

EMU HOSTED VOCATIONAL EDUCATION WORKSHOP



A “Vocational Education Workshop” has been held in cooperation with the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC) Ministry of National Education, Vocational Technical Education Department and Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU). The opening of the said workshop, organized with the theme of “Life and Work Skills” took place on Tuesday, 31 May, 2022, at 09:30 a.m., at the Rauf Raif Denktaş Culture and Congress Center with the participation of the TRNC Minister of National Education Nazım Çavuşoğlu.

“TRNC Has Great Values and Resources in Education”

Speaking at the opening ceremony, Director of Vocational Technical Education Department Gülşen Hocanin stated that vocational education aims to raise innovative, entrepreneurial, productive, high-quality

workforce with national and international professional qualifications and values in cooperation with social and economic sectors. Providing information about the national and international projects carried out by the Vocational Technical Education Department, Hocanin drew attention to the importance of strengthening relations with social stakeholders, namely chambers and unions. Underlining that the TRNC has great values and resources in terms of education, Hocanin shared information about the work to be done at the workshop.

“Vocational Education is Very Important for the TRNC”

Speaking at the ceremony, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Aykut Hocanin stated that vocational education is a very important field for the TRNC. Emphasizing the responsibility of EMU as a state university in sharing

its accumulation and experience when it comes to quality in education, Prof. Dr. Hocanin talked about the important elements that the university has experienced in its programs’ journey to quality since its foundation in 1979. Noting that in order to achieve quality in education, learning outcomes must be determined and, at the same time, they must be measurable, Prof. Dr. Hocanin noted that after the assessment, the missing parts should be determined and corrected and the cycle of continuous improvement should continue. Noting that EMU has completed all of its general quality processes before the eyes of an external evaluator, Prof. Dr. Hocanin pointed out that, as a result of this, EMU’s work has been certified on an international scale, and that it is also at the top of international rankings. Prof. Dr. Hocanin stated that the workshop would yield fruitful results and wished everyone a good event.

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“I Wish the Workshop Reports Shed Light on the Country”

Speaking at the ceremony, TRNC Minister of National Education Nazım Çavuşoğlu stated that he was proud to be attending the workshop and added that while the youth in the country complained about unemployment or migrated, the fact that 40 thousand people with work permits could come to the country and earn their living here is an indication that something went wrong. Drawing attention to the importance of bringing the public and private sectors together, Minister Çavuşoğlu stated that it is their duty to determine the needs of the country and to chart the path to be followed. Stating that the workshop is a part of this duty, Minister Çavuşoğlu pointed out the necessity of creating a permanent national education policy and keeping it at a different point above politics. Emphasizing the sine qua non of vocational training, Minister Çavuşoğlu pointed out that the industry should be aware that protecting its own land and people is about embracing them and giving them a chance to grow. Minister Çavuşoğlu wished that the reports of the workshop would shed light on the country.

Groups and Topics

Four different working groups took part in the workshop, which aimed to standardize vocational education in the TRNC, integrate educational quality with the world, and achieve sustainable flexible vocational education. Representatives from ministries, political parties, universities, instructors, non-governmental organizations and municipalities were also present in the working groups.

The topic of “Law/Administration” was covered under the chairing of Gülşen Hocannı, Director of the TRNC Ministry of National Education, Department of Vocational and Technical Education. In this topic, issues such as effective mechanisms and methods for the implementation of a vocational qualification framework, standardization of measurement and evaluation in the certification system, and laws, regulations and responsibilities in vocational education have been discussed.

The topic of “Programs/Vocational Standards” was discussed under the chairing of Murad Aktuğ, Director of TRNC Ministry of National Education, Department of Education and Discipline. The said topic covered issues such as the principles of developing programs, teaching plans, and teacher field competencies.

The topic of “The Relationship of Business Life and Recruitment with School and University” has been covered under the chairing of EMU School of Computing and Technology Director Assoc. Prof. Dr. Nazife Dimililer. In this topic, the qualifications of schools and universities, transitions to business life, and supporting schools will be discussed.

The topic of “Lifelong Education” was covered under the chairing of EMU Tourism Faculty Dean Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç. Subjects such as life-long responsibilities of schools and universities, standardization of applied programs and education, recognition and validity of certificates were discussed during the said session.

