COLLECTIVE LABOUR AGREEMENT SIGNED IN EMU

PROF. DR. UĞUR ULAŞ DAĞLI CHOSEN AS A LIFELONG JURY MEMBER FOR THE BIGGEST INTERNATIONAL STUDENT COMPETITION IN THE WORLD

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Faculty of Architecture Dean Prof. Dr. Uğur Ulaş Dağlı has been chosen as a lifelong jury member for the jury of INSPIRELI Awards which is the biggest international student competition in the fields of Architecture, Urban Design and Landscaping. The competition has been organized for only 5 times until today with the participation of 4300 projects from 142 different countries. Being selected among 531 jurors from 101 different countries, Prof. Dr. Dağlı made EMU proud with her achievement.

INSPIRELLI Awards is the biggest international competition organized annually which aims to support the participant through the competition bearing in mind the differences of Architecture Faculty students in economical, ethnical and social respects. The main theme of the INSPIRELLI Awards is talent. Therefore, each student or group of students can participate in the competition with their semester projects that they work on during their studies in their universities. The competition holds an institutional importance due to Vaclav Haley, first president of the republic and artist, being one of the founding members of the competition. Karel Smejkal, who has many studies in the field of architecture and psychology, and world famous designer Borek Sipek are among the other founding members. There are 3 universities in its management; Czech Technical University in Prague, Budapest University of Technology and Economics and Slovak University of Technology in Bratislava. Moreover, the competition is partners with Archdaily and Amazing. Architecture main stream Graphicsoft media: Archicad and Lumion software. INSPIRELLI Awards organized various competitions with many other partners.

Apart from the organization of INSPIRELLI Awards, the institution

YÖDAK VISITS FACULTY OF EDUCATION



Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Faculty of Education came together with Deputy Chair of the Higher Education Planning, Inspection, Accreditation and Coordination Board (YÖDAK) Prof. Dr. Mehmet Hasgüler and YÖDAK Member Prof. Dr. Hülya Harutoğlu at a meeting titled "Higher Education in the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC) in the First Year of the Pandemic". The meeting which took place in EMU Education Faculty Dean Prof. Dr. Ahmet Pehlivan's office was also attended online by EMU Faculty of Education Vice Deans, Department Chairs and faculty members.

In his speech,YÖDAK Deputy Chair Prof. Dr. Mehmet Hasgüler stated that the pandemic has affected the TRNC higher education as in the world, and that all universities in the TRNC have switched to distance education. Prof. Dr. Hasgüler stated that since the beginning of the pandemic, our universities have rapidly adapted to distance education. Prof. Dr. Hasgüler said that YÖDAK both supported and observed the distance education practices of universities in this process. Prof. Dr. Hasgüler emphasized that universities have formed a committee to support these processes in line with the understanding of quality, and that information support from institutions such as EMU would be beneficial. Prof. Dr. Hasgüler stated that EMU is the top university that can undertake the pioneering role at its current point.

The future of distance education in higher education was also discussed at the meeting. Prof. Dr. Hasgüler emphasized that a hybrid education model, not only supporting distance education alone but also face-to-face education, is more appropriate and that legal regulations are needed for this. Prof. Dr. Hasgüler stated that it is a mission for EMU Education Faculty to lead the island in hybrid education. Stating that they will hold a workshop with the rectors about the effects of the pandemic in education, Prof. Dr. Hasgüler pointed out that not only the pandemic period should be evaluated, but also the acquis of universities in the context of global trends in higher education should be reviewed in a dynamic and scientific way.

EMU Education Faculty Dean Prof. Dr. Ahmet Pehlivan expressed his satisfaction with YÖDAK's visit to the faculty and stated that they are ready to make all kinds of contributions as the Faculty of Education for the TRNC Higher Education field.

EMU ATAUM CHAIR ASSIST. PROD. DR. TURGAY BÜLENT GÖKTÜRK RELEASES A STATEMENT ON **18 MARCH ÇANAKKALE VICTORY AND COMMEMORATION OF MARTYRS**

Eastern Mediterranean University Atatürk Research and Application Center (EMU-ATAUM) Chair Assist. Prof. Dr. Turgay Bülent Göktürk released a statement on the 106th anniversary of 18 March Çanakkale Victory and Commemoration Day of Martyrs. The statement touched on the following:

