Following the observance of a moment of silence and the national anthem, Co-Chair of the Organizing Committee and Faculty Member at the EMU Department of Business Administration Prof. Dr. Deniz İşçioğlu delivered the opening speech of the event, and recounted a personal memory from the workshop’s organizing process, sharing that Prof. Dr. Ruşen Keleş and the poet Cemal Süreya were classmates at the Faculty of Political Science, from which Prof. Dr. İşçioğlu also graduated. Reflecting on the event, she expressed, “It was a dream for me, and it has come true”, and conveyed her thanks to all who contributed.

A First in TRNC

EMU Faculty of Education Dean and Co-Chair of the Workshop Organizing Committee Prof. Dr. Pehlivan began his speech by thanking the participants, guests, and everyone involved in organizing the event. Highlighting that the workshop was a first in the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus and drawing attention to the significant role of Cemal Süreya in the Turkish Cypriot community, Prof. Dr. Pehlivan underscored the special place of poets from the Faculty of Political Science in Turkish literature and stated that the phrase “Poetry is contrary to the constitution” reflected Cemal Süreya and his colleagues’ dedication to independence and freedom in their work. Concluding his speech, Prof. Dr. Pehlivan honored Cemal Süreya with deep respect.

An Esteemed Institution that Educates Both Artists and Politicians

Member of the Organizing Committee and Chair of the

Cyprus Mülkiye Association Ümit Gürtekin expressed her enthusiasm for discussing Cemal Süreya in an academic context and stressed the considerable effort invested in the project. Gürtekin also highlighted that the Faculty of Political Science is an esteemed institution that fosters both artists and politicians. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Can Giray Özgül, Vice Dean of the Faculty of Political Science at Ankara University, then mentioned that the faculty is celebrating its 165th anniversary, pointing out that the faculty has contributed numerous valuable individuals to the state, and its core focus has always been the public interest. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Özgül also highlighted that many Cypriot graduates of the faculty have worked for the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus and that this sense of awareness has been passed down through generations.

Late Çağiner to be Remember at a Special Commemoration

Addressing the participants during the opening speeches, Tangül Ünal Çağiner Children’s Foundation Chair Dr. İçim Çağiner Kavuklu conveyed their pride on being a part of this special event and stated that her late father Çağiner, who was also from the Mülkiye, would be commemorated on the second day of the event, during a special ceremony. Dr. Kavuklu underscored that being a member Mülkiye meant a lot for her late father and expressed her pleasure that the event would also approach art along with politics.

Workshop to Enhance Interest towards Cemal Süreya’s World of Thought and Literature

In his remarks, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Kılıç highlighted that the two-day workshop would center on Cemal Süreya, one of the most influential figures in Turkish poetry. Prof. Dr. Kılıç noted that Süreya had been an active figure in both politics and social issues and expressed his confidence that the workshop would spark greater interest in Süreya’s intellectual contributions and literary works. Prof. Dr. Kılıç further explained that the event would provide a wider perspective on how art and politics are interconnected and mutually enriching. Furthermore, Prof. Dr. Kılıç emphasized that, in addition to its commitment to offering high-quality education on an international scale, EMU strongly values and supports artistic and cultural activities that foster societal awareness.

Arts and Politics – Two Powerful Domains Centered on Humanity

EMU VYK President Dr. Özçenk underlined that Cemal Süreya was a poet who breathed life into words and infused them with emotion, pointing out that his poetry addresses numerous questions concerning society, humanity, and the human experience. Dr. Özçenk also noted that for Süreya, poetry represented a form of resistance and emphasized that both art and politics are powerful domains centered on the human being. Dr. Özçenk asserted that educational institutions have the duty to pass on the universal messages of art to future generations, concluding with the statement, “As long as societies continue to hear the voices of their poets, they can preserve their soul and identity”.

