A PRESS CONFERENCE HAS BEEN ORGANISED FOR THE "EASTERN MEDITERRANEAN TOURISM CAREER FAIR 2022" TOURISM SECTOR TO MEET IN EMU







"Demand for Qualified Workforce To Be Catered For"

Delivering the opening speech of the press conference, TRNC Deputy Prime Ministry, Ministry of Tourism, Culture, Youth and Environment Undersecretary Serhan Aktunç stated that they are organising a career fair together with EMU to support the tourism sector, which has great importance in terms of closing the current account deficit of the TRNC. Stating that the tourism sector was closing 63% of the country's current account deficit with a net tourism income of 960 million dollars before the pandemic, Aktunç stated that the importance of tourism in the pandemic period was once again revealed. Drawing attention to the fact that nearly 30 thousand personnel in the sector returned back to their countries during the pandemic process, Aktunç stated that they have observed a shortage of qualified workforce in the present period when



the tourism sector is slowly starting to revive and that they are planning to organize this career fair with EMU towards this direction. Expressing that they will also realise such activities with other universities, Aktunç pointed out that if the country successfully facilitates the local sector by owning and internalizing it, the revenues of the TRNC will increase even further. Aktunç emphasized that while such events carry special importance for both stakeholders to find qualified personnel and to keep the income obtained from tourism in the country by employing local personnel, they are hoping to catch the momentum they hoped to obtain in 2019.

"Career Possibilities to Be Presented"

Speaking at the meeting, EMU Vice Rector for Social and Cultural Affairs Prof. Dr. Deniz İşçioğlu stated that the Eastern Mediterranean Tourism Career Fair 22, to be held with the slogan "Tourism is Reviving Once Again!", will open different horizons for young people in the field of tourism. Expressing that nearly 100 national and international hotels, restaurants, cafes, travel agencies, tour operators and managers of airline companies will attend the event, Prof. Dr. İşçioğlu invited all those who plan to shape their careers with tourism to the event. Emphasizing that the visitors will have opportunities such as face-to-face meetings with the leading tourism enterprises of the TRNC as well as internship and career planning opportunities, Prof. Dr. İşçioğlu extended her gratitude and appreciation



to EMU Tourism Faculty Dean Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç and his team, the stakeholders of the fair, namely, the Cyprus Turkish Hoteliers Association, Cyprus Turkish Tourism and Travel Agencies Association, Northern Cyprus Turkish Restaurateurs Association and Cyprus Turkish Travel Guides Association as well as the sponsors of the fair Narin Enterprises, Kaner Group, Oza Coffee, Hediyem Su, Petek Patisseries, Mardo and Ekor. Prof. Dr. İşçioğlu also extended her special thanks to Fikri Ataoğlu, TRNC Deputy Prime Ministry, Minister of Tourism, Culture and Environment, and Undersecretary Aktunç for their contributions. Prof. Dr. İşçioğlu also expressed her hope that the event would yield positive outcomes for tourism in the TRNC.

"Around 100 Companies Will Participate in the Fair"

In his speech, EMU Tourism Faculty Dean Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç pointed out the importance of fulfilling the need in the sector by training qualified personnel. Stating that the withdrawal of 30 thousand personnel from the sector has put the sector in great trouble, Prof. Dr. Kılıç pointed out that their duty is to meet the demand of the sector. Expressing that around 100 companies and 200 representatives will join the fair, Prof. Dr. Kılıç stated that their goal is to provide this opportunity both to students and members of public who are seeking a career in the field of tourism. Prof. Dr. Kılıç conveyed his thanks to all the stakeholders and sponsors of the fair.



COLLABORATION PROTOCOL BETWEEN EMU AND GIKAD

Delivering the opening speech of the ceremony, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Aykut Hocanin stated that EMU's only duty is not only education and research but also to serve the community. Even though it has been only a year since we have launched our association, we set up a communication network with our members consisting of inspiring women who have reached a certain level in professional fields, social responsibility projects, art and science from nearly 150 different professional fields. Our ultimate goal is to have women in the entrepreneurship ecosystem. As a matter of fact, we have succeeded to reach a specific place in the entrepreneurship ecosystem with both national and international connections. We have a long way to go, a lot of women to support. Women should not only be participants but also be leaders in every area of life. Our association aims to help women while they join economy and become entrepreneurs in rural areas. There is a huge number of women who need support from us which gives us strength and power to continue our work. We are planning to use the opportunities provided by EMU in helping women in rural areas".



