In addition to these developments, we are on

“Willing to Contribute”

Stating that they have been planning to develop online activities in digital platforms, Boğaç also stated that they wish to contribute the social communication, interaction and socialization dynamisms of cinema apart from the present projects they have been working on. By adapting the measures taken during the pandemic process, Boğaç expressed that they would like to organize “Open Cinema” movie screenings in and out of campus. Boğaç also emphasized that among similar projects, they would like to create a safe environment for the concept of “Car Cinema” by realizing the necessary organizations in terms of providing opportunities for the cinema experiences that both EMU students and society of Famagusta longed for.

EMU HAS REACHED ITS CURRENT LEADING STATE UNIVERSITY POSITION WITH THE SUPPORT OF THE REPUBLIC OF TURKEY

The Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Rector's Office made an overall assessment of the 2020-2021 Academic Year Fall Semester student registrations. In the evaluation, the importance of the support provided by the Republic of Turkey's Higher Education Board to the higher education sector of the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC) has been emphasised. It has also been stated that the Student Friendly Island Project initiated by the TRNC Ministry of National Education and Culture will have positive reflections on the TRNC higher education sector. The statement reads as follows:

“According to the EMU 2020-2021 Higher Education Institutions Examination (YKS) placement results, EMU has become the only university that has increased the number of students placed among TRNC universities the most, both in number and percentage, compared to the previous year. In the 2020-2021 Academic Year, a total of 1,635 students have gained admission to EMU. Considering the YKS placement results, there has been an increase of 7.43% in the TRNC compared to the previous year, while the number of students placed in EMU increased by 26.06%. EMU was also the most preferred university considering the equivalent student numbers.

According to the 2020 YKS additional placement results, a total of 135 students have been admitted to our university. When these figures are compared with the figures of last year, this year there has been a 35% increase in the number of students who have been placed at our University through additional placement. Following these results, according to the 2020 YKS exam and additional placement results, 1,770 students have been placed in our YKS quota, which is 2,219 in total. When this figure is compared with the total figure of the previous year, it is seen that an increase of 27% has been achieved this year. According to the results of the Vertical Transfer Exam (DGS), EMU has reached a placement rate of 90% by filling 103 out of the 114 quota. Having started its educational activities in 1979 under the title of the ‘Higher Education Institute’, the Eastern Mediterranean University, with



significant contributions from the Republic of Turkey, was founded by the TRNC state as a state university in 1986, and raising the bar for success every year, has reached its leading position today. Since its establishment, EMU has worked as a big family to achieve great success and to reach better places with each passing day. EMU has succeeded in becoming a local-level city university, a national-level state university, and a world university in the international arena. In the development process of our university, the contribution of the Republic of Turkey has been felt at every stage. All programs of EMU have been approved by the Republic of Turkey Higher Education Council (YÖK) ensuring the recognition and equivalence of its diplomas.

EMU is committed bringing up graduates acting in line with the universal values, adopting internationally recognised academic education criteria as a guide, producing solutions to regional and international problems with the awareness of social responsibility, internalising multiculturalism, free thinking, tolerance and participation. The university also aims to conduct work for the development of scientific production, arts and sports at an international level. Eastern Mediterranean University has also succeeded in making its voice heard all over the world by acting as a whole with its city and its citizens, with its country. With its accreditations, its place in world university rankings, international memberships, certificates and collaborations, EMU adds a new achievement to its success every day with students from 110 different countries. CONTEMPORARY MUSEUM PROJECT FROM EMU DAKMAR



Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Faculty of Arts and Sciences, Department of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences Chair and Eastern Mediterranean Cultural Heritage Research Center (DAKMAR) Chair Assoc. Prof. Dr. Bülent Kızılduman gave information about the international excavations carried out by DAKMAR to carry out research on different civilizations in the Eastern Mediterranean geography, the artifacts discovered and the contemporary museum project they are planning to create.

Speaking about the Kaleburnu King's Hill, where DAKMAR conducted an international archaeological scientific rescue excavation, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Kızılduman said, "The archaeological site that we call the King's Hill

is one of the important kingdoms dating back 3,200 years from today, located in Karpaz region. We have discovered a lot of artefacts here. We aim to preserve these artefacts first in our restoration and conservation laboratory in DAKMAR and then exhibit them in the museum we are planning to establish under the roof of our university. We are carrying out this project in cooperation with the Department of Antiquities and Museums."

"Many Artefacts Unveiled"

Stating that Kaleburnu King's Hill was discovered in 2004 and the rescue excavations started in 2005, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Kızılduman said, "We carried out the work we started here in cooperation with Germany's Tübingen University. Afterwards, the works carried

out by our institute started to be carried out internationally. Currently we are conducting excavations with participants from the Czech Republic, Italy, Germany and Turkey and unearthed many archaeological artifacts. These artifacts are currently under the control of the Department of Antiquities".

