

In his speech, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Aykut Hocanin emphasized that the loss of the Champion Angels and their teachers had led everyone to an indescribable pain, and stated that EMU would continue to organize such events to keep the memories of Ali Karasel and the Champion Angels alive. Prof. Dr. Hocanin also underlined that EMU would always be a follower of justice, and expressed his gratitude to those who contributed to the organization of the competition. The Ministry of National Education, General Secondary Education Director Cengiz Topel Uzun, stated that mathematics is not very popular in Turkish

society, and emphasized the importance of making math enjoyable. Uzun also highlighted Ali Karasel as one of the teachers who make math enjoyable. Topel stated that these types of competitions help increase self-confidence, and emotional moments were experienced when the commemoration activities and the competition merged. Topel expressed his condolences to the families of those who passed away and congratulated successful students and hardworking teachers, emphasizing that they will continue to support these types of events.

EMU HOSTED A SEMINAR TITLED "THE LOOMING CIVIL WAR IN AMERICA – A GATHERING STORM"

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Cyprus Policy Center (CPC) and the Faculty of Business and Economics, Department of Political Science and International Relations, organized a seminar titled "The Looming Civil War in America – A Gathering Storm."

The opening speech of the seminar was delivered by Prof. Dr. Ahmet Sözen, Chair of the Department of Political Science and International Relations and the CPC. The guest speaker was Graham Day, a former officer in the British and Canadian navies, as well as various international peace-building agencies such as the United Nations. Graham Day started his presentation by explaining that the likelihood of a civil war breaking out in America has become a stronger possibility over time. Day detailed his topic under three subheadings: motives, means, and opportunities. Day conveyed that motives are the driving factors that push people towards engaging in violent conflicts. He pointed out that poverty is often the main reason why individuals join extremist groups. When discussing means, Day explained how

and with what individuals engage in violent conflicts. He described how cyber elements that encourage civil disobedience, the widespread carrying of weapons by individuals, the politicization of income distribution, and the loss of legitimacy in the court system all contribute to the means of conflict

Regarding opportunities, Day stated that they are events that ignite individuals and create the conditions for a civil war. He provided examples of opportunities such as anti-vaccine movements, people angered by excessive responses from law enforcement, and indigenous rights aligning with economic issues, which mobilize people. Finally, Day used the Cynefin Framework to outline five lessons to be learned from the Golden Age of Peacekeeping and discussed the importance of strong leadership, the advantages of having a law and order regime, the need to include political parties, the importance of compromise over economics, and the role of non-kinetic actions in building trust and legitimacy. During the seminar, Graham Day responded to questions



from students, moderated by Prof. Dr. Ahmet Sözen, and discussed potential future scenarios in America. At the end of the seminar, Prof. Dr. Sözen presented Graham Day with a certificate of appreciation.

EMU CIVIL ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT ORGANISED CIVIL ENGINEERING WEEK ACTIVITIES



















Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU), Faculty of Engineering, Department of Civil Engineering, organized the 28th Civil Engineering Week activities, which took place from 15 May to 17 May, 2023. The opening ceremony of the event was held on Monday, 15 May, 2023, at 10:00 am at EMU Department of Civil Engineering. Speaking at the ceremony, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Eriş Uygar, the Chair of the Department of Civil Engineering, stated that the founder of these enjoyable activities, where participants would have a good time, was the late Prof. Dr. Erdil Rıza Tuncer, who served as the Chair of the Department of Civil Engineering at EMU from 1992 to 1994 and later as the Dean of the Faculty of Engineering for approximately 6 years. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Uygar provided information about the department's activities and mentioned that the EMU Department of Civil Engineering boasts prestigious accreditation from the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET), which is one of the leading organizations worldwide that evaluates technology and engineering programs. He also stated that this accreditation has been extended for a period of 6 years. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Uygar announced that the non-thesis Construction Management and Real Estate Master's Program will commence their educational activities next year and that applications for the joint non-thesis Master's Program in Civil Engineering and Materials Engineering with the University of Illinois, Chicago, are now open. Interested individuals can submit their applications via EMU's website.

142 Academic Publications in Respected Journals within the Past 5 Years

Emphasizing the continuous development of the EMU Department of Civil Engineering to meet the needs of the community and students, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Uygar stated that they have measured and reported the seismic resilience of 14 public buildings and numerous private buildings. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Uygar also mentioned the

academic achievements of the department, stating that the faculty members and research assistants of the EMU Department of Civil Engineering have published 142 academic publications in respected journals in the past five years, with an average of two publications per person per year. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Uygar also highlighted the success of EMU Department of Civil Engineering graduates, noting that over 90% of the graduates find employment within six months following their graduation.

"We Are Proud of EMU Department of Civil Engineering"

Prof. Dr. Hüseyin Özkaramanlı, Dean of EMU Faculty of Engineering, expressed his satisfaction with being together with academicians, expert guest speakers in their fields, and talented students. He stated that the Civil Engineering Week activities would broaden the participants' horizons and that the latest developments in the field of civil engineering would be discussed. Prof. Dr. Özkaramanlı mentioned that the EMU Department of Civil Engineering has taken on a significant responsibility in measuring the seismic resilience of public and private buildings in the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC) following the recent earthquake disasters. The second day of the event concluded after the table tennis tournament group matches held at the entrance of the EMU Department of Civil Engineering. On the third day of the event, Wednesday, May 17, 2023, the activities started with a bridge testing activity held on the ground floor of the department at 9:00 am. Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU), Intellectual Property Rights Research and Application Center (FIMAUM), organized a seminar on "Geographical Indication in the Context of Halloumi." This first event following the cooperation protocol signed between EMU FIMAUM and the Turkish Cypriot Chamber of Industry (KTSO) on 2 May, 2023, commenced with an opening speech by Assoc. Prof. Dr. Arzu Alibaba, the Chair of EMU FIMAUM.

In her speech, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Alibaba explained that they have established EMU FIMAUM together with Assoc. Prof. Dr. Hakan Bilgeç and Assist. Prof. Dr. Emine Koçano Rodoslu to ensure the implementation, dissemination, and development of intellectual property rights. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Alibaba stated that they also aim to raise awareness among the relevant sectors of society about the nature, significance, and protection of these rights, thereby fostering the establishment

and advancement of a culture of intellectual and industrial property rights within the community. He also informed the participants about the registration of Halloumi as a Protected Designation of Origin (PDO) within the European Union. Dedicated to Those Facing Pressure and Manipulation



Referring to Gandhi's quote, "An eye for an eye makes the whole world blind," Harman explains that anger does not bring wellness or kindness.