EMU FACULTY OF ARCHITECTURE HOSTS MASTER ARCHITECT ASLI ÖZBAY IN COLLABORATION WITH THE FAMAGUSTA INITIATIVE

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Faculty of Architecture, in collaboration with the Famagusta Initiative, organised a panel titled "Lessons to be Learned from the Restoration Work in Cappadocia" at the Famagusta Walled City Association (MASDER) at 18:00 on Wednesday, 30 March, 2022. Participated by Master Architect Aslı Özbay, who is famous for her conservation work in Cappadocia, the panel took place under the moderation of Architecture Department academic staff member Assoc. Prof. Dr. Türkan Ulusu

"Correct Information Should Be Placed in Popular Culture"

In her speech, Aslı Özbay emphasized that even today, Cappadocia is described incompletely, not in full and said that even the correct information about the formation of the volcanic tuff stone, which is the means for the formation of the unique geography of the region, started to be mentioned only 5-6 years ago. Pointing out the weakness of the academic research on the region, Özbay said, "We can not like what we do not know, we can not protect what we do not like," and reminded the rapid increase in historical, geological, sociological and architectural studies for the correct recognition of the region, and the importance of developing public projects to place the correct information in popular culture, starting with the Turkish society.

Insensitive and Uncontrolled Tourism

Emphasizing that she has been working mainly on Cappadocia civil architecture since 2002, Özbay said that there are many lessons to be learned from this multi-layered cultural heritage. Stating that the settled life culture in the Cappadocia caves, dating back 3,000

years to the Hittites, was instrumental in the formation of a unique life system underground, Özbay stated that these places were generally destroyed due to the insensitive and uncontrolled construction of tourism. Özbay said that Argos in Cappadocia Hotel, where he worked as an architect between 2010-2020, is a special example that does not surrender to the insatiable demands of tourism, that balances protection and use well, and that shows the success of bringing the extinct underground living spaces of Uçhisar village to date, and behind this is the founder of the hotel Göksin Ilıcalı's sensitive approach. Explaining that during the 25-year long-term development of the hotel, public spaces such as churches, bezirhanes and water tunnels, which were discovered underground, are still being used as public experience areas, Özbay emphasized that while doing restoration in Cappadocia, where large areas of destruction have been created recently due to disaster or political reasons, it is necessary to work without fear of the issue of 'reconstruction'

"There Is A Serious Conservation Problem In Nevşehir"

Özbay summarized the project they developed in partnership with architect Han Tümertekin for the recovery of the historical Kale Mahallesi in Nevşehir, which she described as a heartbreaking cultural massacre, as follows: "Between 2010 and 2014, Nevşehir Municipality completely demolished around 2,400 buildings that make up 11 historical neighborhoods on the Kale slope. The first intention was to build TOKİ villas in this area. When it was no longer possible to hide the system of caves that emerged from under the destroyed houses, the area was declared an archaeological site. Brand new findings that form the details of the Ottoman's




enormous investment at the beginning of the 17th century were unveiled from the underground. However, since the cave system of the area started to melt rapidly after the protective masonry houses at the top, there is a serious conservation problem in Nevşehir that requires urgent measures. Özbay underlined that preserving historical textures, which have been destroyed by ignorant public administrators and insensitive conservation mechanisms, eventually requires the support of civil initiatives.

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Communication Faculty, Public Relations and Advertising Department and Genesis Agency organized "Metaverse 101" seminar at Communication Faculty Purple Hall. During the seminar organized with the contributions of Public Relations and Advertising Department Head Prof. Dr. Anıl Kemal Kaya, EMU Public Relations and Advertising Department academic staff member Assist. Prof. Dr. Raziye Nevzat made a presentation on Metaverse and Non-Fungible Token (NFT). Providing

information on the future use of metaverse in the fields of marketing and advertising, Assist. Prof. Dr. Nevzat stated that the issues encountered in e-commerce will minimize and personally created avatars will provide great convenience in the field of communication. Emphasizing that metaverse universe is to contribute the attention economy in great sense, Assist. Prof. Dr. Nevzat indicated that there are claims regarding the metaverse helping to reduce the waste thrown into the environment to a large extent, and that stock management, logistics

and carbon footprint decreasing. Assist. Prof. Dr. Nevzat also added that celebrities animated with augmented reality can provide training. Later on the seminar, Assist. Prof. Dr. Nevzat expressed the emergence of metaverse economy which is to be used for purchasing, game and society platform. Assist. Prof. Dr. Nevzat emphasized that Roblox, the game platform, Decentraland, the purchasing management, The Sandbox, Spatial, Stegaverse platforms where the meetings are held, and the Vemaker platform, the community management platform, take place in the metaverse.

Stating that the metaverse technology mainly aims to reach the Z and Alpha generations, Assist. Prof. Dr. Nevzat added that among the innovations that Metaverse will offer, many brands will put digital products on sale with metaverse shopping. Informing that new professions will emerge in the metaverse world after 2025, Assist. Prof. Dr. Nevzat also answered the questions of the students at the end of the seminar, sharing the good news that the initiatives for adding the Metaverse into the curriculum of the EMU Public Relations and Advertising Department started. Participants on the seminar were presented with "Metaverse 101" participation certificates.

