to host over 1200 high school students from different schools in the TRNC, the workshops were held at various academic units of EMU between 09:30 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. on Monday, 25 February 2019. The said workshops will continue on 4, 5 and 11 March.

The workshop sessions which took place on the 25th of February were attended by students from Kyrenia and Famagusta regions studying at Lapta Yavuzlar High School, Anafartalar High School, 19 May Turkish Maarif College and Famagusta High School of Trade. On the second day of the workshops, schools from Famagusta region, namely Famagusta Turkish Maarif College, Namık Kemal High School, Famagusta Vocational High School, Dr. Fazıl Küçük Vocational High School of Industry, Doğa College, Polatpaşa High School and Cumhuriyet High School, attended the workshops. Students were grouped according to their prospective career choices and attended workshops along with expert faculty members.

45 Different Topics

On 4 March 2019, students of Güzelyurt Turkish Maarif College, Kurtuluş High School, Güzelyurt Vocational High School, Cengiz Topel Vocational High School of Industry, and Lefke Gazi High School from Morphou and Lefke regions will

be participating in the workshops. On 5 Mart 2019, students of İskele region high schools, namely, Bekirpaşa High School, İskele High School of Trade, Erenköy High School, Karpaz Vocational High School and Cumhuriyet High School will benefit from the aforesaid workshops. On 11 March 2019, students from high schools located within the Nicosia district will attend the workshops. The said schools are Bülent Ecevit Anadolu High School, Nicosia Turkish High School, Anatolia High School of Fine Arts, Turkish Maarif College, 20 July High School of Science, Atatürk Vocational High School, Sedat Simavi Industrial High School, Levent College, Ted College and Değirmenlik High School.

Taking place under 45 different topics, the workshop sessions aim to help high school students explore and develop their existing skills and talents.

Prof. Dr. Deniz İşçioğlu, TRNC Central Bank representatives, and faculty members. President Günay stated that the protocol aims to carry out research, educational and publication activities within EMU's and TRNC Central Bank's

joint vision of providing community services and contributing to the TRNC economy.

Joint Research to Be Conducted

In addition to be acting as a serious step towards increasing academic publications to be prepared on the TRNC economy, the protocol is believed to be beneficial for both institutions. Expressing his satisfaction of working in collaboration with EMU, President Günay stated that with the establishment of a research unit under the Central Bank, they aim to fill the gap in this field and provide academic guidance. In scope of this protocol, aiming to increase the number of joint publications of EMU Faculty members and Central Bank research unit on TRNC economy, the publications sought to contribute to the TRNC economy and the banking sector will be presented awards by the TRNC Central Bank in line with the criteria specified within the scope of the collaboration protocol.

EMU FACULTY OF ARCHITECTURE DESIGNS 2019 AHMET VURAL BEHAEDDİN CALENDAR



Eastern Mediterranean building of the “Nicosia High University (EMU), Faculty School for Girls”, currently of Architecture, Ahmet Vural known as “Nicosia Turkish Behaeddin Committee carried High School”, an award-winning work of Modernist Turkish Cypriot architect Ahmet Vural Behaeddin, which also composed of the images of the featured in the April issue of

1965 Baumeister magazine. The Baumeister magazine was one of the most prestigious architectural magazines of the period and allocated the aforesaid issue to the buildings of education. Taking part in the publication of the 11 most successful projects selected from all over the world is a strong indicator of the success of the design of the Nicosia High School for Girls.

This calendar project is considered to be an important document in keeping the memory of Ahmet Vural Behaeddin, who left us his valuable architectural works that can be accepted as the direct proof of his level of civilization and carrying his legacy to future generations. The project was carried out by Faculty of Architecture Ahmet Vural Behaeddin Committee within the scope of a protocol signed between EMU Architecture Faculty and, on behalf of Ahmet Vural Behaeddin, his spouse Tülin Behaeddin.

The launching event of the calendar took place at Nicosia High School for Girls (currently known as Nicosia Turkish High School) under the auspices of the TRNC Ministry of National Education and Culture, Culture

Department. The said event started with EMU Architecture Faculty Ahmet V. Behaeddin Committee President and Architecture Faculty Vice Dean Assoc. Prof. Dr. Banu Tefvikler Çavuşoğlu’s presentation on Architect Behaeddin. EMU Vice Rector for Academic Affairs Prof. Dr. Tanju Besler, EMU Architecture Faculty Dean Prof. Dr. Özgür Dinçyürek, and Ahmet V. Behaeddin’s spouse Tülin Behaeddin delivered speeches regarding Ahmet V. Behaeddin’s works and his architectural personality as well as the traces he left in the memory of the society and the important task he undertook in the development of the society.

