EMU LISTED AS THE TOP OF CYPRUS

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) achieved a phenomenal success in Nature Index, one of the most prestigious academic ranking platforms worldwide. According to the 2025 data, EMU secured the top position across Cyprus with a contribution score (Share) of 7.21. This outstanding performance was primarily attributed to the influential scientific research outputs from EMU Department of Physics within the Faculty of Arts and Sciences.

A majority of EMU's contribution score came from studies published in prominent international journals such as European Physical Journal C and Journal of High Energy Physics. Research in the fields of advanced physics, such as quantum gravity, black hole physics, and high-energy theories, has significantly boosted the university's output in basic sciences and increased its international prominence.

The studies conducted by Prof. Dr. İzzet Sakallı, the Chair of EMU Departments of Physics and Chemistry; Prof. Dr. Habib Mazharimousavi, the Vice Chair of the Department; and Department academic staff members Prof. Dr. Omar Mustafa and Assoc. Prof. Dr. Ali Övgün, exemplified EMU's dedication to scientific excellence.

"One of the Most Prolific and Impactful Physics Research Centers in the Region" A statement released by the Dean of EMU Faculty of Arts and Sciences Prof. Dr. Mehmet Ali Özarslan, read; "This accomplishment reaffirms EMU's Department of Physics as one of the most prolific and impactful physics research centers, not just in Cyprus but across the wider region. Leading the Nature Index rankings has reinforced the university's reputation within the global research

Leading the Nature Index is a proud moment not only for our academic community but for all of Cyprus. Our institution remains committed to progressing steadily towards scientific excellence in the years ahead".

What is Nature Index?

Launched in 2014 by Nature Portfolio, the Nature Index is a scientific ranking system that measures the high-impact publication output of universities and research centers. It evaluates articles published in disciplines such as life sciences, earth sciences, and health sciences, focusing on both the quality and influence of the research. The rankings are based not only on publication counts but also on the weighted contributions (Share) to those publications.

By 2023, the index encompassed 146 journals, including some of the most esteemed titles globally, such as Nature, Science, Cell, Physical Review Letters, and Journal of High Energy Physics. It serves as a key reference point for assessing academic excellence worldwide.

AZERBAIJAN HEDEF GROUP VISITS EMU

a significant strategic vision for EMU and noted that this cooperation holds particular importance for the broader Turkic world. He expressed confidence that the relationship is grounded in mutual trust and strong foundations. Highlighting the value the university places on student exchange programs and outreach efforts, Prof. Dr. Kılıç pointed out that academic mobility plays a key role in helping students engage with different cultures and expand their worldviews. Reaffirming EMU's commitment to international student diversity, he added that the university will continue to advance its work in this area.

Also making an address during the visit, Founding Chair of the Azerbaijan Hedef Group Assoc. Prof. Dr. Şamil Sadık noted that the relations between Azerbaijan and the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus dates back 15 years. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Sadık said; "Building economic strength, particularly through education, alongside cultural and political influence is very important. Entering into a potential agreement with EMU would be a great pride for us". Stressing that education is a continuously evolving field, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Sadık introduced the delegation accompanying him and expressed that forming a partnership with EMU would be a meaningful development for Azerbaijan.

The visit concluded with an exchange of souvenirs and a photo shoot.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING SIGNED BETWEEN EMU AND ANADOLU UNIVERSITY













Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) and Anadolu University (AU) signed a memorandum of understanding to enhance the academic collaboration between the two institutions. The agreement was signed by EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç and AU Rector Prof. Dr. Yusuf Adıgüzel during a ceremony held at Avrupa University Rector's Office Senate Hall.

Present during the signing session were; AU Vice Rector Prof. Dr. Serpil Koçdar, AU Faculty of Communication Sciences academic Prof. Dr. Murat Barkan and Director of AU International Relations Unit Dr. Zekiye Doğan.

The signed agreement outlines efforts to promote and encourage both short- and long-term exchange programs for academic staff and students. It also includes provisions for the mutual support of participation in various academic activities such as courses, conferences, symposium, and workshops. Furthermore, the agreement encompasses commitments to enhancing the exchange of knowledge and experience, fostering collaborative research and joint projects, and sharing information related to teaching and learning practices.

"To Strengthen the Exchange of Knowledge and Experience"

Speaking after the ceremony, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç emphasized that the collaboration would bring significant benefits not only to the institutions involved but also to the broader academic community. Prof. Dr. Kılıç stated, "The protocol we have signed with Anadolu University will strengthen the exchange of knowledge and experience, and open new horizons in research, education, and student activity."

