A cooperation protocol has been signed between the Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) and the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC) Ministry of Tourism and Environment on Monday, 11 October, 2021, at 09:00 a.m.

Minister of Tourism and Environment Fikri Ataoğlu and EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Aykut Hocaanin signed the said protocol

covering the landscaping and landscape design project of Rauf Raif Denktaş Mausoleum and Museum located in Nicosia Republic Park.

In a press statement, Prof. Dr. Hocaanin stated that they came together for a very important project and added that a protocol will be signed regarding the landscaping of the late Founding President Rauf

Raif Denktaş's mausoleum. Noting that the project design process by EMU will proceed successfully together with the related stakeholders, Prof. Dr. Hocaanin added that they take pride in EMU's involvement in this project. Expressing that they will fulfill this project as a state university, Prof. Dr. Hocaanin stated that EMU is an important institution of the TRNC in the public arena and is

determined to share its scientific and technological accumulation on issues as such in addition to the academic, research and social activities. EMU RANKED WITHIN THE 201-250 BAND IN BUSINESS AND ECONOMICS FIELD OF TIMES HIGHER EDUCATION WORLD UNIVERSITY RANKINGS, TAKING THE TOP PLACE IN CYPRUS AND TURKEY

The U.K. based Times Higher Education (THE), the publisher of widely-referenced university rankings worldwide announced the World University Rankings in the field of Business and Economics. Only EMU from the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC) and 11 universities from Turkey have appeared in the ranking, in which a total of 795 universities have been included. EMU Business and Economics Faculty, which appeared in the 401-500 band last year, increased its success this year and has appeared amongst the world's top 250 Business and Economics Faculties, whilst sharing the first place with Koç University in Turkey in the 201-250 band. Bilkent University, METU, Sabancı University and Yıldız Technical University, which succeeded in being listed among Turkish universities, have appeared in the 401-500 band and thus, come second. Boğaziçi University, Dokuz Eylül University, Hacettepe University, Istanbul University and Marmara University shared the third place in the 601+ band. Three universities in total made it to the list across the island of Cyprus, while EMU has appeared in the top band among these universities. Among the said universities, the second ranked university is in the 501-600 band.

EMU HAS BECOME THE FIRST COVID-19 APPROVED SAFETY EDUCATION INSTITUTION IN THE TRNC AFTER UNDERGOING THE AUDIT OF AN INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATION



Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) has undergone the inspection of the International Certification Agency Inspect on 11-12 October 2021. As a result of the audit conducted by the inspectors Food Engineer Nurettin Uzun and Food Engineer Ozan Ateş, EMU has received the first “COVID-19 Approved Safety Education” certificate in the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC). The opening meeting of the audits took place on Monday, 11 October, 2021, at 09:30 a.m., at the EMU Board of Trustees’ Meeting Room.

EMU Vice Rector for Administrative and Technical Affairs Prof. Dr. Serhan Şensoy, Administrative and Technical Affairs Coordinators Hasan Kavaz and Mahmut Dağtekin, Total Quality Management Center Director Hüseyin Yetiner, Pandemic Board Chair Assist.

Prof. Dr. Mehmet İlktaç, Inspection Auditors Nurettin Uzun and Ozan Ateş, and Trainer/Consultant Latif Sakar attended the meeting after which a document review was carried out. A site inspection was conducted in the afternoon and the following day, and the closing meeting was held at 16:00 on Tuesday, 12 October, 2021, at the EMU Board of Trustees’ Meeting Room where the outcome of the inspection was announced.

Speaking at the closing meeting, EMU Vice Rector for Administrative and Technical Affairs Prof. Dr. Serhan Şensoy thanked for the inspections carried out in the campus for two days and the feedback given by the auditors. Prof. Dr. Şensoy emphasized that EMU

is always open to external audits, both academically and administratively, and underlined that such audits contribute to the university’s continuous development policy. Prof. Dr. Şensoy also conveyed his thanks to the Workers, Administrative and Academic staff, who have been working hard for the safe start of face-to-face education for a long time.

