## WORLD UNIVERSITY EMU THIS TIME APPEARS IN SHANGHAI RANKINGS

Ranked amongst the best universities in the world by international independent rating organisations, Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) has recently been included in the Academic Ranking of World Universities 2019 of China-based ShanghaiRanking, an independent organisation which has been the official publisher of the Academic Ranking of World Universities since 2009.

In the said rankings, Eastern Mediterranean University appears within the 76-100 band in the Hospitality and Tourism Management Category. As the only university from Cyprus appearing on the list, Eastern Mediterranean University is also the top ranking university amongst the universities of Turkey. The only university from Turkey, apart from EMU, qualifying for the aforesaid list within the 151-200 band in the

Hospitality and Tourism Management Category is Akdeniz University. In addition to all, whilst EMU has become the only university appearing in ShanghaiRanking's Economics Category in the TRNC, the university is also the top ranking university both in Cyprus and Turkey in the said category. Only three universities from Turkey appear within the first 500 in the Economics Category. More specifically, following EMU, which is ranked first, Koç University has appeared in the 301-400 band and Boğaziçi University within the 401-500 band. The University of Cyprus, which is the only university in the Greek Cypriot Administration to be included in the list, appeared within the 401-500 band in Economics Category after EMU.

The Academic Ranking of World Universities (ARWU) was first



published in June 2003 by the Center for World-Class Universities (CWCU), Graduate School of Education of Shanghai Jiao Tong University, China, and updated on an annual basis. Since 2009 the Academic Ranking of World Universities (ARWU) has been published and copyrighted by ShanghaiRanking Consultancy. ShanghaiRanking Consultancy is a fully independent organization on higher education intelligence and not legally subordinated to any universities or government agencies. ## EMU TO BUILD FACULTY OF DENTISTRY THROUGH ITS OWN RESOURCES

Eastern Mediterranean University signed a protocol with Asin Construction Company regarding the construction of the first phase of the Eastern Mediterranean University Faculty of Dentistry building. The protocol signing ceremony took place at Board of Trustees' Meeting Room at 2:00 p.m. on Tuesday, 20 August 2019. Among those present at the ceremony were EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam, Asin Construction Director Taşkın Ürel, Vice Rector for Academic Affairs Prof. Dr. Halit Tanju Besler, Vice Rector for Administrative and Technical Affairs Prof. Dr. Naciye Dorathı, Rector's Coordinator Assist. Prof. Dr. Davut Solyalı, Administrative Affairs Coordinator Assist. Prof. Dr. Müge Rıza, Purchasing and Inventory Control Directorate Manager Taşkın Fidaner and press representatives.

In scope of the protocol, Asin Construction Company will carry out the first phase of the construction works of the aforesaid



faculty on a turnkey basis. The construction work will finish in 4.5 months.

### To Be Built with EMU's Own Resources

Delivering a speech at the signing ceremony, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam stressed that EMU is building the Faculty of Dentistry through its own resources and without any external

support. Highlighting the importance of the Faculty of Dentistry for the university, Prof. Dr. Osam added that established 40 years ago as an institution providing engineering education, over the years, EMU has gradually embraced other branches of science, namely social sciences educational sciences and health sciences. Prof. Dr. Osam also highlighted the prospective contributions of the faculty's graduates both to the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus and the whole world.

Also speaking at the ceremony, Asin Construction Director Taşkın Ürel stated that their company has established numerous collaborations with EMU in various areas and assured the university administration that as always, they will be fulfilling their duty as required and on time. ### EMU Faculty of Dentistry Joint Program Accepting Applications for the First Time

In line with a protocol settled between the Eastern Mediterranean University and Turkey's Health Sciences University, the Turkish Higher Education Council approved EMU Faculty of Dentistry and the Turkish Republic Health Sciences University Joint Program will be admitting its first students during the current year. Currently awaiting the approval of the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus, the Higher Education Planning, Evaluation, Accreditation and Coordination Council (YÖDAK), the program is inviting the applications of students with IGCSE, GCE, and A/AS Level exam results. Applications

may be submitted to EMU Registrar's Office. On the other hand, the university is currently processing the registrations of TRNC nationals who have gained the right to enroll at the Eastern Mediterranean University after taking EMU Entrance and Scholarship Exam on 7 June 2019.

