Cyprus Turkish Community Followed Atatürk's Line

After Assist. Prof. Dr. Göktürk's speech, the ceremony



continued with a moment of silence at 09:05 and the singing of the National Anthem. At 09:10 a.m., EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Aykut Hoca'nın gave a speech. In his speech, he stated that on the 84th anniversary of Mustafa Kemal Atatürk's passing into eternity, we came together to commemorate our Grteat Leader with respect and

EMU AND TRNC MINISTRY OF HEALTH SIGN A COLLABORATION PROTOCOL



Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) and Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC) Ministry of Health signed a collaboration protocol on Wednesday, 8 November 2022. In addition to the scientific and educational collaborations between EMU and the TRNC Ministry of Health, the aforementioned collaboration protocol includes consultancy services on childhood vaccines, early diagnosis in cancer (cancer screening consultancy) and forgetfulness screenings for individuals over 65 years of age in cooperation.

The protocol was signed by TRNC Minister of Health İzlem Gürçağ and EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Aykut Hocaan. TRNC Ministry of Health Undersecretary Dr. Düriye Deren Oygur, EMU Board of Trustees (VYK) President

Dr. Erdal Özçenk and EMU Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty Dean Prof. Dr. Nahide Gökçora were present during the protocol signing session.

Delivering a speech during the event, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hocaan thanked everyone who participated during the preparation process of the protocol and stated that articles regarding serving the public were added to the protocol. Stating that EMU, as a state university, has always cooperated with state institutions and will continue to do so, Prof. Dr. Hocaan emphasized that it will continue to work on research and community service as well as providing quality education. Moreover, Prof. Dr. Hocaan expressed his belief that the cooperation protocol will benefit the whole society and wished it to

be beneficial for everyone. Reminding that the first ever version of the said protocol was signed back in 2013, EMU VYK President Dr. Özçenk stated that the main purpose of the protocol is to provide logistical support to EMU as well as to carry out studies in the direction of preventive medicine and public health. Underlining that cooperation protocols between EMU and the TRNC Ministry of Health continue to be developed every year, Dr. Özçenk wished the protocol to be beneficial to everyone.

TRNC Minister of Health Gürçağ also delivered a speech during the event and underlined that they will always continue their cooperation with EMU by further reinforcing the services for the public in every subject.

26th CHIEF OF THE GENERAL STAFF OF TURKEY (R) GENERAL İLKER BAŞBUĞ GIVES A CONFERENCE IN EMU



In scope of the activities organised by the EMU Atatürk Research and Application Center (EMU-ATAUM) and the Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Atatürk Ideology Club on the occasion of the 84th anniversary of the passing of the Great Leader Mustafa Kemal Atatürk, a Commemoration Conference for Atatürk was held. The conference, in which the 26th Chief of General Staff of the Republic of Turkey (R) Gen. İlker Başbuğ was the speaker, took place on Friday, 11 November, 2022 at 14:30 at the Rauf Raif Denktaş Culture and Congress Center. Present at the conference were Famagusta Consul General İlyas Çetin, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Aykut Hoca'nın, Rector of Fırat International University Prof. Dr. Hüseyin Yaratın, TRNC Ministry of Tourism, Tourism Planning Department Director Osman Şeker, Famagusta Police Director Hüseyin K. Çete, Vice Rectors, EMU-ATAUM President Assist. Prof. Dr. Turgay Bülent Göktürk, mujahideen and EMU students. At the conference, which attracted great turnout, the participants filled the entire hall. General Başbuğ entered the conference hall with the 10th Anniversary Anthem. During Başbuğ's entrance into the hall, the participants accompanied the 10th Anniversary Anthem with applause.

"Atatürk's Statesperson Side Should Be Better Understood"

The conference commenced with a moment of silence and the National Anthem, the opening address of EMU ATAUM President Assist. Prof. Dr. Turgay Bülent Göktürk, who also read the biography of General Başbuğ. In his speech, Assist. Prof. Dr. Göktürk stated that EMU organized various events to mark the 84th anniversary of the demise of the Great Leader Mustafa Kemal Atatürk, and that these events are aimed at providing a better understanding of Atatürk. Stating that Atatürk's military aspect, as well as his statesperson aspect should be better comprehended, understood and applied by the students, who will be the managers of the future, Assist. Prof. Dr. Göktürk stated that General Başbuğ, who is an expert on Mustafa Kemal Atatürk as a statesperson, will talk about this at the conference. Assist. Prof. Dr. Göktürk also conveyed his gratitude and appreciation to Başbuğ, who took time to give a conference to EMU students despite his busy schedule.

General Başbuğ Asked Students Questions

Then, the 26th Chief of General Staff of the Republic of Turkey (R) Gen. İlker Başbuğ gave a conference titled "Mustafa Kemal Atatürk as a Statesperson". Expressing his pleasure to be with EMU students on this meaningful day, General Başbuğ reminded that this is not his first visit to EMU, that he has visited EMU three times before

and gave conferences. Stating that Atatürk said to the youth, "Dear rising young generation. We founded the republic. You are the ones who will protect and take it to better places," General Başbuğ added that Atatürk gave the Turkish youth a great responsibility by this. Putting forth that he also shares his thoughts, knowledge and experiences with the youth in order to be worthy of this task given by Atatürk, General Başbuğ continued the conference in an interactive way by constantly asking questions to the students.