“EMU is a Safe Campus”

Speaking at the meeting, Inspector Ozan Ateş stated that they have been conducting inspections in EMU for two days with a consideration of the COVID-19 related measures announced by the World Health Organization and the COVID-19 Pandemic Guidelines and Action Plan prepared by the EMU Pandemic Board. Noting that they monitored the measures and practices taken during the Approved Safe Training inspection on site, “The conclusion we have reached is that the measures are implemented in accordance with the decisions and the guide in many buildings and environments we have visited. While there are minor problems that can be eliminated in some places, we’ve decided that overall you’re a safe campus for students, staff, and other stakeholders. Therefore, our opinion is that you are entitled to be certified as a COVID-19 Approved Safe Education Institution. Therefore, I wish you the very best.

Having signed many firsts in its history, EMU continues to stand out of the crowd as TRNC’s first Covid-19 Safe Education Institution with this certification.

EMU PANDEMIC BOARD PROVIDES IN-SERVICE TRAINING FOR ADMINISTRATIVE STAFF



EMU continues to host in-service training sessions planned to be held in the 2021-2022 Academic Year. In line with the needs of the Administrative Services Staff and in scope the COVID-19 measures, an in-service training session titled the “COVID 19 Pandemic Prevention & Control Measures”, planned by the EMU Rector’s Office and organized by the Directorate of Human Resources, In-Service Training Unit, took place between 21 September and 8 October 2021. 524 members of staff working in various units of EMU attended the training in 10 groups. VIOLA ARTIST PROF. DR. S. ÇETİN AYDAR IN EMU FACULTY OF EDUCATION

Expert viola artist Prof. Dr. S. Çetin Aydar joined Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Faculty of Education, Fine Arts Education Department as a faculty member. Having joined EMU in March 2021 after retiring from Ankara University in 2019, Prof. Dr. Aydar has been working as the Chair of the Fine Arts Education Department of the Faculty of Education since May 2021.

Who is Prof. S. Cetin Aydar?

Aydar was born in 1963 in Ankara. He passed the Ankara State Conservatory exams in 1977 and was accepted to the viola branch in the said institution. The artist, who graduated from Hacettepe University Ankara State Conservatory in 1986, was appointed as a Member of the Presidential Symphony Orchestra in the same year and continued this duty until he was sent to Germany with a State Scholarship in 1988.

He successfully completed his postgraduate studies at the Trossingen Higher Music School in Germany with Prof. Emile Cantor. He then continued his professional life in Germany, Württembergisches Kammerorchester-Heilbronn, and in Denmark, with the Copenhagen Philharmonic Orchestra. Returning home in 1992, the artist was appointed as a lecturer at Dokuz Eylül University State Conservatory. In September 2000, he organized the "DEU State Conservatory - IKSEV 1st National Viola Competition" together with Ruşen Güneş. He became a professor at the same institution in 2011. In

addition to his solo works, Prof. Aydar performs concerts and recordings in Turkey and abroad with orchestras and chamber music groups such as İzmir Viola Ensemble, Aşkın Ensemble-Istanbul, Orpheus Quartett-Germany, Le Solist de Geneve-Switzerland, Württembergisches Kammerorchester-Germany, Aarhus Symfoniorkester-Denmark. He served as the conductor of the "Ensemble Carpe Diem", of which he was one of the founders. In 2011, he was invited to work to restructure Ankara University State Conservatory and was appointed as the director of this institution. He established the Music and Performing Arts Departments and the "Music Interpretation" Master's program within the Institute of Social Sciences. He continued his duty as Director until 2015.