The aforesaid registration process will continue until 20 September 2019. Students registering for the first time are required to apply to EMU Registrar's Office for the relevant procedures.

## EMU HEALTH SCIENCES FACULTY HAS BECOME A GIGANTIC EDUCATION INSTITUTION

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Health Sciences Faculty took its first step to academic life in 2010-2011 Academic Year by accepting students to Department of Physiotherapy and Rehabilitation, Department of Nutrition and Dietetics and the Department of Nursing. In 2011-2012 Academic Year, EMU Health Sciences Faculty established Department of Sports Sciences and Department of Health Management which were the first of their kind in Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC). EMU Health Sciences Faculty kept growing during 2012-2013 Academic Year by establishing the School of Health Services. In the same year, the faculty started student admissions to the Associate Degree programs of First and Emergency Aid, and Anaesthesia. During the following semester, more Associate Degree programs were made available in Dialysis, Medical Imaging Techniques, Physiotherapy, Radiotherapy, Surgery Services, Elder Care and Oral and Dental Health. An Orthopedic Prosthetics Orthotics Associate Degree program will also be offered in 2019-2020 Academic Year. The EMU Health Sciences Faculty which has completed its 8th year of providing education also offers English language Undergraduate programs in Nutrition and Dietetics, Physiotherapy and Rehabilitation and Nursing. Therefore, the faculty has become a gigantic education institution which also offers 3 Postgraduate and 3 PhD programs.

### Laboratories of the Highest Standard

EMU Health Sciences Faculty aimed to maximize its laboratory standards for training Healthcare Professionals, thus advanced technological laboratories were established in the first year of the faculty. New laboratories are being to be added to the faculty each year.

### The Aim is to Contribute to Community Health as well as Providing Quality Education

EMU Health Sciences Faculty not only aims to train members of the health service sector, but also to contribute to community health. For this reason, the Centre for Healthy Living and the Centre

of Prosthesis, Orthosis and Biomechanics were established to help contribute to community health as a result of utilising the expertise of academic staff. The faculty continues to carry out work in order to develop and become integrated into the modern and advanced global education system, by opening new departments, centres and laboratories as well as working with new academic staff.

In a statement, EMU Health Sciences Faculty Dean Prof. Dr. Mehtap Malkoç emphasized that they are shaping their scientific activities based on the requirements of the country and in line with global developments. Prof. Dr. Malkoç stated: “We are training our students to be ethical individuals who possess the skills required for creative thinking and feel a sense of responsibility towards society. We want our students to be sharers, researchers, productive, open to innovation professionals who participate in multidisciplinary work with well-rounded thoughts and a principle of always learning new information.”

Prof. Dr. Malkoç underlined that the faculty aims to produce, apply and spread knowledge about health in our country, to train individuals who have advanced abilities and to be an education and research institution at international

Prof. Dr. Malkoç relayed that every department of the faculty operates with the knowledge that applied case studies are as just as important as theoretical knowledge and, therefore take the steps required to create new fields of application. Eastern Mediterranean University Business and Economics Faculty (FBE) is ready for the new academic year with its international faculty members. Having started its educational activities with 40 students in 1986 with its two undergraduate programs in the field of Business and Economics, the Faculty has increased its student numbers to 2,500. The fact that the courses take place outside working hours also bring various advantages for the staff working at public offices. A discount between 20 to 40 % will be offered to those working at government

offices and institutions with which the university has settled relevant protocols.

### Up to 40% Discount

All participants of the aforesaid programs working at TRNC government offices will be offered 20% discount in their tuition fees while registering for the postgraduate programs during the 2019 – 2020 Academic Year Fall Semester. It is also added that in addition to staff working at government offices, demands from private institutions will be taken into consideration. In this respect, staff of institutions or organisations who have/to settled/settle collaboration protocols with EMU will be eligible for a discount ranging between 30% and 40%.