The workshop came to an end at 16:00 with a meeting where the group decisions were announced.

Emotions and Social Media

Delivering the seminar titled “The Effect of Community Mood on Brands’ Social Media Communication”, Dr. Ezgi Akpınar touched on the emotions talking about how they take shape over time and during the day, with the situations in social media and in our lives, and mentioned the effects of social media on emotions. Adding that social media acting as a lens for our emotions, Dr. Ezgi

Akpınar indicated that the emotions are contagious. Stating that events such as terrorism, martyrdom or great forest fires in the regions where people live, cause sudden emotional changes, Dr. Akpınar stated that she carried out a research and development study in order to find out what emotions can come after these feelings of their hatred, sadness and joy which people express by using words. Dr. Akpınar explained that people in Turkey tend to talk about such events on social media platforms for a period no longer than 13 days.

What should Brands Pay Attention to?

Saying that marketing cannot be a sole scientific discipline based on the research and studies they carried out, Dr. Akpınar stated that she focuses on the psychology as well when it comes to analyzing a company’s actions. Stating that there is a separate phrase for each emotion



on social media, Dr. Akpınar told the audience that social media is a different database. Evaluating social media in terms of brands, Dr. Akpınar pointed out that brands should share their posts according to the ever-changing world agenda. Mentioning that reactionary posts may have long-term harm to brands,

Dr. Akpınar stated that such simple mistakes should be avoided. At the end of the seminar, Dr. Akpınar was presented a plaque by EMU Communication Faculty, Public Relations and Advertising Department Head Prof. Dr. Anıl Kemal Kaya and academic staff member Assist. Prof. Dr. Nilüfer Türksoy.

EMU Alumni Meets with Students

At the opening of the 27th Civil Engineering Week, EMU Engineering Faculty, Civil Engineering Department Chair Prof. Dr. Umut Türker delivered a speech and stated the meaning of the day. The event continued with the speech of Gürkan Yağcıoğlu, President of the Cyprus Turkish Chamber of Civil Engineers. In his speech, Yağcıoğlu provided EMU Civil Engineering Department students with information about the Civil Engineering profession, raising awareness among engineer candidates about the risks and opportunities they will encounter in their professional lives. Yağcıoğlu, who is also a graduate of EMU Civil Engineering Department, increased the students’ motivation with the examples he gave from his student life. Then, Abdullah Ekinci, Secretary General of the Union of Chambers of Cyprus Turkish Engineers and Architects (KTMMOB), Chamber of



Civil Engineers, delivered a presentation on the history of Civil Engineering, the development of Civil Engineering and the Chamber of Civil Engineers in Cyprus, and the Chamber’s activities. The activities continued with the seminar of Berker Turan, a project engineer and also a 2001 EMU graduate, and a workshop he held with the final year students. EMU DR. FAZIL KÜÇÜK FACULTY OF MEDICINE CLINICAL PRACTICE AND RESEARCH CENTER INAUGURATED WITH THE PARTICIPATION OF MINISTER OF HEALTH İZLEM GÜRÇAĞ ALTUĞRA



Eastern Mediterranean University's (EMU) Clinical Practice and Research Center, which will operate under Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty, has been inaugurated on Friday, 3 June 2022 at a ceremony held at Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty with the participation of TRNC Minister of Health İzlem Gürçağ Altuğra.

Present at the opening ceremony were Minister Altuğra, EMU Board of Trustees President Dr. Erdal Özçen, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Aykut Hoca'nın, General Director of Cyprus Evkaf Administration, Prof. Dr. İbrahim F. Benter, EMU Board of Trustees Members, Vice Rector for Administrative and Technical Affairs Prof. Dr. Serhan Sensoy, Dr. Fazıl Küçük Faculty of Medicine Dean Prof. Dr. Nahide Gökçora, Head of Clinical Practice and Research Center Assoc. Prof. Dr. Nilüfer Güzoğlu,

faculty deans, faculty members and students. Before the ceremony, Minister Altuğra attended visited EMU Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty Building and got information. Then the opening ceremony started.