"Republic of Turkey was established as a result of the national struggle that took place in leadership of Mustafa Kemal. The Battles of Çanakkale also played a role in this outcome because the determination and spirit of the struggle in the Çanakkale Front has been one of the basic dynamics of the national struggle and has been a first step for the epic of liberation. As stated by Mustafa Kemal, "If Çanakkale was seized, the control of Istanbul would be lost, the Ottoman Empired would be shared and the Republic of Turkey would not be established." In this respect, Çanakkale Victory holds a unique place and importance in the Turkish history. The Battle of Çanakkale is about extraordinary circumstances and struggles. It is not a battle to be won under the normal circumstances. It is not possible to comprehend this without knowing the determination and spirit of the Turkish people to protect their homeland. It must be known that, the unique feature of Çanakkale that makes it important is the noble spirit that welcomes those who come to Çanakkale, not the people who come to Çanakkale. Filled with faith, belief and determination, this spirit was not defeated neither by the steel nor gunpowder. It is the spirit that carries out the command "I command you not to attack, but to die" without hesitation, with calm and trust. That spirit is the soul of the people who say I'd rather die than live as a prisoner.

In Çanakkale, Turkish people and the Turkish soldiers defeated the two most superior navies of the period and the land armies that were superior in numbers and weapons. The most precious gain of the Turkish nation after the victory of Çanakkale Battle is Mustafa Kemal Atatürk. Mustafa Kemal had an opportunity to perform his unique skills on military thinking and leadership during the Battles of Çanakkale and, at the end of the battles, he was a reputable commander in the eye of Turkish nation. Therefore, Battles of Çanakkale contributed the creation of genius like Mustafa Kemal Atatürk who was to be the unique leader of the National Struggle which would begin following the end of the World War I.

Hey Soldier! Who has fallen on the ground for this land! It would be worth their while For our ancestors to descend from heaven And kiss your unsullied forehead!

And kiss your unsullied forehead! How great you are; our religion is saved by your blood;

Only the lions of the Battle of Bedr were as glorious.

On the occasion of the 106th year of the Çanakkale Victory, I commemorate with gratitude the Great Leader Mustafa Kemal Atatürk and his comrades in arms, who did not hesitate to give their souls and blood to make this land a homeland, by winning the Battles of Çanakkale and our hero soldiers who fell to the ground in the prime of their lives for their homeland, flag and nation. May they rest in eternal peace."

"106th YEAR OF ÇANAKKALE" CONFERENCE

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Atatürk Research and Application Center (ATAUM) organized a conference with "106th Year of Çanakkale" theme on the occasion of the 106th anniversary of 18 March Çanakkale Victory. Moderated by EMU-ATAUM Chair Assist. Prof. Dr. Turgay Bülent Göktürk, the conference hosted the Republic of Turkey Atatürk Supreme Council for Culture, Language and History, Atatürk Research Center Chair Prof. Dr. Adnan Sofuoğlu as a keynote speaker. The event took place on online platforms on Thursday, 18 March 2021 at 13:30.

The conference commenced with the speech of Assist. Prof. Dr. Göktürk which marked

the meaning and importance of 18 March. During his speech, Assist. Prof. Dr. Göktürk stated that the most precious gain of the Turkish nation after the victory of Çanakkale Battle was Mustafa Kemal Atatürk. Mustafa Kemal had an opportunity to perform his unique skills on military thinking and leadership during the Battles of Çanakkale and, at the end of the battles, he was a reputable commander in the eye of Turkish nation. Therefore, Battles of Çanakkale contributed the creation of genius like Mustafa Kemal Atatürk who was to be the unique leader of the National Struggle which would begin following the end of the World War I.

The Republic of Turkey Atatürk Supreme Council for Culture, Language and History, Atatürk Research Center Chair Prof. Dr. Adnan Sofuoğlu started his speech by expressing his contentment for the opportunity for addressing EMU students even though it was through online platforms. Prof. Dr. Sofuoğlu emphasized the strategic and political status of the time period prior the Çanakkale Battle and, touched on the details of the struggles experienced at the Çanakkale Front. Stating the factors which led the start of World War I and also specifying the conditions under which the Ottoman Empire entered this war, Prof. Dr. Sofuoğlu explained that the Entente States attacked the Çanakkale first from the sea with the intention of taking over Istanbul and excluding the Ottoman from the war, and when they were not successful with the plan, they attacked from land. By mentioning the heroic epic of Turkish soldiers against these technologically very

superior forces and the role of Mustafa Kemal in the Çanakkale Victory within the framework of the fronts, Prof. Dr. Sofuoğlu concluded the conference by talking about the political and military consequences of the victory. The conference was held especially with the intense participation of students.