Prof. Dr. Besler and Prof. Dr. Dinçyürek extended their gratitude and appreciation to Tülin Behaeddin for her contributions to all projects carried out in memory of Ahmet V. Behaeddin and TRNC Minister of National Education and Culture Cemal Özyiğit and Culture Department Director Şehbal Hamzaogulları for their contributions in the organisation of the 2019 Calendar keeping the memory of Architect Ahmet V. Behaeddin.

EMU DR. FAZIL KÜÇÜK MEDICINE FACULTY ORGANISES AN AWARENESS SYMPOSIUM IN COLLABORATION WITH THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH



A symposium titled “Are We Aware?” organised by Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty in collaboration with the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus Ministry of Health with the aim of raising awareness towards women’s cancers took place in Bostancı Village in Morphou region with the participation of TRNC Minister of Health Dr. Filiz Besim. During the said symposium which took place on Wednesday, 20 February 2019, the participants were informed about the frequency of women’s cancers.

Prof. Dr. Handan Onur provided information on the frequency of women’s cancers and stated that in order to protect against cervical cancer, boys and girls should be vaccinated against the HPV virus between the ages of 11 and 14. After Prof. Dr. Onur, Prof. Dr. Doğan Bor stated that the medical devices used in the diagnosis of diseases should be standardized in terms of radiation safety. He emphasized that it is very inconvenient to have frequent tomography scans of children especially during the ages of physical growth. He also added that the devices we use, such as phones, do not pose a risk

to radiation, and that the fears are out of place.

Participants Practiced

Speaking at the symposium, EMU Prof. Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty Asst. Prof. Dr. Bülent Sezgin stated that every woman should perform breast self-examination at home once a month. In this way, women will be aware of the changes in their breasts in the process such as discoloration, orange peel appearance, breast pitting in the skin, nipple retraction and discharge from the nipple. Assist. Prof. Dr. Sezgin added that in the event of encountering the aforesaid symptoms, one should contact the doctor at their earliest convenience. Assist. Prof. Dr. Sezgin also illustrated the said changes through visuals. At the end of the presentation, with the support of students of medicine, the breast examination technique was practiced by female participants.

EMU Faculty of Arts and Sciences, Psychology Department academic staff member and Expert Psychologist Naife Sevdalı also delivered a presentation in which she stated that the most difficult period for cancer patients is the acceptance

and adaptation process of the disease. Sevdalı stressed that both the cancer patient and the family members of the patient should receive psychological support. Ministry of Health Expert Dietitian Dr. Dn. Ayşe Okan stated that popular among the people of Cyprus, barbecue cooked meat forms contain cancer-forming substances, Dr. Okan added that there should be at least 30 cms between the coal and meat, otherwise it will increase the carcinogenic effect of the coal in the meat.

Dr. Okan also put forth that olive oil is frequently used for frying but it is wrong as it is not resistant to high temperatures. Dr. Okan also advised the participants to avoid mouldy food and added that even sprouted potatoes are harmful for health. Dr. Okan finally stated that food in bulging or swelling cans should not be consumed.

What should be Done?

EMU Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty Dean Prof. Dr. Nahide Gökçora stated that 4 February is an awareness day and awareness is being informed about the risk factors and trying to protect oneself, accordingly. Prof. Dr. Nahide Gökçora added that 1/3 of cancer cases which bring a huge burden on the economy of the countries and seriously affect human lives can be prevented. According to Prof. Dr. Nahide Gökçora, 3.7 million lives can be saved annually with the application of correct strategies.

Prof. Dr. Gökçora added that with early diagnosis and treatment, it is possible to achieve 100% success in many types of cancer, such as cervical cancer. Prof. Dr. Gökçora listed breast cancer risk

factors as advanced age, genetic predisposition, being overweight, being pregnant over 30 years of age, having menopause over 55 years of age, having menstrual periods before the age of 12, taking alcohol, not exercising, smoking and eating unhealthy.