"We Will Be Able to Do Multidisciplinary Studies"

Speaking at the ceremony, EMU Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty Clinical Practice and Research Center Director Assoc. Prof. Dr. Nilüfer Güzoğlu wished the center to be beneficial for the faculty and EMU. Assoc. Prof. Güzoğlu stated that medicine has been adopted as an art because, while diagnosing patients, doctors gather information from the patient one by one, like painting brush strokes on a canvas, and combine them with their wisdom, mastery and experience to reveal the big picture. Emphasizing that faculty students will have the

opportunity to meet with patients from the first year under the roof of EMU, as recommended by internationally reputable organizations, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Güzoğlu also stated that they can carry out multidisciplinary studies with other faculties that train health professionals at the center.

"Students Will See Good Clinical Practices"

EMU Dr. Fazıl Küçük Faculty of Medicine Dean Prof. Dr. Nahide Gökçora stated that they are proud and honored to be providing new services to the public, and emphasized that the Clinical Practice and Research Center, which has actively been put into service at Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty today, is an important step taken in accordance with the mission of the faculty. Expressing that their mission is to raise quality doctors who make a difference with their skills, and to produce solutions by shedding light on the health problems of the society, Prof. Dr. Gökçora talked about projects such as the cancer registry project that the faculty has been carrying out for years for public health and the establishment of Famagusta State Hospital – EMU genetic research laboratories. Stating that students and experts in the Clinical Practice and Research Center will implement practices such as age-appropriate cancer screening, vaccination in children, counseling for early diagnosis of neurodiversity such as autism, diagnosis and treatment of dementia, one of the most important problems of our age, Prof. Dr. Gökçora pointed out that their aim is to bring faculty members together with the public at the center and to serve public health by educating students as witnesses of good clinical practices from the first years of their medical education. Prof. Dr. Gökçora wished the center to be beneficial to the faculty, EMU and the whole country.

"I would like to thank those who contributed to the opening of the center"

Expressing that today is a very happy day for them, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Aykut Hoca'nın, thanked former Rector Prof. Dr. Necdet Osam and his team for taking the first step on this issue. Emphasizing that the aim of EMU as a state university is to provide quality education, conduct research and serve the society, Prof. Dr. Hoca'nın noted that the opening of the center is a moment when these three goals intersect. Underlining that they do not aim to serve the society like a hospital, but aim to provide basic clinical education in the first three years for

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educational purposes at the center, whilst seeing patients and contributing to the society. Prof. Dr. Aykut Hoca'nın pointed out that EMU is a name in every field. Prof. Dr. Aykut Hoca'nın thanked all the stakeholders who contributed to the opening of the center.

“Public’s Access to Health Services Will Increase”

President of the EMU Board of Trustees Dr. Erdal Özçenk stated that he is proud, both as the President of the Board of Trustees and as a doctor, that such a center has been introduced to the country by EMU. Reminding that EMU is the locomotive of higher education in the TRNC, Dr. Özçenk noted that EMU, which is a great asset of the country, has a structure that is intertwined with the public. Pointing out that the most striking example of this is the support they gave to the students as one heart with the public during the difficult pandemic process, Dr. Özçenk stated that thanks to EMU’s strong institutional structure, it has successfully overcome this difficult period with the measures it has taken economically and socially. Dr. Özçenk emphasized that in addition to the quality education that EMU provides to its students, it also produces projects that will add value to the TRNC. Giving information about the history of Dr. Fazıl Küçük Faculty of Medicine, Dr. Özçenk pointed out that faculty graduates can practice medicine all over the world. Expressing that the center will increase the public’s access to health services, Dr. Özçenk noted that it will also provide faculty students with the opportunity to practice under the supervision of their instructors. Stating that various services for public health will be provided and research will be conducted in the center, Dr. Özçenk congratulated all stakeholders who contributed to the establishment of this modern center and wished the students and the public good luck.

