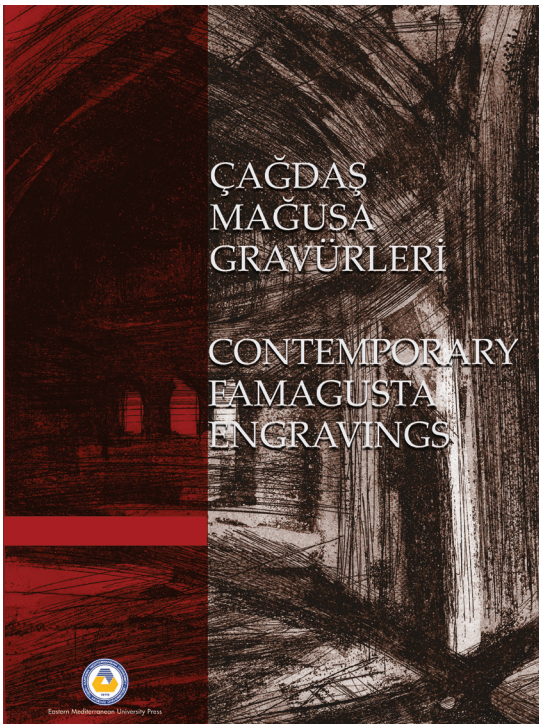

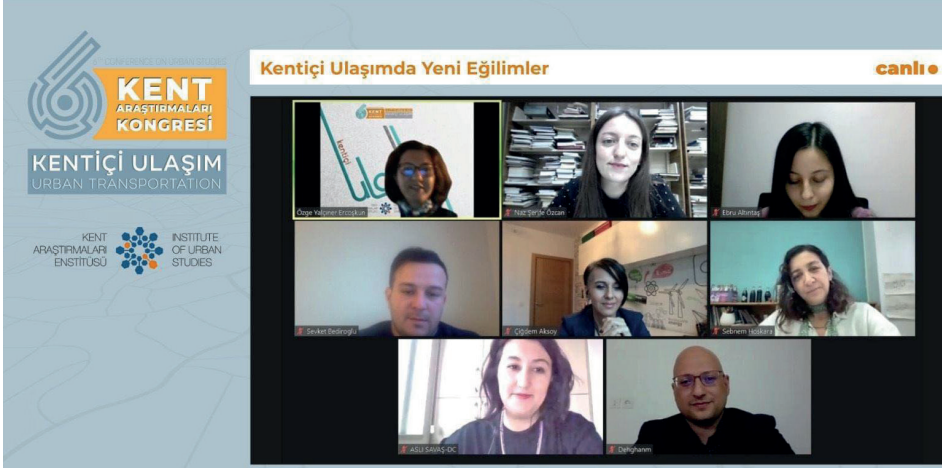
CONTEMPORARY ENGRAVINGS OF FAMAGUSTA EXHIBITION 'CONFRONTATION' TO BE INAUGURATED BY PRESIDENT ERSIN TATAR ON MONDAY, 27 DECEMBER



Contemporary Engravings of Famagusta Exhibition titled 'Confrontation', which has been added to the Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Art Collection and featuring a total of 100 engravings by 30 artists will be inaugurated by the President of the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC), Ersin Tatar on Monday, 27 December 2021 at 6:00 p.m. at the EMU Activity Center Foyer Area. Ayhatun Ateşin is the curator of the exhibition, which will take place under the organisation of the EMU Activity Center and the Fine Arts Club. The exhibition, which emerged as the outcome of activities that have been going on since the 2000s under the names of "EMU Art Gatherings", "EMU Engraving Painting Workshops" and "EMU Art Triangle", will also feature the promotion of the

"Book of Contemporary Engravings of Famagusta", an EMU publication. The curator of the exhibition and editor of the aforesaid book Ayhatun Ateşin, said, "Art contains accumulations within itself. The time and effort devoted to the preparation of the works of art occur with great devotion. Great accumulations happen throughout life. The works created by an artist are like his children, and it is about the emotion put to the work and what the artist blends in. The details are always in the artist's memory,". Within the scope of the exhibition, the engravings produced by the students of art together with the master artists were made using the engraving technique on metal, stone and wood and transferred to paper. All art lovers are invited to the exhibition where the artists and the audience will meet the city.

Prof. Dr. Abolfazl Dehghanmongabadi with a joint paper titled “Planning Complete Streets Towards Enhancing the Level of Sustainability in the Urban Transportation Sector”. At the end of the congress, the Urban Transportation Manifesto was prepared and published by the participants.

