

## EMU SIGNS COLLABORATION AGREEMENT WITH “ICY SU” COMPANY



Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) and Giro Investment Ltd. (Icy Su) signed a collaboration agreement to be implemented between EMU Arts and Sciences Faculty and Icy Su Company on topics such as education, research, information and data sharing. The protocol signing session took place on Friday, 16 December 2022 at 11:00 at EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Aykut Hocanın's office. Delivering a speech during the meeting, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hocanın indicated the importance of EMU in terms of conducting quality education and real research in the scientific field, making long-term investments with the university's own resources and, if possible, transforming these into viable patents and income-generating initiatives. Noting the poor conditions which

EMU and the country is currently in and that EMU is doing its best of ability to realize these, Prof. Dr. Hocanın expressed that EMU's greatest wealth is its solid human resources and institutional structure. The students were welcomed by EMU Arts and Sciences Faculty Dean Prof. Dr. Mehmet Ali Özarslan and Physics Department Chair Prof. Dr. İzzet Sakallı.

### Experiments carried out with Academicians

Students carried out various experiments including mechanic, electrical and mag-

netic, modern physics, optic and wave experiments in the laboratories of the EMU Physics Department to prepare them for the IGCSE exams in the best way possible. EMU Physics Department Chair Prof. Dr. İzzet Sakallı, vice Chair Prof. Dr. Seyedhabibollah Mazharimousavi, Assist. Prof. Dr. Mehmet Okcan, Assist. Prof. Dr. Mustafa Rıza and research assistant attended the training and provided information to the students regarding the experiments. Showing great interest in the experiments, the students completed the training with the questions they asked and their words confirming the development of the EMU Physics Department laboratories' infrastructure. Students stated that they were very satisfied with the session.



## "UKRAINE – HOW TO UNDERSTAND WHAT MAY LIE AHEAD" SEMINAR ORGANIZED AT EMU

Eastern Mediterranean University Cyprus Policy Center (EMU CPC) and Business and Economics Faculty, Political Science and International Relations Department co-organized a seminar titled "Ukraine – How to understand what may lie ahead". The opening speech of the seminar was delivered by EMU Business and Economics Faculty, Political Science and International Relations Department Head and EMU CPC Director Prof. Dr. Ahmet Sözen. Moreover, Graham Day, an officer in the British and Canadian navies, the United Nations, and many other international peacebuilding agencies, attended the event as guest speaker. Graham Day commenced his speech by mentioning about the Cynefin Framework. Emphasizing that the Cynefin Framework is an excellent method for resolving discrepancies, conflicts and similar issues, Graham Day explained that according to the Cynefin Framework, every situation is different and it is necessary to choose a unique approach when making a decision for each different situation. Talking about four different

possibilities, Day suggested that in the "obvious" probability the situation is stable and the cause-effect relationship is clearly stated. Then, pointing out that there may be more than one correct answer in the "complex" probability and that it requires expertise and a good analysis to reach this answer, Day explained that in the "complex" probability there is no right answer and it is necessary to look at the past to reach the cause-effect relationship. Moreover, Graham Day explained that the cause-effect relationship was unclear, giving examples for "chaotic" probability. In the continuation of his speech, Graham Day discussed Afghanistan and showed a conceptual framework for disasters. During the seminar, the students were given worksheets for each possibility in the Cynefin Framework to express their ideas about the current problems in Ukraine especially in order to better understand the war in Ukraine today and the problems it brings. Interactive discussions were held on the examples given and the ideas of the students. At the end of the seminar, where participation and



interaction was intense, within the moderation of Prof. Dr. Ahmet Sözen, Graham Day answered the questions from the students and stated with examples that the United Nations plays an important role in situations such as the Russia-Ukraine war.

## EMU-URDC REPRESENTED AT THE EUROPEAN CITY INITIATIVE MEETING HELD IN BULGARIA

Eastern Mediterranean University, Urban Research and Development Center (EMU-URDC) attended the European City Initiative's call for proposal meeting held in Sofia, Bulgaria. The European Union (EU) Commission organizes introductory/information meetings about the restructured EU grant programs with the intention of supporting ideas that adopt place-oriented and participatory approaches and offer creative, innovative and integrated solutions to climate change, demographic transformation, social inequality, health crisis, digital revolution and rapidly changing technology-related problems that threaten the sustainable development of cities. The European City Initiative, which will accept applications until 19 January 2023, announced the application requirements at the meetings organized in various EU cities under the title of "Application Seminars".

### Continuing to Devise Projects for EU Cities

The third of these meetings was held in Sofia, Bulgaria in the recent days. EMU-URDC Vice Director and Faculty of Architecture academic staff member Assist. Prof. Dr. Pınar Uluçay Righelato represented EMU during the event which was held at Intercontinental Hotel. The opening speech of the event was delivered by Sofia Municipality authorities and INNOAIR project, conducted with first EU funds, was introduced to the participants. The fund that city municipalities with a minimum population of 50 thousand can apply; will support projects that are sustainable, innovative and applicable to different EU cities. The European City Initiative, which will offer a grant program of 120 thousand Euros in total for each project, invites the municipalities to devise projects with industry, non-governmental organizations, research centers, academia and other EU city municipalities.

### Innovative Ideas to be supported

The fund allocated to the sustainable development of cities within the framework of EU Cohesion Policies continues to increase each period. In the period between 2014 and 2020, the EU Commission allocated 115 million Euro fund only to projects that support the transformation of cities. 17 million Euro of this fund was donated to various local authorities to support 980 projects targeting sustainable urban strategies. Adding more, the Innovative City Movement Incentive Fund is created with the goal of supporting creative and innovative ideas in cities during this period. In the period covering 2021-27, the EU Commission announced that they will give more support to projects targeting the city. Within the scope of 5 new strategies determined for this purpose, the EU Cohesion Policies package will support projects aiming for a smarter, greener, integrated, social and more urban Europe. The European City Initiative, created in this context, focuses on innovative ideas and how these ideas can be applied in different contexts and scales, while offering support programs to city authorities with the aim of knowledge management and capacity building in cities of different scales. It will also offer exchange programs in order to share the knowledge and experience gained on this subject.

### Call for the Municipalities

Noting that they are ready to provide counselling during the Europe City Initiative Grant Program application process to TRNC municipalities which are in cooperation with EMU-URDC and meet the application conditions, EMU-URDC Vice Director Assist. Prof. Dr.



Pınar Uluçay Righelato stated that our cities deserve to be more contemporary, livable and people-oriented campuses with aesthetic, sustainable and participatory projects, and that local governments have important duties in this regard. Expressing that EU grant programs can accelerate this movement, Assist. Prof. Dr. Uluçay Righelato called on the municipalities and added that they will meet with the municipalities that meet the application conditions after the local elections.