Got a Hand on Different Segments in the Society

Talking at the beginning of the event, Sibel Tatar, spouse of TRNC President Ersin Tatar, underscored the importance of culture and arts by saying: “Protecting culture and supporting our poets, writers, and artists is a legacy left to us by Atatürk”. Stating that Cemal Süreya’s poems has got a hand on different segments in the society, Tatar expressed her gratitude to those who have contributed to the actualization of the event. Workshop continued with the speech of the Honorary Chair of the workshop Prof. Dr. Ruşen Keleş. Mentioning that she

started her education in 1950 alongside Cemal Süreya, Prof. Dr. Keleş went on to share the story of how she met Süreya and reflected on their shared memories. Prof. Dr. Keleş pointed out that there were many poets from the Faculty of Political Science and provided the audience with a wealth of information about Cemal Süreya’s life. Prof. Dr. Keleş also mentioned that, during their third year, Süreya, former Balıkesir MP Necat Tunçşiper, and poet Sezai Karakoç were involved in the publication of the Mülkiye Journal.

Following Prof. Dr. Keleş’s speech, EMU VYK President Dr. Özçenk and EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Kılıç presented appreciation plaques to Prof. Dr. Ruşen Keleş, Dr. İçim Çağiner Kavuklu, Ümit Gürtekin, Prof. Dr. Oğuz Karakartal and Assoc. Prof. Dr. Can Giray Özgül for their valuable contributions to the workshop.

Then, a musical tribute in honor of Cemal Süreya was performed by Assist. Prof. Dr. Atakan Sarı and Instructor Erkan Dağlı from the Department of Fine Arts Education, Music Teaching Program at EMU Faculty of Education. The first session of the workshop, titled “The Political Poet Cemal Süreya” was held under the chairmanship of Prof. Dr. Ruşen Keleş. The session featured presentations by Assoc. Prof. Dr. Can Giray Özgül, Prof. Dr. Ali Cengizkan, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Burak Erkut, Prof. Dr. Deniz İşçioğlu, and Ali Can Türkoğlu.

The second session chaired by Prof. Dr. Deniz İşçioğlu featured extensive presentations delivered on Cemal Süreya’s literature and world of arts by Prof. Dr. Ayşe Çakır İlhan, Prof. Dr. Müge Artar and Assoc. Prof. Dr. Hasibe Şahoğlu. Furthermore, the third session of the event, chaired by Prof. Dr. Oğuz Karakartal, featured analysis of Haydar Ergülen, Prof. Dr. Baki Asiltürk, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Yalçın Armağan and Assoc. Prof. Dr. Erol Köroğlu on poems and prose of the famous poet.

The workshop continued on 11 January 2025 with a fourth session held at 10.00 a.m. with an opening speech delivered by Prof. Dr. Ahmet Pehlivan followed by poem recitals.

Commemoration Meeting for Mülkiyeli Ünal Çağiner

RENOWNED SWEDISH PHYSICIST ASSOC. PROF. DR. MAHNUS PAULSSON GIVES A SEMINAR ON NANOTECHNOLOGY AND QUANTUM PHYSICS



Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU), Faculty of Arts and Sciences, Department of Physics hosted world-renowned Swedish Physicist Assoc. Prof. Dr. Magnus Paulsson within the scope of a very important event held on Physics. Carrying out his research at the Linnaeus University, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Paulsson gathered with students from EMU and delivered a seminar titled "Electronics at the Atomic and Molecular Scale" on Tuesday, 7 January 2025 at 02:30 p.m.

In his presentation, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Paulsson focused on the crucial role of nanotechnology and quantum physics in chip production, providing insights on theoretical models of electron transfer in nanostructures and his studies in the field of molecular electronics. The presentation, showcasing examples of how his research on nanoscale electrical conductivity has contributed to advanced technological applications, garnered

significant attention from academics and those interested in the subject.

The said seminar was attended by the Head of EMU Departments of Physics and Chemistry Prof. Dr. İzzet Sakallı, EMU's globally known academic Prof. Dr. Mustafa Halilsoy, Vice Head of the Department of Physics Prof. Dr. Seydedhabillah Mazharimousavi, Vice Head of Department of Chemistry Prof. Dr. Mustafa Gazi, academics from the Department of Physics and Chemistry, undergraduate, postgraduate and PhD students, and many members of the society.

Serving as an example for EMU's contributions to science, the said seminar provided the participants with new perspectives and formed an important platform for scientific communication. At the end of the seminar, Head of Departments of Physics and Chemistry Prof. Dr. Sakallı presented Assoc.

Prof. Dr. Paulsson an appreciation plaque on behalf of EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç.

