

DR. FAZIL KÜÇÜK MEDICINE FACULTY'S “DENİZ YILDIZI” PROJECT TO BE PUT INTO EFFECT



The “Deniz Yıldızı” (Star Fish) Project carried out by Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Clinical Research and Application Center, in collaborations with EMU Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty, Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC) Ministry of National Health and Ministry of National Education, is being put into effect. A press meeting was organized at EMU Rector’s Office with the participation of TRNC Minister of Health Dr. Hakan Dinçyürek, where detailed information about the project was provided. Held on Friday, 3 May 2024, at 09:00, the said press meeting was attended by EMU Board of Trustees (VYK) President Dr. Erdal Özçenk, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç, Vice Rectors Prof. Dr. Osman M. Karatepe, Prof. Dr. Salih Katircioğlu, Prof. Dr. Ali Öztüren and Prof. Dr. Sonuç Zorlu, Acting Dean of Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty Assist. Prof. Dr. N. İlke Akçay and Project Coordinator Assoc. Prof. Dr. Nilüfer Güzoğlu.

The project involves children who were affected during the pandemic period and today, are in the pre-school and elementary school age group. Within the scope of the project, the growth, psychological development, attention and mobility statuses of the said age group affected from the pandemics will be analyzed. Involving firstly the schools located in Famagusta, the project aims to early diagnose potential health and learning struggles by examining the growth, psychological development, learning, attention and mobility status of the pre-school and elementary school students. Thus, the healthy development and academic success of the students are intended to be supported. Delivering a speech in the said meeting, EMU Rector Prof.

Dr. Hasan Kılıç stated that alongside its academic endeavors, EMU also takes it as a responsibility to serve the needs of the public, emphasizing the importance of “Deniz Yıldızı” Project. Noting that EMU belongs to the community, Prof. Dr. Kılıç expressed that EMU continues to offer its resources in all fields with the aim of benefiting the community.

“EMU is the Success Story of the Country”
TRNC Minister of Health Dr. Hakan Dinçyürek also delivered a speech, expressing that EMU, which he had been a part of for 6 years as a VYK member, is the success story of the country, being the locomotive and the role model of higher education in TRNC. Moreover Dr. Dinçyürek stated that they have been putting their best efforts into protecting the academic reputation of the university and that they intend to keep these efforts in the future. Noting that everyone has taken on the responsibility, especially the state and government, to keep EM on its feet, Minister of Health Dr. Dinçyürek conveyed his belief that, despite all the negativities in the geography, EMU would regain its rapid rise within the shortest time.

Saying that “Deniz Yıldızı” Project is a multidisciplinary project, Dr. Dinçyürek emphasized that many children who spent long periods at home during the COVID period, experiencing minimal interaction with friends and external influences, are now either in pre-school or elementary school age. Moreover, Dr. Dinçyürek mentioned that through the study, they can measure the interaction in environments where social isolation and fear of death during the COVID period have brought changes to

lifestyle. They can also observe and diagnose early any developmental issues, learning skills, excessive mobility, learning disabilities, etc., and if necessary, provide the required treatment.

Minister Dr. Dinçyürek stated that the project will bring great service to the country, highlighting that identifying and treating many undiagnosed problems at an early stage with simple measures can be one of the Ministry’s fundamental duties. Dr. Dinçyürek expressed his belief that the study would serve as a role model for similar projects in this scope and pave the way for future endeavors.

Project Coordinator Assoc. Prof. Dr. Nilüfer Güzoğlu also pointed out that the said project is a multidisciplinary project in the fields of health and education and provided additional information on the technical details of the project. Stating that the project is set to begin with schools in Famagusta, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Güzoğlu added that they aim to examine the general health, psychological well-being and psychological development of the students.

EMU Medicine Faculty Acting Dean Assist. Prof. Dr. Nimet İlke Akçay also made a statement on the topic, expressing that as the EMU Faculty of Medicine, education research and serving the public is within their mission and that the project in question is to serve the members of the community. Assist. Prof. Dr. Akçay stated that within the scope of the project, a detailed examination will be conducted among elementary and pre-school students to detect problems through early diagnosis methods and intervene where necessary.