"We Are Trying to Reveal the Past in All Aspects"

Underlining that there are many bronze artifacts unearthed in the excavations they conducted in 2004-2014 and 2017, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Kızılduman said, "These bronze artefacts constitute the widest range of bronze works from the Late Bronze Age in the entire Eastern Mediterranean region. There are very remarkable ones among these bronze artefacts. If you look at them not only in terms of numbers, but also with their type of use and values in the past, they constitute a masterpiece. What we want to do is to realize the restoration and conservation processes by using scientific contemporary restoration methods. Because in the past, the artefacts were unearthed in the excavations carried out by archaeologists and were exhibited in the museum after a general maintenance. However, modern archeology does not consist of such a concept.

Nowadays, we are trying to reveal the past life in all its aspects. We are trying to understand the climatic conditions of the past, the belief systems of humans, which animals were domesticated in the past, which plant

species were cultivated, with whom they were traded, and when the first inventions such as writing were first used. There are bronze, ceramic and fabric works unearthed in Kaleburnu. Stating that the understanding of museology in Cyprus unfortunately has not gone beyond the concept of museology in the 1980s, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Kızılduman said, “The museum we are planning to build is a contemporary museum under the umbrella of EMU, where interactive methods are used and the concept of education is included in the museum.

We will Keep Lothar Herling’s Memory Alive

Stating that while conducting archaeological excavations in Kaleburnu village in Karpaz in 2014, they came across a very important artefact group, the bronze hoard known as “treasure” by the public, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Kızılduman said, “We had a German colleague in our team. He left the team and returned to Turkey. But after learning that this group of artifacts was unearthed, he wanted to come and see the artifacts on site and contribute. He was so excited when he saw the group of artifacts while participating in the excavation work on the field. With that excitement and fatigue, he unfortunately died of a heart attack. We commemorate archaeologist Lothar Herling with respect. He was someone who approached Cyprus and King’s Hill with great affection. His family



was also aware of this. Therefore, his family sent us books on Cyprus from their library. We currently keep them in the library named after him at our research center and make them available to researchers. Therefore, we want to keep this library alive forever by developing and transferring it to a museum we will construct ”

“We Crowned Our Achievements with New Master’s Programs”

Assoc. Prof. Dr. Kızılduman added that they have reflected the accumulation of their work at the Eastern Mediterranean region

on the recently launched Urban Archeology and Cultural Heritage Management and Preservation and Restoration Master’s programs being carried out under the collaboration of Faculty of Arts and Sciences and Faculty of Architecture. He also stated, “We will continue our studies with the contemporary scientific education approach of our university in order to protect the cultural heritage of our country, to keep it alive, to research it with scientific methods and to pass it on to future generations, especially with the scientific studies to be carried out within the scope of our newly opened programs.”

EMU IMPLEMENTS PSYCHOLOGICAL HEALTH INTERVENTION PROGRAM IN COLLABORATION WITH ROEHAMPTON UNIVERSITY



The psychological health intervention program called “Super Skills for Life (SSL)” has been implemented on university students aged 18-30 under the name of “Super Skills for Life - Young Adult version (SSL-YA)” by the Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) in collaboration with Roehampton University in the UK within the scope of the research project “Preventing mental health problems

among university students”. The research was conducted between January and July 2020 at the Center for Applied Research and Assessment in Child and Adolescent Wellbeing (CARACAW) affiliated to Roehampton University, Department of Psychology, by EMU Psychological Counseling, Guidance and Research Center (PDRAM) Psy. Dr. Fatoş Özeylem, Prof. Dr. Cecilia Essau from Roehampton University and Prof. Thomas Ollendick from Virginia Tech University in the USA.

Super Skills for Life (SSL) is an extensive global research/application network that includes Turkey and South Cyprus. Its children’s version (6-11 years) and adolescents’ version (12-18 years) are implemented in 18 different countries and 20 different research centers. The first implementation of the program for university students was made in collaboration with EMU and Roehampton University. EMU has taken part in this global research / application network representing the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus.

Psy. Dr. Fatoş Özeylem stated that the Super Skills for Life (SSL) program was implemented simultaneously with two sources, a workbook and a handbook, and consists of 9 different sections including Transition to University Life, Resilience, Healthy Life, Self-esteem, Emotions and Thoughts, Thoughts-Emotions-Behavior, Relations and Social Skills, Problem Solving Steps, Hopeful & Goal-Oriented Future. Psy. Dr. Fatoş Özeylem added that the program can be implemented as a minimum 5 and maximum 9-week program. Psy. Dr. Özeylem stated that following the adaptation of the SSL program for university students, the program has also been translated into Turkish under the name of Super Skills for Life - Young Adult Version, and that the program aims to provide healthy coping skills to those with emotional difficulties such as anxiety, depression and stress that may appear during individuals’ adaptation to the university life and new environment.
