Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) continues its artistic activities within the framework of the protocol signed with Rüstem Bookstore. In this context, EMU diversified its activities with the design exhibition of Günay Güzelgün, a Cypriot artist who was born in 1944 in Luricina. The exhibition opened on Monday, January 6, 2020, at 18:30 at the Rustem Bookstore.

Attending the exhibition were EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam, Founder Dean of the Faculty of Dentistry Prof. Dr. Aydın Karakuzu, Dr. Fazıl Küçük Faculty of Medicine Dean Assoc. Prof. Dr. Emre Hamurtekin, Head of Visual Arts and Visual Communication Design Department Prof. Dr. Senih Çavuşoğlu, EMU Art Coordinator and Exhibition Curator Zehra Şonya, Artist Günay Güzelgün, Rüstem Bookstore employees and art lovers. Günay Güzelgün's exhibition can be visited until January 31, 2020, except Sundays, from 10:00 to 19:00.

"We Have Added Almost 400 Pieces of Art"

The opening speech of the exhibition, which includes around 140 drawings, was held by EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam, who said, "When we took office about six years ago, we stated that a university must have certain criteria for being a university and one of them is the value that can be given to the society and the artist. During these six years, I and my dear colleagues have shown our best efforts to protect and work with our esteemed artists living in Cyprus, and we have added nearly 400 pieces of artwork to our archive. Therefore, when I look at it from my own perspective and evaluate my sensitivity towards society, it makes me very happy that we have not reached a bad point in those six years."

"A University Should Contribute to the Culture of the Society"

Prof. Dr. Osam emphasized his wish that the rector, who will take over the office after him, should maintain this vision, and continued "Because the university is not only producing qualified publications and educating people. At the same time, it is necessary to carry out the necessary work that will contribute to



the culture of the society, albeit to a certain extent.

We have shown our best efforts so far and I am very happy. The important thing here is to be able to reveal our secret artists and display them for the community to see. This evening's exhibition is of great importance in this respect. I would like to thank our dear coordinator Zehra Şonya for the work she has done and will do so far. I believe that the works to follow will contribute greatly to the island. The fact that a nation can reach certain points in time is a feature that can emerge with its serious approach to works of art and artists. As EMU, this is what we are trying to do, and I hope it will be a long-term effort and our artists will take their place both in

society and in literature. I sincerely thank our artist and curator for providing us with this opportunity."

"I Would Like to Thank the Beauty of My Village"

Speaking at the opening of the exhibition artist Günay Güzelgün said: "I would like to greet everyone who has come and graced us with their presence. I would like to thank Zehra Şonya, our esteemed sculptor who spent time and effort to organize this event, my mother and father who created me, and everyone who has made the smallest contribution to me at this stage. I am indebted to and thank the white soil, water, deep blue sky, surrounding hills and the beauty and values that I cannot finish counting of my unique village".

EMU TO ATTEND THE EASTERN MEDITERRANEAN REGIONAL FAIR



Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) under the auspices of the President of the Republic of Turkey and hosted by Cukurova University, will attend the Fair of “DABKAF’20 - Eastern Mediterranean Regional Career Fair” which will be held between April 16 and 17, 2020. EMU Vice Rector for Promotional Affairs Prof. Dr. Hıfısyne Pulhan and Derviş Ekşici, Director of Alumni Communication and Career Research Directorate will participate on behalf of EMU. The career fair, which will host nearly 15,000 participants from 22 universities, will take place at the Çukurova University Congress Center.

Prof. Dr. Pulhan underlined that our university will be represented in the best way at the said event and stated that experts in the following scientific fields will also be in attendance; Physiotherapy and Rehabilitation, Anesthesia, First and Emergency Aid, Nursing, Psychology, Psychological Counseling and Guidance, Engineering and IT. Prof. Dr. Pulhan reported EMU has a total of 6049 graduates in the Cukurova region, with 1341 graduates only in the last 3 years, and expressed there are especially 459 graduates in the Hatay region alone. Prof.

Pulhan went on to say that EMU graduates were currently in successful places and in successful positions, and on research conducted across 4081 companies, it was found that there were 72 graduates at C-Level, 167 at VP, 421 at Director level and 598 at Manager level.