EMU DR. FAZIL KÜÇÜK MEDICINE FACULTY DEAN PROF. DR. NAHİDE GÖKÇORA ISSUES A STATEMENT ON 1-7 APRIL CANCER WEEK



Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty Dean Prof. Dr. Nahide Gökçora issued a statement on the occasion of 1-7 April Cancer Week. Gökçora's statement reads as follows:

"Cancer is the second cause of death in the world, following the cardiovascular diseases. Therefore, it is an important public health problem for the countries. However, there are many things that can be done about it. In many types of cancer, early diagnosis and treatment can increase the duration and the quality of life. Preventing the preventable cancer types is also possible with the application of right policies. Creating and implementing a well-rounded Cancer Control Program is the top

priority and most economical task for each country. Going on over two years, Covid-19 pandemic has disrupted the services provided in the field of cancer all around the world. Such disruptions include preventing the preventable cancers, early diagnosis services, people reaching to the necessary treatments and palliative treatments. For this reason, the Union for International Cancer Control (UICC) reached out all the countries on the occasion of 2022 World Cancer Day with this year's "Close the Care Gap" slogan. To be brief, in 2022, we must re-launch the services in these four areas as soon as possible and expand them to include all members of the society.

The most important issue in the design and implementation of all cancer-related services is to have reliable statistical data. In this context, cancer registry was established in cooperation with the TRNC Ministry of Health and EMU, with the TRNC Cancer Registry Project, which started in 2013 with the contributions of the Embassy of the Republic of Turkey.

Between the years of 2017 and 2018, total of 1697 cancer cases were diagnosed. Of these, 891 are men and 806 are women. Excluding malignant non-melanoma skin cancers, the total number of cases was found to be 1415. 710 of them are men and 705 of them are women.

The most common cancer types diagnosed in man during 2017-2018 were identified as

Prostate, Lung, Colorectal cancers, Bladder and Lymphoma, respectively. In women, the top five most common cancer types were Breast, Thyroid, Colorectal tumors, Uterine cancers and Lung Cancer, respectively.

Upon the data collection call made by the International Association of Cancer Registries (IACR) to the world, the 2013-2017 TRNC cancer records were compiled and delivered through the IACR regional representative. The data is still being analyzed by the IACR and the results of the analysis are expected to be presented in "Cancer in Five Continents" documents which will be published in 2023. Within this context, in 2022, we applied to the IACR for membership as the Northern Cyprus Cancer Registry Center. We are still waiting the IACR's feedback on the matter.

Among our goals are the creation of the staff of the Northern Cyprus Cancer Registry Center and the urgent employment of cancer registry staff, the acceptance of our membership application to the International Association of Cancer Registrars (IACR), the data we shared with the International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC), to ensure that Northern Cyprus is included in international cancer statistics, to hold meetings of the National Cancer Advisory Board, and to update and accelerate the screening and early diagnosis studies that should be carried out together with cancer registry."



EMU CENTER FOR CYPRUS STUDIES TO HOST ARTIST AYHAN MENTEŞ'S EXHIBITION TITLED "MEANINGFUL COINCIDENCES"

On the occasion of 15 April World Art Day celebrations, Eastern Mediterranean University Center for Cyprus Studies (EMU-CCS), in collaboration with the Mediterranean European Art Association (EMAA), is preparing to host an exhibition titled "Meaningful Coincidences" featuring the works of painter Ayhan Menteş, who passed away in 2016. Thus, EMU-CCS and EMAA will add a new one to their joint activities that started with the retrospective exhibition of painter Gönen Atakol in 2013. The exhibition, which focuses on the painter Ayhan Menteş (1936 – 2016), will meet with art lovers on Wednesday, 13 April, 2022, at 18:30, at Rauf Raif Denktaş Culture and Congress Center, Small Exhibition Hall. The "Meaningful Coincidences" exhibition can be visited between 10:00 and 17:00 on weekdays until 30 April, 2022.

Archiving and Research Process Over Four Years

The two institutions, which set out with the aim of recording the artists who have left a trace on the Turkish Cypriot community, giving their deserved place in history, and carrying out the necessary academic studies in this context, will have produced their first product with the "Meaningful Coincidences" exhibition and catalog, after more than four years of archiving and research activities. The second product in the publication process is called "My Life". The autobiography of Ayhan Menteş, which emerged during the archiving works, will be published in Turkish and English. The multi-authored "Ayhan Mentes Anthology", which is still being worked on, will meet with art lovers in the coming years. Exhibition curator of the extensive work and editor of the books is Dr. Esra Plümer Bardak whilst the coordination and archiving activities are being carried out by EMU Art Coordinator Zehra Sonya.

Indicates Jung's Concept of Synchronicity

The title "Meaningful Coincidences" refers to Swiss Psychiatrist Carl G. Jung's concept of synchronicity. In this concept, meaningful coincidences and events that do not have causal relationships but are meaningfully connected are analysed. Although the importance Jung attributes to the simultaneity of causally unrelated events is closely related to luck, astrology, mythology, physics and the power of creative thought, all of these are an integral part of Ayhan Menteş's visual exploration of the fish symbol, ocean symbols and other living forms. as part of it. "Meaningful Coincidences", which