"The Only Solution to Problems is Atatürk's Thoughts"

Stating that Atatürk was a legendary commander who had his name written in golden letters in history with the victories of one of his identity, General Başbuğ underlined that another identity of Atatürk is a statesperson, and his third and most important identity is "the mortal Mustafa Kemal consisting of flesh and bones", who is human. . Emphasizing that if a solution is sought for the problems that the Republic of Turkey has faced so far, Atatürk's thoughts are the only solution. Gen. Başbuğ said, "If we had acted in the light of the lessons we learned from him, there would be no problem that the Republic of Turkey could not solve today." Noting that it is not a coincidence that Henry Kissinger, one of the world's greatest political scientists who lived in the 21st century, named Mustafa Kemal Atatürk among the four greatest statesperson of the 20th century, General Başbuğ explained the

qualities a person should have in order to be qualified as a statesperson. Stating that there is forward-thinking positive revolutionism among these features, General Başbuğ pointed out that another important issue is that the statesperson pursues long-term goals while doing this without disturbing the stability and balance within the country.

Important Building Blocks of the Turkish Revolution

Mentioning the important building blocks of the Turkish Revolution carried out by Atatürk as a statesperson, General Başbuğ stated that a revolution covering all areas of the community's life was carried out. Stating that Atatürk's dream of a system based on national sovereignty actually became clear in his mind when he set foot in Samsun on 19 May, 1919, Gen. Başbuğ stated that even his comrades in arms with Atatürk had not thought about or adopted these revolutions before, under the conditions of that period. Stating that Atatürk drew the main frame of the Turkish Revolution in his speech at the opening of Ankara Adliye Mektebi (Faculty of Law) on 5 November 1925, General Başbuğ pointed out the importance of the concept of a Nation-State, such as bringing together individuals with the bond of the Turkish Nation instead of religious and sectarian ties. Başbuğ also shared his observations about the place and intellectual importance of the Turkish Revolution in the world with the participants. At the end of the conference, which attracted great attention, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Aykut Hoca'nın presented a silver plate to the 26th Chief of General Staff of the Republic of Turkey (R) Gen. İlker Başbuğ.

EMU FACULTY OF PHARMACY RELEASES A STATEMENT ON 10 NOVEMBER “WORLD HTLV-1 DAY”



Eastern Mediterranean University, (EMU) Faculty of Pharmacy academic staff member Assoc. Prof. Dr. Emre Hamurtekin and Senior Instructor Pharm. Shideh Roshani released a statement about 10 November World HTLV-1 Day. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Hamurtekin's and Pharm. Roshani's statement reads as followst:

“Recently, with the COVID-19 epidemic, discussions have emerged on virus-related diseases, creating curiosity within the society and in the media. One of these viral diseases is the HTLV-1 virus, not well known but is important in terms of the diseases it causes. 10 November is known as “World HTLV-1 Day” in the world.

“What is HTLV-1?”

First discovered by Bernard J. Poiesz et al. in 1981, Human T-Lymphotropic Virus (HTLV) is a virus that can be described as a relative of the HIV virus that causes AIDS,. Although there is no clear information in the world, it is estimated that 5 to 10 million people are infected with the HTLV-1 virus. In particular, it has been determined that the virus is common in some countries such as Japan, Australia, South America, the part of Africa covering the south of the Sahara desert, Iran and some Eastern European countries such as Romania. There is no data on its presence and prevalence in the TRNC.

“What are the Diseases Caused by HTLV-1?”

HTLV-1 virus basically plays a role in two diseases at different rates: Adult T-cell leukemia/lymphoma (ATLL) and HTLV-1-associated myelopathy/tropical spastic paraparesis (HAM/TSP). ATLL is a highly aggressive cancer of blood cells called lymphocytes, which play a role in the immune system in our body. HAM/TSP, on the other hand, is a condition that manifests itself with loss of strength in the legs, bladder and bowel dysfunction, especially due to loss of myelin in the spinal cord. HTLV-1 has also been shown to play a role in some skin diseases. Therefore, early skin findings play a very important role in early diagnosis if this virus is suspected. In this regard, dermatologists play

an important role in early diagnosis. Most people infected with HTLV-1 do not show symptoms, which contributes to the faster spread of the virus.

How is HTLV-1 Transmitted?

HTLV-1 is a virus that can be transmitted from person to person. Sexual contact, giving blood / blood products and breastfeeding from mother to baby are the main transmission routes.

Can HTLV-1 Be Prevented?

In case of doubt, the diagnosis of HTLV-1 is made as a result of further analysis of blood samples (antibody and antigen search). HTLV-1 is a preventable virus. Methods such as safe sexual intercourse and examination of the donor's blood before blood transfusions prevent transmission. There is currently no vaccine available for this virus.

Can HTLV-1-Related Diseases Be Treated?

Although there is no satisfactory and definitive treatment yet, chemotherapy for ATLL, combination of zidovudine and interferon alfa, and mogamulizumab are the primary treatments. HAM/TSP therapy, on the other hand, targets the treatment of clinical findings rather than the treatment of virus-infected cells, while agents that suppress inflammation (prednisolone and other anti-inflammatory agents) are at the forefront.