Work and Internship Opportunities at 100’s of Companies

The fair will include more than 100 companies for students and alumni from every department. At the same time, training sessions will be organized by the participating companies within the halls in the congress center. In addition to these training sessions, graduates and graduate candidates will be able to find employment opportunities and internship opportunities for students who will continue their education. Students and graduates will be able to participate in the activities to be held free of charge within the scope of DABKAF’20.

DABKAF’20 announced the following call for participants: “Eastern Mediterranean Career Fair invites you to open a brand new page for your career, to take solid steps towards your future and attend two

full days of career focused fair. Within this scope, there will be booths for hundreds of companies, for students and alumni from each department, where job and internship applications will be received, as well as different events, business and internship interviews, workshops, experience sharing and conferences by speakers who will be invited to the event, along with training sessions will be organized with panels.”

Queen's University's Investment Assessment and Risk Analysis certificate is given to students registered in the graduate programs of the EMU Business and Economics Faculty who are successful both in English and Turkish courses and exams.

EMU DENTISTRY FACULTY DEAN PROF. DR. AYDIN KARAKUZU JOINS A HEALTH TEAM IN SOMALIA



Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty academic staff of cardiovascular surgery and Dean of the Dentistry Faculty, Prof. Dr. Aydın Karakuzu,

representing EMU, was part of a 90-person health aid sent to the capital city of Somalia, Mogadishu, by the Republic of Turkey, following a terror attack there, to assist and

treat the wounded. A cargo ambulance plane belonging to Turkey's Air Force escorted the health aid team to Mogadishu, who treated the wounded there and returned to Turkey with 15 severely wounded victims of the terror attack for further treatment. Prof. Dr. Karakuzu advised that he forwarded well wishes on behalf of EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam and the Turkish Cypriots and that EMU has always continued and will continue to be the supporter of the oppressed and the victims with all the means at their disposal.

Somalian authorities extended their appreciation to EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam and the EMU family, for providing them aid during difficult times.

ENERGY SECURITY AND THE CYPRUS PROBLEM WERE DISCUSSED AT EMU



Organised by the Eastern Mediterranean University Cyprus Policy Center (EMU-KPM) and EMU Business and Economics Faculty, in collaboration with the International Relations Department, a seminar titled “Turkey’s Eastern Mediterranean Cyprus and Energy Security Concerns and Problems” took place at EMU with the participation of Yaşar University Faculty Member Prof. Dr. Emre İşeri. Moderated by EMU Political Science and International Relations Department Chair and Chair of the EMU-KPM Prof. Dr. Ahmet Sözen, the seminar started with Prof. Dr. Sözen’s opening speech, featuring the introduction of the speaker Prof. Dr. İşeri and his work.

“Game Changing Discoveries”

Prof. Dr. İşeri started his speech by emphasizing the relationship between the energy tension in the Eastern Mediterranean and the international framework, and then went on to elaborate on the developments in the Eastern Mediterranean in the context of the international system, the overlapping and conflicting political and economic interests of countries that are effecting the situation. In 2009 Israel’s, Cyprus in 2011 and Egypt’s in 2015 discovery of energy in their regions was a game changer. Although İşeri stated there is a great opportunity for a regional cooperation and peace project, such as the 1952 European Coal Steel Community, which forms the basis of the European Union (EU), it makes things much more complicated, and one of the main reasons for this is the conflict of interests

between major powers at the international system level. Professor İşeri, in this context, stated that the EU has threatened sanctions against Turkey and using this as a tool, has attempted to change the position of Turkey in the Eastern Mediterranean.

“The Tension is not dropping”

Emphasizing that the international framework should be understood in order to understand why we are experiencing militarization of energy issues today, Prof. Dr. İşeri stressed the importance of some historical developments that created fractures in this context. Prof. Dr. İşeri, continued to explain that in the year of 1990 there was a steadily increasing crisis tension in relation to S-300 in Cyprus, and regardless of the fact that Turkey’s EU membership candidacy was accepted at the 1999 Helsinki meeting, it still did not manage to lower the tension. When Justice and Development Party (AKP) came to power, between 2002 and 2006, İşeri pointed out the Europeanization of Turkey’s foreign policy was experienced. He went on to say that the Cyprus problem for AKP, was seen as an obstacle with relation to regional politics and EU Candidacy, and for this reason they departed from the traditional Turkish foreign policy, removing the issue from the security agenda, and adapted to a new policy with regard to Cyprus. İşeri continued his speech by saying that the Annan Plan, which was held to referendum in 2004, was an alternative to a solution, but that the Greek Cypriot side represented the entire island. Despite the fact

the Greek Cypriots said no to the plan and the Turkish Cypriots said yes, the embargoes continued.

