Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Arts and Sciences Faculty, Department of Mathematics has been ranked 11th in the 2019 year ranking list on turkmath.org website by Turkish Mathematical Society and outpaced the most deep-seated universities' mathematics departments.

Within the scope of SCE, the rankings are sorted by analyzing articles published in the field of theoretical and applied mathematics in Turkey and Turkish



Republic of Northern Cyprus. EMU Department of Mathematics was ranked in the 15th place during the rankings between 1980 and 2014, and 14th place during the rankings between 2014 and 2019 due to the department's recent achievements.

EMU CENTER FOR WOMEN'S STUDIES AND EDUCATION RELEASES A MESSAGE ON 25 NOVEMBER INTERNATIONAL DAY FOR THE ELIMINATION OF VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN

Eastern Mediterranean University Center for Women's Studies and Education Executive Board Chair Assoc. Prof. Dr. Süheyla Üçışık Erbilen released a message on the occasion of 25 November, International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Erbilen made the following statements in her message:

"The International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women on November 25 is one of the important symbols of women's revolt against gender discrimination and its manifestation of gender-based violence.

Violence against women, which is observed in all areas of life, has a universal character regardless of social class, culture, nation, race. It is increasing and spreading rapidly and is a human rights violation and a public health problem. Women and girls are subjected to various types of violence such as domestic violence, sexual harassment and abuse, rape, forced marriage, and murders on the pretext of "honor". International human rights agreements such as the United Nations International Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW) and the Convention on Preventing and Combating Violence Against Women and Domestic Violence (Istanbul Convention), which the TRNC has also accepted, impose many positive obligations on states to combat violence against women effectively.

In this context, in order to effectively combat violence against women, it is necessary to take and implement all necessary legal measures immediately. At this point, mechanisms that will protect the victims of violence and prevent secondary victimization and effectively prosecute the perpetrator are of vital importance. In addition, in order to prevent violence against women, it is essential to create social policies that will raise awareness in cooperation with all segments of the society and to allocate



financial resources for them. It should not be forgotten that the most important issue in combating violence against women is to remove patriarchal barriers and to ensure gender equality in all areas of life (family, working life, education, political participation).

Being aware of its responsibility, EMU Center for Women's Studies and Education continues its involvement in this struggle. On the occasion of the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women on November 25, we once again express our longing for an equal world where women reach their deserved place in social, economic and political life without violence and on the basis of human rights.

ASSIST. PROF. DR. FERNANDEZ TALKS ABOUT EMU WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE

World-renowned young mathematician Assist. Prof. Dr. Arran Fernandez gave an interview to the University of Cambridge and stated that he is glad to be an academic staff member in Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) and also to be living in Northern Cyprus. Expressing that he has visited local schools in the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC) in order to talk about the beauties of mathematics, Assist. Prof. Dr. Fernandez said that students were fascinated by someone from University Cambridge coming to EMU as an academic staff member and, they realized that EMU is a world university.

Following his doctoral study, Assist. Prof. Dr. Fernandez wrote to EMU to be able to come and do research. Assist. Prof. Dr. Fernandez started his duty as a guest academician in EMU in 2018. During the interview, he said: "It is a quite interesting story for me. People find it interesting for someone who studied in Cambridge to choose here but not anywhere in the world to continue his studies. I am happy to be here".

A member of EMU since 2018

Assist. Prof. Dr. Fernandez is a member of EMU Arts and Sciences Faculty, Department of Mathematics since 2018. Even though he is 25 years old, Assist. Prof. Dr. Fernandez achieved many success until today. He continues to teach at EMU Department of Mathematics and the students of Engineering Faculty. EMU Arts and Sciences Faculty Dean Prof. Dr. Mehmet Ali Özarslan expressed the university's happiness to have Assist. Prof. Dr. Arran Fernandez as a member of EMU family. Prof. Dr. Mehmet Ali Özaraslan also stated that having such an important academician in the university plays a vital role for EMU.

Assist. Prof. Dr. Fernandez had the highest score at the GCSE mathematics exam in 2003 and became the youngest person ever to complete the exam with the highest score. Assist. Prof. Dr. Fernandez, while being at the age of 15, has begun his education at Cambridge University Difficult High Mathematics education in 2010. Dr. Fernandez became the youngest student that had been



accepted to an undergraduate program by Cambridge University since 1773. Assist. Prof. Dr. Fernandez graduated from Cambridge University, Mathematics Undergraduate Program in January, 2013 with a High Honor Degree and was awarded "Senior Wrangler" title that is given to the best mathematicians in England and which is considered as "the highest level of intellectual success". Dr. Fernandez completed his doctoral degree in Cambridge University in the field of Mathematics in 2018, at the age of 23.

The transformations of the image of the Island also show the island character, despite what an island was supposed to be as a space isolated and, in a way, independent in its identity, in fact has a relational character. An island among something: such as a land among waters, calmness during turmoil, paradise in decline."

