## RECTOR PROF. DR. KILIÇ RELEASES A STATEMENT ON THE LATEST DEVELOPMENTS IN HIGHER EDUCATION SECTOR

**Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç released a statement on the "Fake Diploma" topic remaining on the agenda in the Higher Education sector. The statement released by Prof. Dr. Kılıç reads as follows:**

"I believe that as the Eastern Mediterranean University, we also have the right to address the 'fake diploma' scandal, which has captured public attention and is eroding the institution's reputation. For a very long time, we have been hearing comments regarding various institutions that provide fake diplomas, especially for postgraduate programs. However, when the situation arises where profit is gained through counterfeit titles, as in the recent incident, the matter is brought within the realm of law and justice due to the commission of multiple offenses.

This incident has shown us the urgent need for stricter inspection mechanisms. The transformation of universities in our country from institutions of higher education and scientific research to business entities is a matter that extends beyond the universities themselves, encompassing the state's policies regarding higher education institutions as well. As the Eastern Mediterranean University and a well-established university, I would like to emphasize that we have directly experienced

the damage caused by such loss of value. The disregard for regulations concerning facilitating the higher education process and granting postgraduate degrees is indicative of an approach that prioritizes quantitative gains over qualitative sensitivity.

Within this unfair competitive environment, Eastern Mediterranean University could not afford to lower its standards and merely exist within the confines of competition. However, we have witnessed the consequences of this in declining student numbers. It is our belief, and as science teaches us, that for universities to establish institutional authority based solely on the number of individuals is contrary to the concept of a university. A system built upon diploma allocation will inevitably weaken ethical sensitivity from within.

We anticipate that improvements will be made to enhance the manageability of the student admission process, facilitate horizontal transfers, and ensure clearer continuity regulations within higher education. Furthermore, it is inevitable that a system will develop to align professional training with the vocational requirements of the country. It seems that reviewing educational policies starting from secondary education and determining administrative status based on merit is the



most crucial task ahead of us. As the Eastern Mediterranean University, we are aware of the matter and are ready for all the efforts to be taken in this regard. Where the concept of 'counterfeit' arises, it is imperative to clearly articulate what the truth is. Knowledge and experience cannot be falsified, but labels can. The necessity of merit stands before us once again as inevitable. Is it difficult to prioritize truth and justice above all else, to be virtuous, to be a morally upright person when we have been experiencing such incidents in the higher education sector that we have nurtured and developed for years? We strongly believe that when quality and right education, responsible citizenship aware of one's duties, and a virtuous understanding that upholds the truth suffer a loss of value, it means we are on the threshold of corruption and moral decline."