POSITIVE YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM LAUNCHED FORTH IN COORDINATION OF DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY



Initiated as a TUBITAK project by one of the most active psychologists in the world, late Prof. Dr. Çiğdem Kağıtçıbaşı, shortly before her passing and, successfully continued to be carried out by her team members, the Positive Youth Development (PERGEL) program has been launched forth for the first-time outside of Turkey, in the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC). As a result of the PERGEL trainings conducted in last January with the coordination of Eastern Mediterranean University, Faculty of Arts and Sciences, Chair of Psychology Department Prof. Dr. Fatih Bayraktar,

academic personnel members Assist. Prof. Dr. Dilek Çelik and Assist. Prof. Dr. Şerif Türkkal Yeniğüç, total of 17 Specialist Psychologists and Specialist Counselling Psychologists qualified to receive the title of PERSEL Trainer. In this context, in April, PERGEL program has been started to be implemented in schools especially located in Famagusta which is the district most affected by the Kahramanmaraş-centered earthquake disaster. Applications began in Famagusta Turkish Maarif College, Çanakkale Secondary School and Canbulat Secondary School as well as SOS Children's Village.

The weekly supervision meetings funded by Cyprus Turkish Education Foundation (KTEV) continues to be held every Friday at 01:00 p.m.

In this context, especially in Gazimağusa, which is the district most affected by the earthquakes centered in Kahramanmaraş, applications began in April at Gazimağusa Turkish Maarif College, Çanakkale Middle School, and Canbulat Middle School, as well as at the SOS Children's Village. Weekly supervision meetings, supported by the Cyprus Turkish Education Foundation, are systematically held every Friday at 13:00.

Making a statement on the topic, Chair of EMU Department of Psychology Prof. Dr. Fatih Bayraktar said: "We are happy and proud to have brought the PERGEL program to the TRNC through the collaboration of academia, non-governmental organizations, and municipalities in Turkey, which has been successfully implemented for years. Currently, the applications being conducted in four separate centers will continue until mid-July. These applications mark a beginning, and in the coming years, we will continue to implement PERGEL for both adolescents and parents".

The 11th edition of the “International Design Week” (INT-DW) organized annually by the Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Faculty of Architecture began with an opening ceremony held on Monday, 6 May, 2024 at the Faculty of Architecture. Moreover, ISVEA Student Competition with the theme of “Symbiotic Colors of the Mediterranean” will be held within the scope of the design week.



“DYNAMICAL BLACK HOLES: GRAVITATIONAL COLLAPSE, SHADOW AND HORIZONS” SEMINAR HELD AT DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICS



Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU), Faculty of Arts and Sciences, Department of Physics organized a seminar titled “Dynamical Black Holes: Gravitational Collapse, Shadow and Horizons” in ASG14 room located at EMU Faculty of Arts and Sciences. Prof. Dr. Vitalii Vertogradov from Herzen Russian State Pedagogical University presented extensive information on the dynamic structures of black holes and

their roles in the universe. Visiting EMU to give a seminar upon the invitation of EMU Department of Physics academic staff member Assoc. Prof. Dr. Ali Övgün, Prof. Dr. Vitalii Vertogradov explained the formation process of black holes, the gravitational force surrounding these holes and the impact of these processes on the universe. Prof. Dr. Vertogradov said: “Shadows provide insight on the dimension, shape and rotating rate of

black holes helping the astrophysicists to get a better understanding on these mysterious formations”. In his presentation, especially focusing on the “shadows” of the black holes, Prof. Dr. Vertogradov demonstrated how the light around black holes bends, causing the formation of shadows, using mathematical physics methods.

The Chair of the EMU Departments of Physics and Chemistry Prof. Dr. İzzet Sakallı, Department of Physics academic staff members, Distinguished Professor Prof. Dr. Mustafa Halilsoy, Assist. Prof. Dr. Mustafa Rıza, Assist. Prof. Dr. Huriye Gürsel Mangut, Vice Chair of Department of Chemistry Prof. Dr. Mustafa Gazi, many academicians, research assistants and students attended the seminar where the “horizons” of the black holes, in other terms the event horizons were discussed. The seminar emphasized that beyond the event horizon, at a point where gravity is so strong that nothing, not even light, can escape. The detailed examination of this region allowed participants in the seminar to better understand the conditions that challenge the general theory of relativity’s boundaries.