EMU URDC COMPLETES ALSANCAK – MENEKŞE DISTRICT URBAN DESIGN GUIDE WORK



In scope of a protocol signed by the Eastern Mediterranean University and Alsancak Municipality on 27 February 2018 regarding the establishment of Alsancak- Menekşe Region Urban Design Guide, the said guide has been developed as a revolving fund project under the coordination of EMU Urban Research and Development Center (URDC) Chair Prof. Dr. Şebnem Hoşkara and Vice Chair Assoc. Prof. Dr. Nevter Zafer Cömert. Alsancak Municipality and City Planning Department also supported the development of the said project. The urban design guide in question prepared for the Menekşe

Region within the boundaries of Alsancak Municipality aims to create a sustainable, safe and environmentally friendly living environment that preserves its urban identity and its unique local characteristics.

The Guide is the First in Northern Cyprus

EMU URDC Chair Prof. Dr. Şebnem Hoşkara stated that the Alsancak Menekşe Region Urban Design Guide will contribute to the preservation of the urban texture with all the built environment values in the region at the urban scale, together with the historical, architectural, environmental and

socio-cultural values. Prof. Dr. Hoşkara added that they will ensure the development of urban design principles that will serve the development within the framework of the vision to be determined and the correct design of the structural environment in the process of ensuring this development.

Stating that the guide is the first of its kind prepared in the North of Cyprus in this sense, Prof. Dr. Hoşkara added that it will set an example for other settlements with unique characteristics in the coming periods. Prof. Dr. Hoşkara emphasized that the principles in the said guide are expected to be converted into a legal document by taking into the scope of the execution of the current order, and then to be a part of the zoning plan work to be carried out.

At the same time, the Alsancak Menekşe Region Urban Design Guide and the Youth Street Sample Rehabilitation Project, which summarizes and exemplifies the comprehensive issues in the guide, were delivered to the Alsancak Municipality and the first informative meeting for the public was held. It is expected that the said guide and the project will be shared with stakeholders in meetings with broad participation in the coming days.

21-25 DECEMBER NATIONAL STRUGGLE AND MARTYRS' WEEK ACTIVITIES FROM EMU - ATAUM

Eastern Mediterranean University Atatürk Research and Application Center (EMU-ATAUM) held a panel at EMU Mustafa Afşin Ersoy Hall at 14:30 on Tuesday, 21 December 2021, as the first event marking the 21-25 December National Struggle and Martyrs' Week. Emphasizing that the 21-25 December National Struggle and Martyrs' Week is a very important week for the Turkish Cypriots, EMU-ATAUM Chair Assist. Prof. Dr. Turgay Bülent Göktürk expressed his gratitude to the valuable mühahideen who witnessed this struggle and thanked them for their participation in the panel. Assist. Prof. Dr. Göktürk then read the statement he prepared for the National Struggle and Martyrs' Week.

Emotional Moments Encountered

After the opening speech, the living witnesses of the Turkish Cypriot's National Struggle, Retired Mühahideen Commander Ahmet Sevinç shared his experiences in the defense of Famagusta during the 1974 Peace Operation while Muratağa, Atlılar and Sandallar Martyrs Association President Ahmet Aşır conveyed his memories of the massacres in Muratağa, Atlılar, and Sandallar villages, and Retired Mühahid Yaşar Gevrek shared his memories in the Taşkent region with the participants.

After the speeches during which emotional moments were encountered, EMU-ATAUM President Assist. Prof. Dr. Turgay Bülent Göktürk presented a Cypriot Lefkara



frame to Retired Commander Ahmet Sevinç, Muratağa, Atlılar and Sandallar Martyrs Association President Ahmet Aşır and Retired Mühahid Yaşar Gevrek.

EMU-ATAUM President Assist. Prof. Dr. Turgay Bülent Göktürk presented a portrait of Atatürk to the President of the Association Gürsel Benan and Assoc. Prof. Dr. Canan Zeki presented Benan a Lefkara board panel. Association President Gürsel Benan also presented EMU-ATAUM President Göktürk a plaque of the association.

EMU-ATAUM'S STATEMENT ON 21-25 DECEMBER NATIONAL STRUGGLE AND MARTYRS WEEK

Chair of the Eastern Mediterranean University Atatürk Research and Application Center (EMU-ATAUM) Assist. Prof. Dr. Turgay Bülent Göktürk issued a statement due to the 21-25 December National Struggle and Martyrs Week. Asst. Prof. Dr. Turgay Bülent Göktürk's statement is as follows:

"The date of December 21-25 has a special place in the Struggle for Existence of the Turkish Cypriot nation. The Greek Cypriots, on the pretext of changing the Constitution, put the Akritas Plan into action, which they prepared in order to unite Cyprus with Greece at gunpoint, in other words to realize the ENOSIS, on 21 December, 1963. Thus, brutal attacks mentioned in history as "Bloody Christmas" started. However, the attackers who faced the resistance of the Turkish Cypriots could not succeed in their plans to 'destroy the Turkish Cypriots within 24 hours'.

