After the EMU and Waqfs men's volleyball teams fought each other, the teams did not score points against each other at the end of the match and finished the match with a score of 24-24, accompanied by applause. In the match directed by Sedat Kılıç, the women's teams also made substitutions and finished the match with a score of 24-24, accompanied by applause.

Teams Presented their Trophies to Famagusta Turkish Maarif College

An awarding ceremony was held following the matches. During the very emotional ceremony, Famagusta Turkish Maarif College Principal Savaş Moralı and Parent-Teacher Association Director Osman Akın who also lost his sons Alp and Doruk in the disaster were presented with TRNC Volleyball Federation's Champion Angels Team Memorial Jerseys.

TRNC President Ersin Tatar and founding President Rauf Raif Denktaş's daughter Ender Denktaş Vangöl presented trophies to the team captains. Then, team captains gave the trophies to Famagusta Turkish Maarif College Principal Savaş Moralı and Parent-Teacher Association Director Osman Akın. When Osman Akın came to collect the trophy, the participants in the stands threw carnations on the field in memory of the Champion Angels Team and gave a standing ovation for a long time. The event ended with a closing speech delivered by Famagusta Turkish Maarif College Principal Savaş Moralı.

During his speech, Principal Moralı said: "I would like to commence my speech by wishing God's mercy on our beloved children, teachers and parents. I express my sincerest condolences to their families and all of us. Their names are now identified with our school. As long as our school exists, they will continue to live with our school. Firstly, we need to protect our beloved children, teachers and parents, whose most sacred right to life, has been taken from them unscrupulously, at all levels, both social and public, and we must seek their rights in a legal sense until the end. Secondly, it is necessary to keep their names alive with events and activities like these and to send greetings to our children, teachers and parents with such activities as much as possible. Undoubtedly, they will live forever in the warmest corner of our hearts".

Despite the Women's Quota, We Could Not Eliminate Male Dominance in Politics"

The first speaker of the panel was Member of the Parliament Resmiye Eroğlu Canaltay, who started her speech by stating that this year 8 March International Women's Day is being celebrated under the shadow and sorrow of the devastating earthquake which took place on 6 February. Stating that the country's politics has a male-dominated structure, Canaltay added that although there is a 30% women's quota in politics, they still cannot eliminate the male dominance and put forth that there are problems in voting for women. Stating that people who grew up in a conservative environment do not vote for women, Canaltay added that she finds herself more fortunate because she comes from a family with political background. Canaltay said that a woman who started politics from scratch has many difficulties when it comes to being elected. Canaltay, who provided advice to the young people participating in the panel, pointed out the importance of mutual communication, agreement and respect.

Gender Inequality Continues All Over the World"

Speaking at the panel, Member of the Parliament from the Republican Turkish Party Dr. Sıla Usar İncirli noted that inequality between men and women continues all over the world and the struggle against this inequality is as old as human history. Pointing out that the concepts such as inequality between men and women, all kinds of discrimination against women, violence against women, men and women doing the same job and getting different salaries, women's inability to find a job, women's lack of right to vote and be elected, are not old concepts, but are facts that exist in recent history. Dr. İncirli stated that the world has made significant progress on this path, but that the desired point has not yet been reached.

"Gender Stereotypes Must Be Eliminated Together"

Fazilet Özdenefe, Vice Spokesperson of the TRNC Republican Assembly, stated that men and women are not at the point of equality that should be in practice or on paper. Noting that gender equality could not be mainstreamed, Özdenefe said that as long as the wheels of patriarchy are not broken, patriarchy will continue to produce not only by men but also by women. Özdenefe noted that women and men should collectively break the stereotypes and accepted gender roles that come from patriarchy in solidarity.

"Women Should Not Give Up The Fight"

UBP Deputy Yasemin Öztürk thanked Great Leader Mustafa Kemal Atatürk for giving women the right to vote and be elected before many western countries. Expressing that she was born as the eldest child of a family with five children and a very low income, Öztürk stated that it was not easy for her to reach these days in her career. Öztürk stated that when she was a candidate for the İskele Municipality Council Membership, men told him that she could not win and that she should not be a candidate for nothing, but that despite losing two elections, she won the election by not giving up the fight, adding that women should never give up the fight.

"Women's Income is 14% Less Than Men's"

Independent Member of the Parliament Ayşegül Baybars provided information about the history by explaining why 8 March is celebrated and determined as the day of struggle. Noting that there are very serious inequalities and injustice in the world on the basis of human rights, animal rights and environmental rights, Baybars said that pushing for discrimination between gender roles makes people lonely. Baybars stated that in 1857, 120 women lost their lives for equal pay for equal work, the right to vote and improved working conditions, but even though more than 150 years have passed since this struggle, women's income are 14% less than men's according to the European Union's 2021 report.

Following the question answer session, EMU Board of Trustees President Dr. Özcenk and Vice Rector Prof. Dr. İşçioğlu presented plaques of appreciation to panelists.