TRNC Minister of Health, İzlem Gürçağ Altuğra, stated that medical education is the most comprehensive and long-leg education and emphasized the importance of practical applications as well as the developing educational technologies in this process. Stating that the TRNC is the island of universities, Minister Altuğra pointed out that the fact that medical faculties have opportunities for students to learn good clinical practices is an important plus for the country. Altuğra also stated that continuing their observations and research at hospitals affiliated to the ministry, Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty students now have these opportunities within EMU. Minister Altuğra underlined that the role of science-based universities is indispensable in carrying healthcare services to a higher level in a country. established in Famagusta State Hospital are the two best examples of the benefits that the joint work has brought to the country, Minister Altuğra said it is their greatest wish to work together on beautiful projects with EMU. Stating that Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty has made such progress since its establishment and it should be appreciated that it has trained successful students to serve in the sensitive field of health, Minister Altuğra said that with the opening of the center, besides the practical training of the students, many studies to be organized by the academics in the field of health will be conducted. motivating effect and the ministry’s infrastructure in terms of personnel and equipment, they can achieve many more good works, Minister Altuğra wished the center to be beneficial and auspicious for the country.

Expert participants from Northern Cyprus, Turkey, Italy and Spain participated in the conference, which started with the opening ceremony held on Wednesday, 1 June, 2022, at 09.00 a.m., and shared their knowledge, experience and research results on different perspectives of the principle of Constitutional Democracy and the Rule of Law.

The opening ceremony, which garnered the participation of a large number of participants, was attended by the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus Supreme Court President Narin Ferdi Şefik, TRNC Parliamentary Vice President Fazilet Özdenefe, TRNC MP Şifa Çolakoğlu, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Aykut Hoca'nın, Vice Deans of the Faculty of Law Assoc. Prof. Dr. Arzu Alibaba and Assist. Prof.

Dr. Hakan Bilgeç and Prof. Luca Mezzetti from the University of Bologna.

Speaking at the opening ceremony, EMU Faculty of Law Vice Dean Assoc. Prof. Dr. Arzu Alibaba stated that as EMU Faculty of Law they are very happy to be hosting the international conference, and stated that the subject of “Constitutional Democracy and the Rule of Law: Mediterranean Perspectives” will be discussed with both theoretical and practical aspects. During the second session chaired by Prof. Dr. Luca Mezzetti, Prof. Dr. Mezzetti gave a presentation titled “Democracy’s Withering: Ten Years After Arab Springs” and Assist. Prof. Dr. Ulaş Gündüzler presented information on “Ability of the EU in Promoting and Safeguarding the Rule of Law in Europe”. The third session commenced at 14:00 under the chairing of Prof. Dr. Selin Esen. Following a

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presentation on “Emergency Regimes and Erosion of Constitutional Democracies”, Dr. Francesca Polacchini gave an online presentation titled “The Presidentialization of the Italian Executive in Times of Pandemic Crisis”. Finally, Dr. Francesco Biagi gave a presentation titled “Tunisia’s Democratic Backsliding”.

In the fourth session chaired by Prof. Dr. Bertil Emrah Oder, Oder delivered a presentation titled “Constitutional Backsliding(s): Trajectories, Challenges, And Responses” and Assist. Prof. Dr. Aydın Atılğan presented information on “Political Economy of Constitutions: Markets and Democracy in Turkey”. Then, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Caterina Drigo presented information on: “Rule of Law and Migration in the European Context: A Focus on The European Convention on Human Rights and the Jurisprudence of the European Court Of Human Rights”.

Prof. Dr. Gerardo Ruiz-Rico and Prof. Dr. Juan José Ruiz’s presentation “Limits of Power in Spain: Constitution and



(territorial) Democracy”; Prof. Dr. Juan Montabes Pereira’s presentation “The Model of Political Decentralization in Spain: The Development of the State of the Autonomies 1978-2022”; The conference ended with an open session moderated by Prof. Dr. Juan Montabes and closing

remarks. During the open session which hosted the active participation of Prof. Dr. Ahmet Sözen, Prof. Dr. Bertil Emrah Oder, Prof. Dr. Luca Mezzetti and Prof. Dr. Selin Esen, all keynote speakers and academicians shared their evaluations regarding government systems.