Certainly, our aim is not to create hostility. The geography we live in requires living as neighbors with the Greek

Cypriots. However, this situation cannot be a reason to forget what has been done to us in the past. Likewise, this necessity cannot be a reason for us not to see the ambitions of the Greek Cypriot administration on our land even today. We have to be aware of what has been done in the past so that we can better understand the value of freedom and claim it stronger today. For this, we must explain what happened in the past to our youth at every opportunity. Let's not forget: 'The boundaries of those who do not know their history are drawn by others'. Honourable martyrs: You have been the strongest pillar of the Turkish Cypriot Community's Struggle for Existence. You have reached the level of martyrdom, without blinking your eyes, for the sake of making these lands your homeland, for the sake of duty, flag and independence. In these lands that you watered with your blood and under the shadow of our glorious flag that you raised with your souls, we live today with our heads high, in safety and peace. Sleep in comfort, as we will not forget you. We bow before your holy memory with gratitude and respect. May your souls be blessed."



THE ARAB SPRING BEING DISCUSSED IN EMU AFTER 10 YEARS



“The Arab Spring - 10 Years On: Popular Protests and Political Change in the MENA region” conference organized in cooperation with the Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Cyprus Policy Center (EMU-CPC) and EMU Political Science and International Relations Department was held in EMU. Moderated by EMU Political Science and International Relations Department Head and the chair of EMU-CPC Prof. Dr. Ahmet

Sözen, the event hosted Near East University Political Science Department Head Prof. Dr. Nur Köprülü as a guest speaker.

Starting her speech by stating that one of the main questions re-emerging in the post-2011 Arab Uprisings period is to what extent these popular protests and popular calls for political opening will lead to democratization in the Middle East and North Africa region, Prof. Dr.

Köprülü added that contrary to the prevailing thought that explains the permanence of authoritarian regimes as a derivative of cultural originality and patriarchy, the Arab Uprisings crossed the threshold of fear and led to a new political activism in the region. Examining the results and effects of the Arab Uprisings, what these protests tell us, why Arab Democracies did not exist, the idea that the regimes did not follow similar paths in the Middle East and North Africa region during the protests and in the following period, Prof. Dr. Köprülü said it was impossible to talk about “Arab Way” as a result. Stating that it is too early to evaluate these movements as an indicator of a “revolutionary transformation” in the region, Prof. Dr. Köprülü, however, pointed out that the fact that there has been a change in the reformulation of “state-society relations” and the definition of “citizenship” cannot be ignored.

GENITAL HYGIENE TRAINING FOR SECONDARY SCHOOL FEMALE STUDENTS FROM THE STUDENTS OF NURSING DEPARTMENT



Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Faculty of Health Sciences, Nursing Department 3rd year students provided training on genital hygiene to 7th and 8th grade female students at Canbulat Özgürlük Secondary School and Doğa College. Provided under the coordination of EMU Nursing Department academic staff member Dr. Arzu Abiç, the training garnered great interest from the students. In a statement made

by EMU Nursing Department on the subject, it was stated that it is extremely important that services that protect and improve reproductive health reach all segments of the society.

Health Protective Behavior Taught

Pointing out that some age groups have priority in the provision of services, the statement said, “Adolescents and young

people from these priority groups are more at risk of having genital infections due to lack of knowledge about genital hygiene as well as insufficient and incorrect hygiene behavior. Although genital infections are among the preventable diseases, they are an important health problem in women due to their incidence and complications. It is reported that approximately one million women in the world every year have urinary tract infections that are not sexually transmitted, and at least 75% of women have a history of genital infection. For this reason, health protective and improving behavior gained in adolescence form the basis of a healthy adult life. Therefore, the education of adolescent girls on genital hygiene is important in improving women’s health in our country. EMU Health Sciences Faculty, Nursing Department students requested that the training be repeated due to the intense interest.

Delivering the opening speeches of the panel, EMU Vice Rector for Student Affairs Prof. Dr. Hüseyin Aktuğlu and EMU Faculty of Law Dean Prof. Dr. Turgut Turhan both stated that Esin Konanç made great contributions to EMU and emphasized the importance of the issue of "Children's Rights", on which Esin Konanç also attached great interest.

Chair of the Cyprus International University, Faculty of Arts and Sciences, Psychology Department, Prof. Dr. Biran Mertan contributed to the panel with her presentation titled "Children's Rights in 2021". Other presentations delivered were Social Services Specialist and Denkey Başel Social Development Foundation President Barış Başel's presentation "Being a Child in Blood Culture", The Association of Universal Children's Rights President Atty. Laden Asilzade's presentation "Child Driven to Crime", and Member of the Human Rights Committee of the Cyprus Turkish Bar Association, Atty. Melis Türköl's presentation on "Children's Rights in the Pandemic Process". The panel came to an end after a discussion session held after the presentations.

The last speaker of the panel, SOS Children's Village Association National Program Development Consultant Psychologist Fatma Amcaoğlu gave information about current problems with practical examples on children's rights