EMU URBAN RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT CENTER'S 8 MARCH INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY MESSAGE



Eastern Mediterranean University Urban Research and Development Center (EMU-URDC) released a statement on the occasion of 8 March International Women's Day. The message reads as follows:

"The fifth of the 17 Global Goals for Sustainable Development, set by the United Nations in 2015 to eradicate extreme poverty, combat inequality and injustice, and take measures against climate change, by 2030 is to achieve gender equality and empower women and girls. Dating back to 1800s, the 2023 theme for 8 March International Women's Day is set as "DigitALL: Innovation and technology for gender equality" with the intention of emphasizing the need for inclusive and transformative technology and digital education within the scope of 'Enhance the use of enabling technology, in particular, information and communications technology, to promote the empowerment of women' sub-goal of 5th global goal (SGD5). While advances in digital technology offer significant opportunities to address development and humanitarian challenges and achieve the Sustainable Development Goals, they also pose the risk of perpetuating existing patterns of gender inequality.

Gender inequalities and the role of women in society, city and urban culture have an important place in multidimensional urban studies. Issues such as gender discrimination, inequalities, and the vulnerabilities of women and girls that still persist around the world; violence, including sexual and all forms of abuse, against all women and girls in public and private spaces, and women and individuals who feel insecure and vulnerable as a result; inequality in access and use of public spaces due to lack of security and fear of women; decisions taken without considering the needs of women, children and genders in the physical planning of the city and the design of the urban space; urban planning and local policies that do not prioritize gender equality are among the most important issues in contemporary planning and urban design theory.

Our Center, which is aware of the necessity of solidarity and joint struggle in the ongoing conflict environments, disasters, inequalities and injustices in various parts of the world, and of the necessity of producing scientific studies in this sense, believes that the problems arising from gender inequalities are not only the problems of women, but the whole society and humanity.

In this respect, EMU Urban Research and Development Center will support all kinds of projects to ensure gender equality and empower all women and girls, in a way that supports the UN Sustainable Development Goals, to support innovation and technological change and education in the digital age; In this sense, it is ready to produce and implement 'non-sexist' inclusive projects with local governments to improve urban public spaces and produce women-friendly cities and spaces."



EMU FORMS A SUPPORT COMMITTEE FOR STUDENTS AND FAMILIES AFFECTED BY THE EARTHQUAKE



In order to ensure the smooth coordination of the requests for support coming from students affected by the recent earthquake, Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Rector's Office has established "EMU Support Committee" under the presidency of Vice Rector for Student Affairs Prof. Dr. Hüseyin Aktuğlu. Deputy Secretary General Kazım Hakverdi and Rıza Çinkılıç, Revolving Fund Operations Director Hasan Kavaz and Coordinator for Vice Rector's Office Afor dministrative and Technical Affairs Mahmut Dağtekin will also be serving in the said committee.

As announced before, EMU has granted tuition fee exemption for the 2022-2023 Academic Year Spring Semester to all students who are from the state of emergency region and who will receive face-to-face education. An online system has been created at EMU so that students from the state of emergency region who will attend face-to-face education can submit their requests for support. Thanks to the online system created, various materials and donations collected from university staff, unions, non-governmental organizations and other donors are being systematically distributed to students. The committee stated that the students who will participate in the face-to-face education can submit their help requests via the online system before they come to the university, so that when they arrive, the coordination of their requests for help with the relevant units will be ensured in advance. Students' requests for psychological support are also directed to the relevant units by the Support Committee.

The committee underlined that in order for the support for students to be coordinated in a healthy way, the students must fill out the Support Request Form available on their own portal accounts.

EMU'S MEANINGFUL CONTRIBUTION TO THE LTB WOMEN'S SHELTER ON 8 MARCH INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Press Executive Board Director Prof. Dr. Şebnem Hoşkara and EMU Center for Women's Studies (EMU CWS) Chair Assoc. EMU CIVIL AVIATION CABIN SERVICES PROGRAM STUDENTS SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETE HANDS ON MOCK-UP AND AIRPORT TRAINING







Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) School of Tourism and Hospitality Management, Civil Aviation Cabin Services Associate Program students successfully completed the "Emergency Mock-up Training" and applied training organized at Pegasus Airlines Training Center in İstanbul and Istanbul Airport, respectively. The mockup training in question which took place at Pegasus Airlines Training Center included topics such as fire extinguishing, use of emergency equipment, emergency scenario training in flight simulator and life-saving in water. During the training series delivered by Pegasus authorities and EMU Civil Aviation Cabin Services Program specialist academic





staff member Aslı Akı, students got the chance to experience emergency situations thanks to the applied practices with the simulators, and the steps to be taken in such events. Within the scope of the training, possible situations that can be experienced in the case of a risk in the sky, a forced landing on the sea or on land were portrayed in simulated aircraft cabins, and what can be done to save the passengers was shown in practice. In the mock-up training, the training of opening and closing the doors on the planes was carried out practically for each student. Students had the chance to experience emergency situations such as fire, discharge of pressure, forced landing, failure of landing gear or