EMU DR. FAZIL KÜÇÜK MEDICINE FACULTY CELEBRATES 14 MARCH MEDICINE DAY

Within the scope of the 14 March Medicine Day, Eastern Mediterranean University Dr. Fazıl Küçük Faculty of Medicine held an online seminar on Monday, 15 March 2021, at 1:00 p.m.. In the seminar moderated by EMU Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty Dean Prof. Dr. Nahide Gökçora, EMU Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty academic staff member Prof. Dr. Ömür Çınar Elçi made a presentation on "Global Medical Education During the COVID-19 Pandemic".

before Speaking the presentation, Prof. Dr. Nahide Gökçora thanked all doctors, nurses, medical students and other healthcare professionals for their hard work, thoughts and commitment to their profession during the pandemic period. Mentioning that they have come together to honor March 14 Doctors Day and Medicine Week together, Prof. Dr. Gökçora also reported that medical education at EMU Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty faced some difficulties due to the pandemic, like other faculties of medicine throughout the world,.

Prof. Dr. Gökçora made the following statements in her speech: "Medicine requires lifelong learning. Our mission is to train highly qualified, exemplary doctors with a strong commitment to excellence in medical practice and the advancement of medical science. We expect our graduates to lead public health solutions by demonstrating the highest ethical and analytical standards and embracing the most advanced technology in their daily practice. "

Before starting his presentation, Prof. Dr. Elçi expressed his pleasure to be holding the said event and welcomed everyone in participation. In his presentation, Prof. Dr. Elçi talked about how the Covid-19 pandemic has interrupted medical education around the world, the difficulties encountered, solutions and how it can be turned into an opportunity.

Stating that Flexner is regarded as the father of modern medical education, Prof. Dr. Elçi gave information about medical education in the 19th century. In his presentation, Prof. Dr. Elçi made the following statements: "Every event that comes into our lives adds new information to our basic medical knowledge as in the Covid-19 pandemic. For example, today we have learned that Covid-19 affects alveoli. When there is an attack on the human immune system, healthy alveoli die, and as a result, the ratio of

oxygen and carbon dioxide changes, fluid enters the alveoli and breathing becomes impossible."

Prof. Dr. Elci emphasized that in the globalizing world of the 21st century, there are no borders between countries and that diseases can spread rapidly, and that the world has experienced this since the last year. Mentioning that the pandemic has affected medical education worldwide, Prof. Dr. Elci added that online courses are at the forefront in this context. Emphasizing that the world is not ready for the pandemic, Prof. Dr. Elçi stated that the number of cases is a proof of this. Stating that the pandemic revealed that more attention should be paid to public health in medical education, Prof. Dr. Elçi emphasized that the new model medical education should focus on the protection, development and improvement of human health.

At the end of his presentation, Prof. Dr. Elçi pointed out that it is of great importance to have sufficient information about the disease, to wash hands, to comply with personal hygiene, social distance and mask rules and to keep the living environment clean in order to be protected from the Covid-19 pandemic.





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BRAIN AWARENESS WEEK EVENT

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty is organizing an event on the occasion of Brain Awareness Week. The statement released by EMU Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty on the matter includes the following:

"Brain Awareness Week is a global campaign initiated with the intention of increasing the public interest, awareness and support for the science of brain, encephalology. The partners of this campaign from different countries host creative events each year in March within their societies aiming to explain the interesting characteristics of brain in order to raise awareness on brain and science of brain, and the effects of it on our daily lives.

Brain Awareness Week was founded by Dana Alliance for Brain Initiatives (DABI) and European Dana Alliance for the Brain (EDAB), and is coordinated by the Dana Foundation. Brain Awareness Week began in 1996 as a modest effort involving just 160 organizations in the United States. DABI organized the first Brain Awareness Week to bring together diverse groups with different interests from academia, government, and professional and advocacy organizations.

The goal was to unite the participants with the common theme that brain research is the hope for treatments, preventions, and possible cures for brain diseases and disorders and to ensure a better quality of life at all ages.

In the 25 years since its founding, Brain Awareness Week has evolved into a global education initiative that has included the participation of more than 7,300 partners in 117 countries. This year's events are being organized between 15-21 March. Being included into the partnership this year, EMU Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty organized the first-ever brain awareness event in Northern Cyprus. The information on the events details has been shared on the group's website along with the other events organized in different countries. During this year's event with "What does the Brain



Do?" theme, children drew pictures regarding the topic and asked questions about the brain. The event is shared with all the nursery and primary school students within the collaboration of **TRNC** Ministry of National Education and Culture. Total of 240 children, ages from 5 to 11, participated in the event with their drawings and created artworks that gets one's admiration.
