international stage is rooted in technology, stating that when EMU was founded in 1979, it provided education in the field of engineering, but now it has become an international brand with a student profile coming from 106 different countries. "UAVs are Important for the Country to be Fully Independent and Strong"

Taking the floor after Prof. Dr. Kılıç, Bayraktar started his talk by discussing the struggle with unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs) under the National Technology Initiative and the societal activities conducted under the Turkey Technology Team Foundation. Bayraktar mentioned the beginnings of work on unmanned aerial vehicles in the 2000s, highlighting that Turkey was seeking a breakthrough in the defense industry at that time and they believed these vehicles could be effective. Bayraktar pointed out that work on the first mini UAVs began in this context, providing detailed information about their development process. Addressing the importance of UAVs in combating terrorism, Bayraktar emphasized that what matters is not what is done but how and why it is done, underscoring that this work is carried out for the country to be fully independent and strong. Bayraktar also provided information about the KIZILELMA project in his presentation, stating that the project opens the doors to a new world in aviation. At the end of the presentation, Prof. Dr. Mustafa Tümer, the Vice-Rector responsible for Promotion and Institutional Communication at EMU and the Chair of the Cyprus Science and Intelligence Board of Trustees, presented a gift to Selçuk Bayraktar. EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç presented Bayraktar with a silver plate as a token of appreciation for his participation. In return, Bayraktar presented a model of the Akıncı aircraft to Prof. Dr. Kılıç.

EMU NURSING DEPARTMENT RELEASED A STATEMENT REGARDING ORGAN DONATION WEEK



Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU), Faculty of Health Sciences, Department of Nursing academic staff member Assoc. Prof. Dr. Gülten Sucu Dağ and Research Assistant Gülcan Dürüst Sakallı released a statement about Organ Donation Week, observed between 3 and 9 November. The following statements were included in the message:

“Organ Donation and Organ Transplantation”
“Living is Beautiful, Give Life is Also Beautiful...”

“EMU Faculty of Health Sciences Nursing Department”

“Organ/tissue transplantation is the process of transferring a healthy organ/tissue from a living or deceased donor to a recipient whose organ/tissue has lost its function for various reasons. Organ/tissue transplantation is the recommended life-sustaining and life-preserving treatment option for patients with end-stage organ failure that cannot be treated with other methods. Organ/tissue transplants can occur from a living donor to another living recipient or from a deceased donor to a living recipient. Deceased donor transplants are performed based on the irreversible damage to the brain (brain death) of the patient, declared by the patient’s relatives or by the patient himself/herself while alive. The goal of organ/tissue transplantation is to enhance the quality of life by eliminating various limitations/problems such as the reduction of the patient’s quality of life, shortening of life expectancy, and the risk of death, as well as social and



financial issues. Organ failure and the parallel problem of insufficient donors are increasing in both the world and the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC). The first legal regulation regarding organ transplantation in the TRNC was enacted in 2014. With the implementation of the law that regulates the procedures and principles of organ transplantation in 2015, according to the data of the Ministry of Health, 51 kidney transplants were performed in the TRNC, 28 from deceased donors and 23 from living donors. The heart transplant was a first for both the TRNC and the island of Cyprus. In addition, 2 kidneys, 5 hearts, and 8 livers were donated and transplanted to patients in the Republic of Turkey. In the TRNC, 54 organ transplants have been performed to date, with kidney transplants accounting for 51 of them. Kidney transplants have been the most commonly performed type of operation in the TRNC. According to the latest information, 3 heart transplants have also been performed. Currently, there are over 200 patients waiting for a kidney transplant and nearly 40 waiting for a heart transplant. The number of patients waiting for organ transplants is increasing day by day, but the number of donors is insufficient, similar to the global trend.” Millions of people worldwide are unable to continue their lives in a healthy manner due to organ and tissue failure. They require organ/tissue transplantation to sustain a healthy life. The needed organ/tissue can be obtained from a living or deceased donor. The biggest obstacle faced by individuals in need of organ/tissue transplantation is the increasing number of patients on organ waiting lists, coupled with