Who is Assoc. Prof. Dr. Magnus Paulsson?

Assoc. Prof. Dr. Magnus Paulsson is a theoretical physics expert at Linnaeus University in Sweden. He has made notable contributions to understanding electron transport in nanostructures, molecular electronics, and nanoscale electrical conductivity. Over his academic career, he has authored numerous papers in renowned journals like Physical Review B and Nano Letters, with his work garnering more than 6,000 citations. Paulsson teaches courses such as Mechanics, Computational Physics I & II, and Density Functional Theory, and plays an active role in the scientific community as a member of the Condensed Matter Physics research group.

Historical Heritage of Famagusta Highlighted

As part of their semester projects, the students created two or three dimensional silhouettes of 10 structures which hold special significance for the city of Famagusta. On behalf of Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Atatürk Research and Application Center (ATAUM), Prof. Dr. Osman M. Karatepe released a message on passing anniversary of Rauf Raif Denktaş, the founding President of the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC). The said message reads as follows:

Republic of Türkiye, stands as clear evidence of his leadership and dedication. Delivering his first address to the public at the age of 24, Rauf Raif Denktaş later served as the President of the Cyprus Turkish

Federation of Institutions. He was instrumental in guiding the Turkish Cypriots in their resistance against Enosis and EOKA, and was one of the founders of the Turkish Resistance Organization, a key force in this struggle. Following the 1963 events, Denktaş organized the Turkish resistance, secretly travelled to Erenköy to participate in the Erenköy Resistance, and after leading the Cyprus Turkish Administration, he assumed the roles of President of the Cyprus Turkish Federal State and President of the Assembly on 13 February 1975, following the 1974 Peace Operation. Ultimately, on 15 November 1983, he became the first President of the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus. Throughout his life, he played a vital role in numerous significant historical events crucial to the Turkish Cypriot community.

Rauf Raif Denktaş became an international figure through his political role in the founding of the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus. His contributions to the Cyprus issue in 20th-century politics also established him as an important leader. On the 13th anniversary of the passing of our founding President, the late Rauf Raif Denktaş, we honour his memory with love, respect, longing, and gratitude.”

PROF. DR. OSMAN M. KARATEPE RELEASES A MESSAGE ON BEHALF OF EMU-ATAUM ON PASSING ANNIVERSARY OF DR. FAZIL KÜÇÜK

On behalf of Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Atatürk Research and Application Center (ATAUM), Prof. Dr. Osman M. Karatepe released a message on 41st passing anniversary of Dr. Fazıl Küçük, the leader of the Struggle for Freedom of Turkish Cypriots. The said message reads as follows:

“Dr. Fazıl Küçük, a pivotal figure who devoted his life to safeguarding the existence of the Turkish Cypriots, stands as a distinguished statesman with a significant role in the history of the Turkish Cypriot struggle.

In addition to being a doctor who offered free consultations every Friday at his private clinic to patients from villages and districts, Dr. Fazıl Küçük made substantial efforts to educate and organize the public. Through his articles in various newspapers, especially in ‘Halkın Sesi’, he played an instrumental role in uniting the Turkish Cypriot community. As a strong advocate for the rights of Turkish Cypriots, Dr. Küçük effectively opposed British colonial rule. He worked tirelessly to transfer Turkish

educational institutions and the administration of the Waqf to the Turkish community, achieving success and igniting the initial spark of national awareness that would later evolve into a broader

movement. Dr. Küçük founded ‘Volkan’, the first resistance organization, led Turkish Cypriots in their struggle against Enosis and EOKA, and was one of the founders of the Turkish Resistance

Organization (TMT), a key force in the resistance. He also established several political parties, became the first Turkish leader to be elected Vice President in the 1960 Republic of Cyprus, organized Turkish resistance following the 1963 events, and was appointed head of the Temporary Turkish Administration. His contributions were critical in many historically significant events for the Turkish Cypriot people.

Throughout his life, Dr. Küçük devoted himself to finding solutions to the political, social, economic, and cultural issues of the Turkish Cypriot community. He enthusiastically embraced the declaration of the TRNC, but tragically passed away on 15 January 1984, shortly afterward. On the 41st anniversary of his passing, we honour his memory with deep respect, love, and gratitude.”