“Pressure was Applied”

In 2005, Turkey’s Customs Union additional protocol was extended, and pressure was applied for them to recognize the Greek Cypriots, and in 2006, the 8 chapters that were to be negotiated remained pending, and following this period, Turkey’s foreign policy began to have more of an Asian perspective. During this time the Arab springs uprising increased and the relations between Israel and Turkey in relation to Blue Marmara in 2011 increased the Asian perspective, and shaped Turkey’s point of view in relation to their energy exploration and regional perspective. Prof. İşeri explained that Turkey’s objections and arguments were voiced in the international arena in a manner against Turkey, and he believes that Turkey’s agreement with Libya should especially be extended to other countries in the region, including Egypt.

EMU Political Science and International Relations Department students and faculty members who participated in the seminar, during the question and answer part of the event, learned of the competitiveness of Eastern Mediterranean gas in the face of cheap gas in Russia. Prof. Dr. İşeri pointed out that in the divided countries, the issue is evaluated in the context of sovereignty beyond the energy dimension.

EMU HEALTH SCIENCES FACULTY STATES THE PREVENTIONS TO BE TAKEN TO PROTECT AGAINST FLU

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Health Sciences Faculty academic staff and expert in community health, Assist. Prof. Dr. Levent Eker, released a statement regarding preventions to be taken to protect against contracting seasonal flu. The influenza virus that leads to the flu illness is a contagious infection of the respiratory system that is widespread during the spring and winter seasons. Assist. Prof. Dr. Eker explained “Many people are effected, and it could lead to death for individuals with chronic illnesses, and it poses economic difficulties both on the individuals’ and states’ economy, so it is an important community health problem. The community should not confuse the flu illness with the common cold”.

“The Common Cold and the Influenza Virus are Different”

The common cold, which can be caused by 200 different viruses and the influenza virus that leads to the flu illness, should not be confused, as they have different characteristics advised Assist. Prof. Dr. Eker, who went on to say “The common cold can be viewed with symptoms such as a runny nose, blocked nose, sore throat, weakness and a small bout of high temperatures. Body temperature will

generally be above 38 degrees. With the flu, you have all the above with additional higher temperatures, headache, cough and muscle pain. Flu symptoms will be at its strongest for 2-3 days, and will last for 7 days. Following this period, recovery will begin, however it could last up to 1-2 weeks. The flu virus can be caught by little droplets in the air, when a contaminated person talks, coughs or sneezes. It can also be caught by touching an infected person’s hand, talking in close proximity or kissing”.

How Can We Protect Ourselves?

Assist. Prof. Dr. Eker explained how people can protect themselves and those around them; “Infected individuals should not make physical contact with anyone. When they are sneezing or coughing, they should close their mouths and nose with a tissue, and immediately throw the tissue in the bin. They should avoid touching their infected eyes, nose and mouths with their hands and frequently thoroughly wash their hands with soapy water. Individuals who are unable to wash their hands fequently, should utilise disinfectant gels when necessary, clean frequently used chairs and table tops and avoid crowded areas as much as possible.



Special attention should be given to diets, ensuring fresh fruit and vegetables are consumed, while drinking as much liquid as possible. Other than the medication prescribed by a doctor, no other medication should be consumed. Antibiotics do not treat the flu virus. Those whose health is mostly at risk when contracting the flu virus are pregnant females, or people who suffer from chronic illnesses such as diabetes, hypertension and KOAH. When symptoms begin, they should immediately consult a doctor”.

EMU FACULTY OF EDUCATION, DEPARTMENT OF ELEMENTARY EDUCATION ORGANIZED A CONFERENCE TITLED “DOMESTIC VIOLENCE”

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Faculty of Education, Department of Elementary Education organized a conference titled “Domestic Violence”. Within the context of “We Are Stronger Together Project” of Support to Life from Women Association (KAYAD), KAYAD Project Coordinator Lawyer Mine Atlı was the speaker and EMU Faculty of Education, Department of Elementary

Education Lecturer Assist. Prof. Dr. Nihan Koran was the moderator of the conference. EMU Faculty of Education, Department of Elementary Education, Elementary School Teacher Education and Pre-School Teacher Education program students showed great interest to the conference.