a disproportionately low number of donors. Evaluating this situation, the only solution for the realization of organ and tissue donation, also known as ‘donating one’s organs with chronic organ failure to patients after one’s death,’ ‘allowing one’s tissues and organs to be used for the treatment of other patients after medical termination of life with freely given consent while alive,’ is through the creation of societal and individual awareness and increasing awareness to boost donations in organ/tissue transplants. In this context, increasing donations in organ/tissue transplants can be achieved through the creation of societal and individual awareness and increasing awareness. One of the most effective ways to achieve this is through mass media, which is perhaps the foremost and most important source to inform the public about organ donation. The fundamental cause of global organ shortage arises not from the lack of suitable organs but from the inability to transform potential donors into actual donors. Despite individuals having positive attitudes toward organ donation, the number of those who document and donate their organs is significantly insufficient. The most influential factors affecting organ donation include individual beliefs (religious, family, cultural, social, and bodily integrity), the organ donation process, and the healthcare system (previous negative experiences). The primary reason potential organ donors do not donate is the lack of consent from family members. Therefore, sharing our thoughts on organ donation with our immediate family members might one day provide an opportunity to save a life or give someone a new chance at life when we pass away. Another significant concern for a family considering donating the organs of a deceased loved one is the fear that their loved one’s bodily integrity will be completely compromised. However, organ transplantation is no different from any other surgery performed on millions of people every day. There is no other mark on the body except for a normal surgical scar. Let us remember that organ donation is a humanitarian duty. Anyone above the age of 18 and in sound mind can be an organ donor. In our country, to make an organ donation, an application must be submitted to the Coordination Board Secretariat within the TRNC Ministry of Health, and the donation form must be filled out and recorded. The donation form can be obtained from state hospitals in Nicosia, Kyrenia, and Famagusta, as well as from the Coordination Board Secretariat. Prof. Dr. Sepideh Hassanpour Khodaei attended a conference organized by Sao Paulo Federal University, Department of Genetics as a guest and participated in international cell engineering research projects.

By participating in two important projects, respectively titled as “Applying the Mummy Substance in Immortalized Cells to Evaluate Genetic Alterations” and “Applying the Mummy Substance in Corneal Cells to Evaluate Cell Viability and Proliferation”, to be carried out by EMU and Sao Paulo Federal University in Brazil, Assist. Prof. Dr. Khodaei contributes the development of collaborations between the two universities. Talking on the topic, Assist. Prof. Dr. Khodaei noted that both projects aim to evaluate the genetic alterations, cell viability and proliferation. Adding more, Assist. Prof. Dr. Khodaei also delivered a presentation titled “The Genetic Basis of Organ Development” in Brazil. Noting that the said project reached successful results in its stages, Assist. Prof. Dr. Khodaei stated that she has also carrying out research in collaboration with Ophthalmology group. Aiming to enhance the project furthermore following the achievements it has obtained, Assist. Prof. Dr. Khodaei mentioned



her desire to conduct in-vivo studies. Reporting that she interviewed with experts in the field of ophthalmology, Assist. Prof. Dr. Khodaei stated that she received collaboration offers to manage the studies in line with her to lead the research.

The said studies represent a significant progress in the field of international cell and genetics research. It is believed that the studies of Assist. Prof. Dr. Khodaei are to lead to further success and scientific discoveries in future.

EMU DEAN OF FACULTY OF ARCHITECTURE PROF. DR. RESMIYE ALPAR ATUN RELEASES THE RESULTS OF THE EARTHQUAKE WORKSHOP



The outcome statement of the “Co-Create Earthquake Workshop” held in May in collaboration with the Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Faculty of Architecture, the Deputy Prime Ministry of the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC), the Ministry of Tourism, Culture, Youth and Environment, and the Union of Turkish Cypriot Engineers and Architects (KTMMOB), was announced during a meeting. The meeting was attended by EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç, Vice Rector for Academic Affairs Prof. Dr. Osman M. Karatepe, Dean of the Faculty of Architecture Prof. Dr. Resmiye Alpar Atun, Architecture Faculty Member and ISME Board Member Prof. Dr. Yünce Hürol, Chair of the KTMMOB Tunç Adanır, and Ayşen Albayrak, Director of the Department of Geology and Mines of the Deputy Prime Ministry, Tourism, Culture, Youth and Environment of the TRNC.