Prof. Dr. Gökçora listed the risk factors of cervical cancer as sexual intercourse at a young age, smoking and HPV infection. Prof. Dr. Gökçora ended her presentation after listing 10 things to be done to protect against cancer:

- Try to maintain your ideal weight. For this purpose, do not consume much sugar.
- Avoid eating from single sources of food.
- Remember the importance of fiber intake in cancer prevention. For this reason, instead of white bread, consume rye, bran or whole-wheat bread.
- Choose to bake or boil as cooking method. Stay away from smoked food.
- Do not smoke or stay in environments where others smoke.
- Avoid inactivity and try to increase your daily physical activity.
- Reduce tea and coffee consumption. Drink 2-2.5 liters of water per day.
- Try to consume 2 to 3 times a week food with antioxidant nutrients and omega-3 fatty acids. Increase the frequency of consumption of foods with high antioxidant content such as broccoli, cauliflower, and cabbage.
- Try to keep daily salt consumption below 5 grams
- Limit consumption of foods with high salt content such as pickles and food in brine.

EMU DR. FAZIL KÜÇÜK MEDICINE FACULTY RELEASES A STATEMENT ON “3 MARCH WORLD HEARING DAY”

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty released a statement on 3 March World Hearing Day. The statement released by EMU Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty Academic Staff Member and Otolaryngologist (Ear, Nose, Throat, Neck and Head Surgeon) Op. Dr. Didem Rıfkı, stated that the International Hearing Day is held on 3 March, the birthday of Alexander Graham Bell, who carried out important work for the persons with hearing impairment. On 3 March each year, various activities are organised to draw attention to hearing and ear care as well as preventing deafness and hearing loss. Op. Dr. Rıfkı stated that this year's theme is “Check Your Hearing” and added that “It is known that 466 million people with hearing impairment exist in the world. Over 1 billion young people are also at risk of hearing loss due to exposure to loud sound

“Many People are not Aware of the Problem”

Noting that one in every three people over 65 years of age is experiencing difficulty in hearing, Op. Dr. Rıfkı put forth that “This year, the World Health Organization emphasises that those who are at risk of hearing loss, such as those over the age of 50, working in noisy places, those who listen to loud music for a long time and those with ear problems should test their hearing at certain times. Many people can live without realizing their hearing loss. Early detection of hearing loss is extremely important to prevent progression. According to data from the World Health Organization, there are 32 million children with hearing loss worldwide. Hearing loss of more than half of them could have been prevented. Of these, 40% were caused by genetic reasons, 31% by infections such as measles mumps rubella and meningitis, 17% by low birth weight and neonatal jaundice, and 4% by drug use in pregnancy.

How can It be Prevented?

Emphasizing that 50% of the factors causing hearing loss are preventable, Op. Dr. Rıfkı added that “Among preventive measures are children undergoing hearing screening in the neonatal period, having measles, meningitis, mumps and rubella vaccines, being selective particularly when using ototoxic (internal ear-damaging) drugs,



receiving effective treatment for otitis media and preventing exposure to excessive noise. One should always remember that the earlier the diagnosis of hearing loss is provided, the better the treatment and the development of the individual would be.

The first 2 years of a newborn are extremely important because it is a period for speech development. Each newborn should be screened and diagnosed within the first 3 months and treatment should start within the first 6 months. Babies who are diagnosed with hearing impairment within 6 months after their birth at the latest and who have been given a hearing aid and who are trained in hearing and speech can develop similar skills to their normal hearing peers. It should be kept in mind that babies whose hearing loss has been diagnosed and trained at an early stage have a positive effect on their mental, social and spiritual development alongside with language development.

The hearing loss can be minimized, and communication can be brought close to normal, with young-age operations such as

attaching a cochlear implant or brain stem implant. Family and teachers are the most important factors in recognizing the hearing loss of children. Hearing loss should be suspected in children who have decreased school success or prefer to sit close to the television at home.

Important for Life Quality

Op. Dr. Rıfkı recommended all to visit an Ear, Nose and Throat (ENT) Specialist in the event of encountering ear tingles, pain, fullness, and discharge. Op. Dr. Rıfkı concluded her statement as follows: “Similarly, loud contact should be reduced. Listening to music very loud with headphones is harmful. In addition, those who are exposed to high volume at work must wear earplugs. As the age progresses, the inner ear cells age and hearing loss occurs. Recognizing this situation early can lead to significant changes in the life quality of a person. Every newborn should be screened and a high-risk person should have a hearing test at regular intervals. Ear problems should be taken seriously and the ENT specialist should be consulted before the hearing loss occurs.

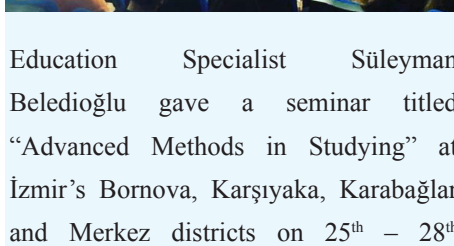
