

EMU RECTOR'S OFFICE SIGNS A PROTOCOL WITH LOCAL ARTISTS



A protocol has been signed between the Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Rector's Office and local artists who have contributed to the EMU Art Works Collection, Prof. Dr. Seniğ Çavuşoğlu, Emel Samioğlu, İsmet Tatar and Mehmet Ulubatlı. The signing ceremony of the protocol settled within the scope of the project carried out by the EMU Center for Cyprus Studies (EMU-CCS) with the aim of preserving, protecting and transferring the works of local artists to future generations, took place on Wednesday, 23 February, 2022, at 14:30 at EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Aykut Hoca's office. Also present at the ceremony were EMU-CCS President Assoc. Prof. Dr. Nectice Yıldız and Art Coordinator Zehra Şonya.

"A Big Thank You to Our Artists"

Speaking at the ceremony, Prof. Dr. Hoca expressed that the project initiated by the former Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam is still continuing. Prof. Dr. Hoca said, "We aim to ensure the continuation of good and productive works that have started. As a state university, EMU has to be a pioneer in the provision of services to society as well as education and research. One of the most

important parts of this is art and culture. Whilst doing this, we will continue to preserve the works of important artists of the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC), to facilitate the dissemination of information about them, and beyond that, to contribute to the education of our society. In this context, I would like to thank our artists who donated their valuable works to our collection. Our efforts on these continue. Your permission will allow us to exhibit, preserved and use your work in different projects through the share of information. EMU is determined to continue in this direction with expanded activities."

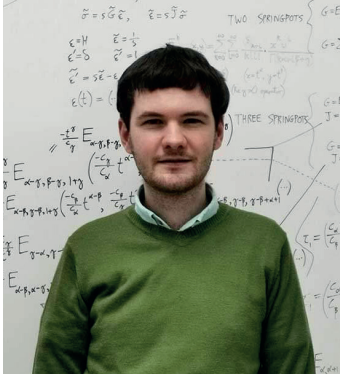
"We are Very Happy"

Artist İsmet Tatar stated that she was very excited when she saw her works here and said, "I hope their value will be recognised." Artist Emel Samioğlu stated that the works she transferred for the project are works of different periods and said, "I am really happy to think that they will be collected and exhibited under the roof of our university." Artist Mehmet Ulubatlı said that he was very happy and thanked EMU very much for the project and said, "We have been painting for a

very long time and been interested in culture and art. We have always thought about how we can create added value for our country. However, art can move a society from one place to another." Conveying her thanks to EMU-CCS and EMU Rector's Office, Prof. Dr. Seniğ Çavuşoğlu said, "This collection will turn into the EMU Art Collection. I am observing that they are being very selective and the formation of a good collection is underway." EMU Art Coordinator Zehra Şonya stated that the number of art works is approaching 700 and their goal is to increase this number to 1,500 and create a museum. EMU-CCS President Assoc. Prof. Dr. Nectice Yıldız said, "This beautiful collection started with the initiatives of Zehra Şonya. We started through an art panel and reached the present day. We have started to work on books about the works of artists, and we want to increase them. I think we can bring art to much better and more beautiful places."

After the speeches, artists signed protocols with Prof. Dr. Aykut Hoca. After the signing ceremony, the artists viewed the artworks displayed in EMU Rector's Office.

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Arts and Sciences Faculty, Mathematics Department academic staff member Assist. Prof. Dr. Arran Fernandez and Mathematics Department research assistants Hafız Muhammed Fahad, Arzu Ahmadova and İsmail Hüseyinov are invited to the research event of Isaac Newton Institute. The event covers a 4-month period from January to April, 2022. During the event which, is participated by global experts in the field such as Kai Diethelm, Francesco Mainardi and Igor Podlubny, studies on “Fractional Differential Equations” is to be carried out (<https://www.newton.ac.uk/event/fde2/>).

Within the scope of the event, Assist. Prof. Dr. Arran Fernandez delivered a seminar titled “On Fractional Wirtinger Derivatives

for Complex Analysis” on 31 January, 2022. Assist. Prof. Dr. Fernandez is to also delivered another seminar on 11 Nisan 2022; “Semigroup Properties for Multi-dimensional Fractional Integral Operators”. On the other hand, “Deterministic and Stochastic Fractional Differential Equations and Jump Processes” workshop will be held between 22 and 25 February, 2022. During the workshop, Mathematics Department research assistants will also deliver presentations; Hafız Muhammed Fahad “Operational calculus for the Riemann–Liouville fractional derivative with respect to a function and its applications”, Arzu Ahmadova “Exponential stability and stabilization of fractional stochastic degenerate evolution equations in a Hilbert space” and İsmail Hüseyinov “Representation of harmonic functions with

respect to subordinate Brownian motion”. Within the scope of the program, workshops will be organized hosting experts in their fields.

The Isaac Newton Institute is an independent international visitor research institute located next to the University of Cambridge Mathematics Faculty in Cambridge. It runs research programmes on selected themes in mathematics and the mathematical sciences with applications over a wide range of science and technology. It attracts leading mathematical scientists from the UK and overseas to interact in research over an extended period of time ranging from a week to a couple of months.

APPLICATIONS FOR EMU GRADUATE PROGRAMS IN NICOSIA CONTINUE

Eastern Mediterranean University's (EMU) Turkish-medium graduate programs that have been offered in Nicosia since the 2012 – 2013 Academic Year Spring Semester continue to admit students in its Business Management, Banking and Finance, Managerial Economics, Financial Economics and Gender Studies Graduate Programs offered either with thesis and/or without thesis.

Apart from the mentioned graduate programs, Department of Banking and Finance offers the "Investment Evaluation and Project Finance Certificate" program in Nicosia within the framework of the collaboration agreement the department has with the Queens University, Canada. The courses delivered by the academic staff who have both academic and sectoral knowledge in the public, private sector or banking fields offer opportunities to those who want to improve themselves in these fields.

On the other hand, EMU Education Faculty, English Language Teaching master's and PhD programs (with thesis and/or without thesis) as well as the EMU Education Faculty Turkish-medium master's programs (with thesis) such as Guidance and Psychological Counselling, Educational Administration and Supervision, Education Programs and other graduate programs (with thesis) are being offered both in Famagusta and in Nicosia.

Classes after Working Hours

The graduate programs offered in Nicosia are held at the Atatürk Teacher Training Academy within the scope of the signed collaboration protocol. These programs, which aim to specialize the human resources in the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus in various fields, create an alternative for those who want to take part in business life and also take postgraduate education. In the post-graduate programs offered, the lectures are given after working hours, which provides a great advantage for both public and private sector employees. EMU graduates who will enroll in EMU Graduate



Programs for the first time receive a 15% discount in tuition fees.

Discount for Public Servants

A 20% discount is to be applied to the tuition fees of public sector employees who will be enrolled to the said graduate programs during the 2021 – 2022 Academic Year Spring Semester. In addition to public sector employees, requests from private institutions were also taken into account, and a 30% discount on the tuition

fees would be offered to employees of institutions who have signed or will sign a cooperation protocol with EMU.
