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EMU DR. FAZIL KÜÇÜK FACULTY OF MEDICINE RELEASES A STATEMENT ON "4 FEBRUARY WORLD CANCER DAY"

Eastern Mediterranean University Dr. Fazıl Küçük Faculty of Medicine and Marmara University Faculty of Medicine International Joint Medicine Program academic staff member Assoc. Prof. Dr. Osman Köstek made statements about the "4 February World Cancer Day". Assoc. Prof. Dr. Köstek's statement reads as follows:

"World Cancer Day"

"Our tissues that shape our bodies are made up of specialized cells. Mass lesions called tumors occur with the uncontrolled and abnormal proliferation of cells with changes in normal cells.

Cancer is as old as human history. It is also mentioned in the oldest written works (Edwin Smith papyrus 3000 BC). It was first mentioned as "karkinos" by Hippocrates between 460-370 BC, and in the following years, this term was referred to as "cancer".

According to current data, cancer ranks second among the causes of death in the world and in our country. Since the risk of cancer generally increases with age, it is estimated that as our life expectancy increases, cancer cases will increase and cancer will take the first place among the causes of death. However, recent developments in cancer prevention, diagnosis and treatment have shown that cancer-related death rates have decreased. Prevention and early diagnosis of cancer, which is an important public health problem, are of particular importance.

More than 40% of all cancers and nearly half of cancer deaths are related to preventable

causes. So what are these preventable causes? Giving up smoking, getting rid of excess weight, stopping alcohol consumption, allocating time to physical activity, vaccination against active infectious agents and avoidance of excessive sunlight exposure are among the most important modifiable causes.

The chemicals inhaled with cigarette and tobacco smoke not only damage the mouth and pharynx and the lungs, but also pass into the bloodstream and cause many types of cancer by being carried to the whole body. The more a person smokes, the younger the age of diagnosis of cancer disease and the longer he smokes, the higher the risk of getting the disease. Currently, tobacco use is responsible for 22% of cancer-related deaths in the world, unfortunately this rate is 34.1% in our country.

Early diagnosis of cancer is possible with effective early screening tests. Effective screening methods including stool occult blood testing, colonoscopy and rectosigmoidoscopy not only detect colorectal cancer early, but also help prevent the said disease

In terms of breast cancer, early diagnosis with mammography, especially in women over 50, significantly reduces cancer-related deaths. Individuals with a family history of cancer such as breast and/or ovarian and/or endometrial cancer at a young age should be evaluated more carefully. In these individuals, it may be necessary to evaluate genetic predisposition and start screening tests at an



earlier age. PAP and HPV tests, both alone and together, help in both the prevention and early diagnosis of cervical cancer.

Low-dose computed tomography has been shown to be beneficial for screening and early diagnosis in people at high risk for lung cancer, especially heavy smokers. It has been determined that mortality rates from lung cancer have decreased by approximately 24% with screening, early diagnosis and effective treatments.

In short, the current cancer incidence and cancer-related death rates are an important public health problem. The most effective fight against cancer is the fight against modifiable risk factors that cause the disease to occur. By paying attention to these, reducing the risk and being included in screening programs contribute to the prevention, early diagnosis and treatment of cancer."





EMU NURSING DEPARTMENT OFFERS FIRST AID TRAINING TO FAMAGUSTA VOCATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL APPLICATION **KINDERGARTEN**



Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) of Health Sciences Nursing Department provided First Aid Training at Famagusta Vocational High School Application Kindergarten. The training, which was carried out with the slogan "First Aid Everywhere for Everyone", was organized upon the demand of the school teachers. The training was carried out in two

stages as theoretical and practice on models at EMU First and Emergency Aid Laboratory.

Participants Took an Active Role

In the training initiated by EMU Health Sciences Faculty Vice Dean and Nursing Department academic staff member Assoc. Prof. Dr. Gülten Sucu Dağ with the sharing of theoretical knowledge, the topics of AdultChild-Infant Basic Life Support and Airway Obstructions were explained under the guidance of the 2020 AHA and ERC 2021 Guidelines. After the theoretical knowledge, the topics covered were put into practice on the models, under the supervision of Nursing Department academic staff members Gülcan Doğru Sakallı and Serpil Çağlıyan Payas. The training, in which the participants took an active role, continued with the question and answer part and the closing speech of Assoc. Prof. Dr. Gülten Sucu Dağ. The training ended with the presentation of certificates of participation to those who participated.

While focusing on basic issues such as Adult-Child-Infant Basic Life Support and Airway Obstructions within the scope of First Aid Training, the life-saving significance of knowing the First Aid application steps for children in schools was once again emphasized.