breakage during flight, in realistic simulators. On the other hand, EMU Civil Aviation Cabin Services program students received handson training at different units during their technical visit at Istanbul Airport. Within the scope of their visit, the students had the opportunity to visit the AOCC Control Center, IGA Air Traffic Operation, IGA ATC Tower, IGA Cargo City and Turkish Airlines Cabin Services Building. During their visit, the students examined the central observation point where all operations at the airport are monitored. They met with air traffic controllers and received detailed information about flight traffic, meteorological conditions and other aviation operations and observed the work at the air traffic control tower live. On the other hand, students had the opportunity to experience the standard procedures applied by the cabin crew and the processes pertaining to flight safety by getting information about cargo operations, storage systems and logistics operations. The students, who also had the opportunity to chat with the flight personnel received detailed information about their flights. In a statement on the subject, EMU Tourism Faculty Dean Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç put forth that the hands-on Mock-Up training carried out at the modern training center of Pegasus Airlines has successfully been completed. Prof. Dr. Hasan Kilic emphasized that the students received training through different scenarios against all kinds of emergencies that may occur in the cabin. Prof. Dr. Kılıç added that cabin crew candidates receive practical training in addition to in-class theoretical training in the EMU Civil Aviation and Cabin Services program, and stated that such training ensure the permanence of the knowledge they learn. Also, Prof. Dr. Kılıç highlighted that the students had the opportunity to observe the practices and processes in the aviation industry closely with the technical visits they made at Istanbul Airport. Prof. Dr. Kılıç extended his thanks to EMU Rector's Office, Pegasus Airlines officials, IGA Managers, Turkish Airlines Cabin Services Directorate and Specialist Instructor Aslı AKI for enabling the Mock-Up training to take place. Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç also stressed his belief that students who have gained practical skills along with theoretical knowledge will be the most sought-after and qualified human resources in the civil aviation industry.



EMU FACULTY OF HEALTH SCIENCES ACADEMIC STAFF MEMBER ASSIST. PROF. DR. MÜJGAN ÖZTÜRK RELEASES A STATEMENT ON 9 MARCH WORLD KIDNEY DAY

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Faculty of Health Sciences, Nutrition and Dietetics Department academic staff member Assist. Prof. Dr. Müjgan Öztürk made statements due to '9 March World Kidney Day'. Assist. Assoc. Dr. Öztürk made the following statements in his statement:

"Eat Healthy, Protect Your Kidney"

"The second Thursday of March is observed as 'World Kidney Day' every year, and the purpose of this day is to raise awareness about kidney health and diseases. World Kidney Day's 2023 theme is determined as "Kidney Health for All - Preparing for the Unexpected, Supporting the Vulnerable". The theme focuses on the importance of regional events such as earthquakes, floods, wars, or global events such as COVID-19 that cause loss of life, economic and environmental destruction in societies. and the difficulties experienced by individuals with kidney diseases and chronic diseases in reaching adequate health services, especially in the destruction caused by diseases and disasters.

There are 850 million kidney patients all over the world, and between 5.3 and 10.5 million individuals are in need of dialysis or kidney transplant. Kidney diseases are very common in our country. According to the data of the TRNC Ministry of Health, it is stated that one out of every 10 people in our country has kidney disease, 2100 patients registered in the Nephrology outpatient clinic are monitored, and 50 kidney transplants were performed between 2015-2022.

Nutrition is of great importance both in the prevention and treatment of kidney diseases.

The first step in preventing kidney diseases is to provide variety in our diet and to consume all food groups in a balanced way. Many studies reveal that the consumption of the Mediterranean diet, which is rich in whole grains, olive oil, herbs, vegetables and fruit, fish and legumes, low-fat dairy products, and low in red meat, saturated fat and sugar, is protective against kidney diseases. For this reason, we should make the Mediterranean diet a part of our lives in Cyprus, which is a Mediterranean island.

The main risk factors for kidney diseases include diabetes, hypertension, obesity, cardiovascular diseases and familial kidney diseases. Therefore, it is important for individuals who have any of these diseases to have their kidneys checked regularly and to regulate their diets according to these diseases. Early diagnosis can slow or prevent the progression of kidney disease.

Diabetes is one of the most important leading causes of kidney disease. Therefore, it is very important to keep blood sugar under control. We can achieve this by regulating meal times, choosing fiber-rich foods, consuming enough vegetables at each meal, including whole grains in our diet, and avoiding sugary foods and drinks. Another important point is salt consumption. Reducing daily salt consumption is very important in terms of both balancing blood pressure and reducing the burden of the kidney, whose task is to maintain sodium balance in the body.

Most of the salt we consume comes from the food we buy. For this reason, we should take care to read the labels while shopping,



choose low salt or unsalted products when buying cheese, halloumi and olives, and avoid pickles and pickled foods. Flavoring our meals with seasonings such as spices and lemon instead of salt will also help reduce the amount of salt consumed daily. A regular lifestyle is as necessary to maintain kidney health as nutrition. In this direction, sleeping for 7-8 hours every night, not smoking cigarettes, limiting our alcohol consumption habits, losing excess weight and being physically active are important steps that can be followed in protecting against kidney diseases.