“Legal, Systemic and Institutional Deficiencies Observed”

At the meeting, EMU Faculty of Architecture Dean Prof. Dr. Resmiye Alpar Atun read a press statement regarding the workshop. Prof. Dr. Atun conveyed that, based on the discussions during the workshop, the experts contributing to the workshop pointed out that the fundamental issues underlying the earthquake problem in the country are legal, systemic, and institutional deficiencies.

Speaking at the meeting, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç indicated the profound impact of earthquakes on the country’s history. Emphasizing the importance of considering the opinions of experts in the field, Prof. Dr.

Kılıç stated that knowledge and wisdom not only bring academic achievements but also entail aesthetic functionality and safety. Stressing that architectural education is crucial not only for aesthetics but also for earthquake safety, Prof. Dr. Kılıç also highlighted the significance of the university’s collaboration with civil society organizations.

“Actions should be taken Based on Public Interests”

The Chair of KTMMOB Tunç Adanır noted that the issue of building safety has started to be taken seriously again after earthquakes. Emphasizing the poor quality of materials, unauthorized construction, and the effectiveness of zoning amnesties in the Isias Hotel incident, Adanır highlighted the need to prevent such practices in construction and to listen to experts. Stressing the importance of acting according to public interests, Adanır pointed out the need to examine the current situation in the country. Emphasizing the need for more active control of on-site practices, Adanır noted that they are working to fill the gap in this regard.

“Necessary Steps Should be taken before another Earthquake Occurs”

Ayşen Albayrak, Director of the Department of Geology and Mines at the Deputy Prime Ministry, Tourism, Culture, Youth and Environment of the TRNC, stated that the country is located in a geographical region where earthquakes frequently occur, with active fault lines, and emphasized the need to be aware of this fact. Albayrak also pointed out the necessity of conducting risk analyses

related to earthquakes, highlighting the workshop’s usefulness in this regard and emphasizing the importance of taking necessary steps before a new earthquake occurs.

Critical Problems Regarding Earthquake

In her presentation regarding the workshop, EMU Architecture Faculty’s Dean Prof. Dr. Resmiye Alpar Atun stated that the workshop brought light on critical problems related to the earthquake issue in the country. Atun listed these problems as legal and regulatory issues, lack of collaboration and coordination among stakeholders, structural deficiencies in planning decisions and processes, educational shortcomings, awareness and sensitivity issues, soil-foundation relationship problems, lack of information, ethical thinking deficiencies, and issues related to old buildings.

An Ethnographic Research Suggestion

Prof. Dr. Yonca Hürol, Faculty Member of the Faculty of Architecture at EMU and Board Member of the Interdisciplinary Studies in the Built Environment Research Center (ISBE), expressed that the earthquake issue in the TRNC is not merely a technical problem but has become ingrained in the ‘everyday culture’. Therefore, she mentioned that the Faculty of Architecture at EMU and ISBE have decided to continue their earthquake-focused and multidisciplinary studies through a comprehensive ethnographic research. Hürol also noted that these research efforts are dedicated to the Champion Angels we lost in Adıyaman on 6 February, 2023.



PEACE SUPPORT AWARENESS ACTIVITY BY EMU ARCHITECTURE DEPARTMENT

The Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU), Faculty of Architecture, Department of Architecture organized a short and silent awareness activity titled ‘Human-Peace Statue’ to exhibit a stance against the wars, genocides, attacks on civilians, children, and vulnerable individuals happening in the region and around the world. The event, held on Wednesday, 25 October, 2023, at 11:30 a.m. at EMU Faculty of Architecture, was conducted within the framework of the Arch 320 course, ‘United Nations Sustainable Development Goals:

An Interdisciplinary Approach,’ offered as a university and area elective by the Department of Architecture.