He gave concerts in the most important cultural and art centers of the USA, F. Germany, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Algeria and Turkey with the Ankara University Soloists chamber music ensemble, of which he was the founder. The group won the best chamber music ensemble of 2013 at the Donizetti Awards organized by Andante magazine. In addition to his other CDs, he recorded a CD consisting of American composer Mark Zaner's works by Ankara University Soloists and "Navona Records" company, which was released to the international market and available on iTunes and naxosmusiclibrary. Prof. Aydar continues to work with young violists through the courses he organizes in İzmir and Çanakkale.



EMU HEALTH SCIENCES FACULTY ACADEMIC STAFF MEMBER RELEASES A STATEMENT ON BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Health Sciences Faculty, Nutrition and Dietetics Department academic staff member Eliz Arter made a statement on the occasion of "Breast Cancer Awareness Month":

"Each "Pink October" can Save a Life"

"Each year, the month of October is referred as the "Breast Cancer Awareness Month" and is symbolized with a pink ribbon. Although breast cancer is commonly observed in women, it can also be rarely seen in men as well. According to 2020 data reported by the International Agency for Cancer Research of World Health Organization, when female and male genders are compared on a world-wide scale, breast cancer is one jump ahead of lung cancer and has been identified as the most frequently diagnosed cancer among all types of cancers. On the other hand, breast cancer is ranked as the 5th in terms of the mortality rates.

The main risk factors for breast cancer include family history, late menopause, early menstruation, never having been pregnant or being 30 years or older in the first pregnancy, not breastfeeding, and postmenopausal hormone replacement therapy. In addition to these factors, immobility, high stress, extreme smoking and consumption of alcohol as well as an unbalanced diet are classified as modifiable risk factors.

When the relationship between nutrition and breast cancer is analyzed, the research shows that the excessive consumption of saturated fat which can cause obesity

and, excessive alcohol consumption increases the risk of breast cancer. On the other hand, less consumption of processed meat products (for instance, salami, sausage etc.) along with frequent consumption of low-starchy vegetables can create a protective effect. Soy products are referred as a debatable topic and there has not been certain data demonstrating whether this type of food increase or decrease the risks.

Accordingly, although consumption of soy products up to 1-2 servings a day is considered safe for everyone to reduce the risk of breast cancer with nutrition, it is useful to consult a nutritionist for more information on this subject. In addition, care should be taken to consume at least 3 portions of vegetables and 2 portions of fruit per day, and that each portion is of a different color and variety. Incorporating more vegetable protein sources such as legumes in the diet and consuming as little processed meat products as possible will also reduce the risk of breast cancer. Avoiding excessive alcohol consumption and using vegetable oils such as olive oil instead of saturated fats such as butter and margarine without burning them will also reduce this risk. In short, adopting the Mediterranean Diet, which has positive effects on health in many studies, will reduce the risk of breast cancer, as in all cancers. A healthy body weight, stress control, quality social life and regular exercise program are other factors that play an important role in protecting against breast cancer. In addition to all these, monthly personal breast examination and annual check-up will help in preventing breast cancer or detecting the



tumor in the early stages, especially in individuals with a family history. As stated at the beginning, despite the increase in the number of new diagnoses, the decline in breast cancer deaths has been possible with the development of early diagnosis/treatment methods and increased awareness in the society. At this point, it is useful to remind once again the proverb 'Early Diagnosis Saves Lives', especially when it comes to cancer. Taking a day off, or even a few hours of the year, a routine examination can change your life completely and shed light on someone else's path."

Then during the second stage of the program which is called as Erecting Engineer Meetings, the participants of the program will be provided training on tips regarding how to improve themselves in the entrepreneurship field. Over 300 erecting engineers who are experienced and familiar with the talents, capacity and goals of the entrepreneurs will voluntarily participate during the second stage. Investor Meetings, which is the third stage, will bring the entrepreneurs together with investors, enabling the entrepreneurs to be the focus of the funds. During the final stage of the program, entrepreneur who are successful will earn the right to participate in the İTÜ Core Big Bang competition where the participants can win prize money up to 52 million TL.