Bringing the EMU academicians, undergraduate and graduate students of the Department of Physics and, individuals who are keen on astrophysics together, the seminar holds great importance on discussing the latest observations and literature information and gaining a better understanding of the role black holes play as universal mergers.

'20 TEMMUZ HIGH SCHOOL' COMPLETES THE SEMI-FINAL ROUND OF EMU 28TH HIGH SCHOOL MATHEMATICS COMPETITION IN FIRST PLACE

“POST-TRUTH POLITICS IN THE AGE OF POPULISM: INSIGHTS FROM THE 2023 TURKISH ELECTION” SEMINAR HELD AT EMU



A seminar titled “Post-truth Politics in the Age of Populism: Insights from the 2023 Turkish Election” was held in collaboration with Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU), Cyprus Policy Center (CPC) and, Business and Economics Faculty, Political Science and International Relations Department. The opening speech of the seminar was delivered by EMU Department of International Relations doctoral student and CPC research assistant Hatice Savoğlu, on the other hand, EMU research assistant and doctoral student candidate Oğuz Ufuk Haksever attended the event as a speaker. Haksever commenced

his presentation by explaining the meaning of post-truth politics. Referring to his article titled “The Instrumentalization of the Post-truth Politics in Turkey: The Case of 2023 Elections” co-written by Prof. Dr. Ahmet Sözen, Haksever conceptualized the post-truth politics into four elements; disinformation, emotion, confirmation bias and depolarization in societies. Haksever attributed the unique success of AKP government to the use of post-truth politics, which involves creating an alternative reality to discredit the opposition. According to Haksever, the success of the AKP depended not only on the number

of voters but also on their ability to control the opposition’s campaign. Haksever concluded the seminar by providing examples of the four factors he mentioned and drew attention to areas where further research could be conducted on post-truth politics and populism. Upon the comments and questions asked during the interactive seminar moderated by CPC research assistant Hatice Savoğlu, Oğuz Ufuk Haksever discussed factors that distinguish reality from post-truth, stating that he would continue his research by examining other similar examples of populism and post-truth politics.

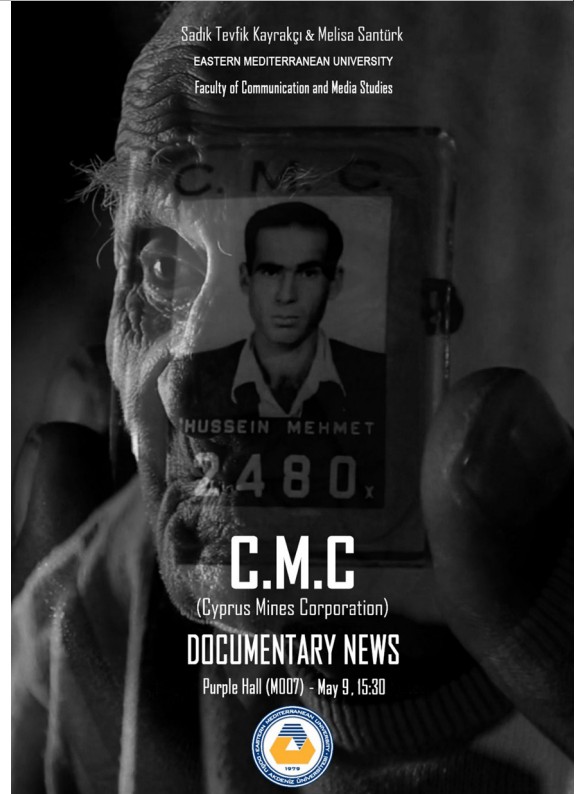
On the other hand, Onalt Group Director Halil Onalt expressed that they will continue their efforts to beautify all schools in the TRNC and to build a better future for children.