EMU HOSTS A SEMINAR ON 'CHINESE FOREIGN POLICY IN THE 21st CENTURY'



Eastern Mediterranean University Cyprus Policy Center (EMU CPC) and EMU Faculty of Business and Economics, Department of Political Science and International Relations hosted a seminar on "Chinese Foreign Policy in the 21st Century" on Thursday, 26 May 2022. After delivering the opening speech, Chair of EMU Political Science and International Relations Department and EMU CPC

Prof. Dr. Ahmet Sözen introduced Prof. Dr. Çağdaş Üngör to the participants and left the floor to her. Working at Marmara University, Department of Political Science and International Relations, Prof. Dr. Üngör has many studies on Turkish-Chinese relations as well as on issues related to China. Evaluating the Ukraine crisis and the Chinese foreign policy, Prof. Dr. Üngör emphasized the

importance of China's "one country, two systems policy" especially in the design and building of Chinese foreign policy. Emphasizing that the principles that form the basis of Chinese foreign policy are non-intervention in the internal affairs of other countries, respect for their local jurisdictions and win-win solutions, Prof. Dr. Üngör added that the effects of China's semi-colonial past, anti-imperialism and "Third World" policy are observed in China's policies. Prof. Dr. Üngör also put forth that in today's Chinese foreign policy, targets such as balancing the US hegemony, creating an international environment conducive to China's economic growth, maintaining the status quo in China and finding diplomatic solutions to the problems come to the fore. Pointing out that China is portrayed as a threat by NATO and in the US National Defense Strategy

document, Prof. Dr. Üngör explained that the underlying reasons are the trade competition between the US and China, the policies of enmity between the two countries, the negative effects of the Trump era and the pandemic process. Pointing out that the competition with the USA has increased the importance of Russia for China, Prof. Dr. Üngör expressed that although China did not approve of Russia's invasion of Ukraine, it did not impose sanctions. Prof. Dr. Üngör stated that it is not healthy to predict the future from now, but the outstanding good scenario is that China is a responsible stakeholder that contributes to international organizations and balances the power of the USA, and the negative scenario is that China challenges the international system, divides the world with alliances, and opposes its neighbors.

Mohamad Akkad, Res. Assist. Kerem Cemil Özer and Research Assist. Sila Su Yanar. EMU Architecture Faculty, Interior Architecture Department made the following statement on the subject: "The 2022 theme of the World Interiors Day (IFI WID), observed with various events all over the world within the framework of a different theme determined every year under the umbrella of IFI, is "Pride of the past, an incentive for the future".

"Creative Solutions for Future Difficulties"

It is thought that the said theme will provide a unique opportunity to evaluate the current situation, to revive the purpose of our profession and its efforts to fill its gaps with beauty and meaning. In more detail, it is emphasized that it can be a tool through which we can reflect our traditions and heritage while thinking about innovation and creative solutions for future challenges. Reinterpreting and keeping alive the cultural heritage and traditions, which are very closely related to the Interior Architecture profession, within the framework of changing needs and conditions is a very important subject.

In different geographies of the world, many historical buildings that have survived with their formal and structural integrity are tried to be kept alive with functions that can serve the different needs of daily life. Unconscious re-functioning/ use attempts among these historical structures, which are the embodiment of the traditions and certain living conditions of the period, cause serious destruction. It is frequently emphasized among the universal acceptances of the Interior Architecture profession that the approach and intervention to historical buildings should be the product of a conscious approach.

"Practical Applications Every Semester"

In scope of the education offered, EMU Interior Architecture Department has strived to create awareness, approach methods and sensitive solutions for the future, and carries out applications every semester within the scope of Interior Architecture Workshop – IV. In this framework, existing buildings with historical value are recognised as application areas, and these buildings are designed to establish a relationship with the present and the future, with wide-span solutions that do not contain very complex functions and open to multiple uses. In the interior, structural additions independent of the structure and application-oriented design proposals are expected. Human needs, culture, technology, indoor-outdoor relationship, furniture and equipment decisions are made regarding the space. The aim of this course is, starting with the existing historical building and its surroundings, to introduce students to research, concept development, functional issues, human needs, culture, interior, human-environment relations, spatial and formal configuration, interior organization, lighting, color, technology, interior design, and to provide experience in the design process of interior architecture by focusing on structure, structure and finishing materials. The studio allows students to raise awareness of contemporary conservation approaches for historic buildings as well as different ways of thinking about architecture, creating, designing and critical inquiry."