The winning and deemed worthy for exhibition works will meet with the audience at an exhibition planned to be held in December 2020.

LOGO OF GEÇİTKALE MUNICIPALITY REDESIGNED WITH EMU'S CONTRIBUTIONS



The logo of Geçitkale Municipality was redesigned and renewed with the support of the Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Communication Faculty, Visual Arts and Visual Communication Design Department. The Winning Logo Belongs to Kemal Menemenci

Providing information about the competition organized to determine the new logo, EMU Visual Arts and Visual Communication Design Department Chair Assist. Prof. Dr. Fırat Tüzünkan stated that 35 students participated in



the competition and Vice Chair of the Department Shahryar Mirzaalikhani and lecturer Marjan Khajavi also supported the project as advisors. A total of 63 designs featured in the contest, where students worked intensively and produced highly qualified pieces. The design, which embodies today's contemporary design requirements. received full points from all jury members as a logo that artistically blends the olive tree, one of the symbols of the Geçitkale region, and the Cittaslow membership of the Municipality.



EMU DENTISTRY FACULTY DEAN PROF. DR. HİKMET SOLAK'S STATEMENT ON DENTISTRY DAY

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Faculty of Dentistry Dean Prof. Dr. Hikmet Solak made a statement on the occasion of Dentists' Day and Orthodontic Health Week. Prof. Dr. Solak touched on the following matters in his statement:

What is Dentists' Day?

Although the practice on dental treatment dates back to 3000 BC, dentistry as an independent profession came to existence in the 18th century. For many years, the history of Turkish Dentistry had been studied as a part of Turkish Medicine History. 19th century Ottoman medicine turned its steps towards the West and gained a more modern characteristic compared to past. Tanzimat Reform and Constitutional Monarchy movements also played a leading role in this regard. With the establishment of the Republic of Turkey, foundations of many institutions, that were to become much more modern than the previous ones, were laid. Modern medicine and dentistry education started during this period.

Tiphane and Cerrahane-i Amire (medicine and surgery schools during Ottoman Empire period), established on the 14th of March, 1827, constitute the first modern stage of medicine training in Turkey. The schools were then combined in 1938 and were called "Mektebi Şahane". After Civil School of Medicine received its title of faculty on the 1st of October, 1908, the budget of the School of Dentistry were set on the 22nd of November, 1908. The school started its actual trainings on the 28th October, 1909. With the establishment of the Dentistry School, dentistry training gained a modern aspect.

22nd of November, 1908 is the date when negotiations for the establishment of a "Dental School" in the Council of Teachers in Ottoman Medicine and, the first Faculty of Dentistry was established on the very same date, 22nd of November, 1908. The number of school's first graduates was 43 but it had reached to 84 in 1926.

Following the War of Independence, assistants were hurriedly appointed to replace the non-muslim teachers who had left the country. Due to the inadequacy of the academic staff members and the lack of opportunity for dentistry students to have chance of practice before graduating the school lead to students graduating the school without having real practice such as even without pulling a tooth. None of the teachers had written a guidebook or translated an existing book to be used by the newly graduate dentists during their practices. During these years, the graduates of the school are referred as the worst years of the school due to their lack of knowledge and ability, and therefore, the threatening role they played towards to the society. There were French dentists still in Hatay during this period. The dentists who were trained by these French dentists later became the popular doctors. The doctors did not hold an official degree but they were allowed to work due to the permit given pursuant to the old rules.

With the amendment in 1928, all the dentists who were performing the profession because of the permit but did not have a diploma were required to apply to the Medicine Faculty and take exam within the first three months following the announcement of the amendment (Tababet ve Şuabatı Sanatlarının Tarz-ı Icrasına Dair Kanun"). Dentists who had received a year of education and successfully completed their studies in the Dentistry Faculty received a license. Individuals who had been practicing in health sector prior to the Dentistry School and also received the title of Dentist



following an examination, and the second class dentists were exempted from this recent condition. All the applicants were deemed successful due to the consecutive resignations of exam commission members. There was not any hierarchy order within the licensed dentists and second class dentists. Transition to the Modern dentistry started with the establishment of İstanbul University Medicine Faculty Modern Medicine School in 1933. The number of qualified dentistry graduates increased during the following years with the influence of the increase in the number of dentistry faculties. Today, there are still a few dentists with permits from that period.

Turkish Dentists became a part of "Turkish Medicine Association" as of 1953. In 1984, "Turkish Dentists Association" and accordingly, "Chamber of Dentists" were established. Upon the Turkish Dentists Association's request dated 17.01.1996 and approvals of Ministry of Health (ref. no. 28.02.1996/1769, Ministry of National Education (ref. no. 07.02.1996/624) and Ministry of Internal Affairs (ref. no. 26.04.1996/3204), 22 November has been officially referred as the "Dentistry Day". Since 1996, the week of 22 November has been celebrated as the "Orthodontic Health Week" in order to emphasize the importance of oral and dental health.