Also making comments on the topic, AU Rector Prof. Dr. Yusuf Adıgüzel highlighted that the cooperation protocol signed with EMU marks a key step in reinforcing collaboration in academic and scientific domains. EMU SETS A FIRST IN THE TURKISH REPUBLIC OF NORTHERN CYPRUS

YÖK APPROVED ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE ENGINEERING PROGRAM

In line with its commitment to pioneering technological advancements, Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) has reached another important achievement. The Artificial Intelligence Engineering undergraduate program, established within EMU Faculty of Engineering, Department of Computer Engineering, has received official accreditation from the Turkish Higher Education Council (YÖK), making it the first of its kind in the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus. This accreditation also makes EMU the sole institution in Northern Cyprus to offer a YÖKapproved Artificial Intelligence Engineering degree.

Training Aligned with the Needs of the Sector

As artificial intelligence technologies increasingly transform sectors like healthcare, transportation, finance, and defence, EMU is pushing forward its educational vision in this field. The program, led by EMU Faculty of Engineering, integrates theoretical knowledge with hands-on experience to prepare skilled engineers equipped to fulfil the sector's growing needs.

Practical Training with Artificial Intelligence Laboratory

Within the framework of the program, the Artificial Intelligence Laboratory built within the body of EMU has been equipped with cutting-edge high-performance computers, thanks to the support of the EMU Rector's

Office. This facility will enable students to engage in hands-on projects covering fields like machine learning, deep learning, natural language processing, and robotics.

Internationally Recognized Diploma

With YÖK accreditation, graduates of the Artificial Intelligence Engineering Program will earn diplomas that hold international recognition. The program is open to both local and international students and incorporates interdisciplinary elements such as ethics and social responsibility into its curriculum alongside engineering studies.

Up-to-Date Curriculum That Prepares for Future

The 4-year long undergraduate program combines different fields such as computer engineering, mathematics, statistics and ethics. The curriculum focuses on topics including deep learning, image processing, natural language processing, artificial nerve networks, mass data analysis and robotic systems. Furthermore, the program prepares students for professional life through a mandatory Final Project and internship experience prior to graduation.

Application Period Continues

Citizens of the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus and international students can submit applications for the Artificial Intelligence Engineering Program via https://www.emu. edu.tr address. On the other hand, Republic of Türkiye citizens can enrol to the said program through ÖSYM placement system. For the 2025-2026 Academic Year, YÖK has allocated a quota of 60 people.

EMU Rector and Faculty of Engineering Made Remarks

Head of the EMU Department of Computer Engineering Prof. Dr. Zeki Bayram made remarks on the topic, saying; "It is a notable development that our Artificial Intelligence undergraduate program, which started enrolling students in the Fall 2023 semester with YÖDAK approval, has now also obtained YÖK accreditation. This accreditation confirms the quality of education we provide and assures our students that their diplomas will be recognized internationally, allowing them to pursue their studies with confidence".

Dean of EMU Faculty of Engineering Prof. Dr. Hüseyin Özkaramanlı said; "This program is not just an undergraduate program, it is also a vision for raising individuals who would contribute to the future of artificial intelligence".

Lastly, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç addressed the topic and said; "Delivering top-tier education in Artificial Intelligence depends on both a robust academic program and advanced technological resources. In this context, we are proud to provide our students with a globally competitive learning environment".





DUAL POSTGRADUATE DEGREE PROGRAM TO BE

CARRIED OUT BETWEEN EMU AND UPPA UNIVERSITY
WILL START STUDENT ADMISSIONS

Within the scope of the collaboration protocol run between the Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) and Pau et Pays de L'Adour University (UPPA), dual "Mathematics" master's program, carried out by EMU Faculty of Arts and Sciences, Department of Mathematics' "Mathematics" master's program and Pau et Pays de L'Adour University's "Mathematical Modelling and Simulation" master's program, will commence admitting students.

Through this program, students who meet the academic requirements of both institutions will graduate with individual master's degrees from each university. During their studies, they will attend courses at both universities at different stages, allowing them to gain a diverse and enriching academic and cultural experience. The initial phase of the program will take place at EMU, after which students will complete their remaining studies at UPPA in France and graduate.

EMU Faculty of Arts and Sciences Dean, Prof. Dr. Mehmet Ali Özarslan, emphasized that the

dual degree program—developed through the collaboration of two Mathematics Departments recognized by global ranking organizations like Times Higher Education (THE)—will offer students a strong academic background. Moreover, Prof. Dr. Özarslan noted that the program not only allows students to experience diverse educational systems and engage with international academic communities, but also equips them with the skills needed to compete on a global level. Prof. Dr. Özarslan further highlighted the importance of combining the academic perspectives of two countries within a universal discipline like mathematics, offering students a highly valuable learning experience.

Prof. Dr. Ali Hakan Ulusoy, Director of the EMU Institute for Graduate Studies and Research stated that the dual diploma programs are a reflection of university's internationalization vision in postgraduate studies, saying; "While contributing to the academic studies of our students, such collaborations also significantly contribute their cultural and professional development. As EMU, we remain committed to increasing scientific

productivity and, raising graduates who are individuals ready for global competition".

EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç highlighted that international collaborations significantly contribute to the university's global academic presence and affirmed that dual degree programs reflect EMU's academic excellence. He noted that through strong partnerships with prestigious universities worldwide, EMU offers students the opportunity to receive an education that transcends borders. Prof. Dr. Kılıç also expressed confidence that the newly initiated dual master's program between EMU and UPPA will enhance the university's scientific output, and underscored their commitment to supporting students as they pursue a globally connected academic path.

TOLES EXAMINATION WAS HELD AT THE EMU FACULTY OF LAW

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU)
Faculty of Law successfully held the 2024-2025
Academic Year Spring Semester TOLES (Test of Legal English Skills) examination. The exam, which was organized in collaborations with EMU Continuous Education Center (EMU-CEC), EMU Foreign Languages and English Preparatory School (FLEPS) and Faculty of Law, was attended by total of 27 people.

Prior to the UK-based TOLES exam that evaluates professional proficiency in Legal English, two candidates shared their experiences regarding the exam and training process.

Damla Davarcı, an EMU Law Faculty graduate currently practicing law in Bursa, and Arzu Alp, a graduate of EMU Faculty of Arts and Sciences, Department of English Translation and Interpreting, both spoke in an interview about how the TOLES training positively impacted their professional growth. They also expressed their appreciation for the comprehensive and professional preparation offered by EMU.

"While Opening Doors Abroad, TOLES also contributes to Personal Development"

Damla Davarcı, one of the candidates taking the TOLES exam, emphasized the importance of proficiency in legal English for a successful professional career. Currently working at her father's law firm, Davarcı highlighted how valuable the TOLES training has been, especially when handling translations for international cases. Davarcı viewed the TOLES exam not just as an assessment tool but as an investment in the future, noting, "Many legal professionals in Türkiye lack knowledge of legal English, which causes significant problems. TOLES not only opens



doors abroad but also contributes to personal development." She strongly recommended that law students participate in TOLES program, stating, "This program will make a difference in your career. With the support of our instructors, invest in yourself and your future".

"Holds Great Importance in terms of Professional Competency"

Another candidate, Arzu Alp, viewed the process as a crucial step in both her academic and professional growth. She explained that her motivation for taking the exam was to validate her academic skills and acquire an internationally recognized certificate, which she believes will be highly beneficial. Alp highlighted that mastering legal English at a professional level has enhanced her ability to comprehend and interpret documents more effectively, making her professional life easier. She stressed that TOLES is important not only for language development but also for demonstrating professional proficiency. Alp noted, "This exam builds your confidence and proves useful in any other tests

you undertake," emphasizing the broad benefits of the TOLES qualification.

Vice Deans of EMU Faculty of Law Assoc. Prof. Dr. Demet Çelik Ulusoy and Assist. Prof. Dr. Emine Koçano Rodoslu, exam invigilator and EMU Foreign Languages Unit academic staff member Aslı Gönenç and, TOLES Program – TOLES Exams Coordinator academic staff member Peril S. Emiroğluları were present on the exam day. Prior to the exam, a commemorative photo was taken with participants and academics.

EMU Faculty of Law has been organizing the TOLES Exam since 2012, offering access to an internationally recognized certificate for graduates and professionals who actively work in the field of law.

The session highlighted the critical need to support individuals with developmental disabilities, focusing on ensuring their privacy, security, and overall well-being.

Attending educators shared their contentment on participating at the said event and, noted that such seminars contribute their professional development.

ECOLOGICAL JUSTICE DISCUSSED AT EMU FACULTY OF COMMUNICATION

He is the founder of the nature-oriented online publication yesilkibris.org, has supported the creation of ecology-focused educational curricula, and has been instrumental in the founding of several environmental initiatives.

EMU-SAGAM CHAIR ASSIST. PROF. DR. BURAK ALİ ÇİÇEK ISSUES A STATEMENT REGARDING THE STRAY DO GS ENCOUNTERED AT THE BEACHES

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU)
Faculty of Arts and Sciences, Biological Sciences
Department Head and EMU Underwater Research
and Imaging Center (SAGAM) Chair Assist. Prof.
Dr. Burak Ali Çiçek issued a statement regarding
the stray dogs encountered at the beaches which
cause great threat against sea turtles. The statement
reads as follows:

"Stray Dogs Cause Harms to Natural Life"

Sea turtles that nest on our beaches are key representatives of our island's rich biodiversity and serve as important symbols. They are valuable not only for maintaining ecological balance but also for their economic contribution through eco-tourism.



However, there are various challenges we must address to ensure their protection.

A major threat we have been facing recently, particularly in the İskele - Gazimağusa area, comes from stray dogs. While cages are used to protect the nests, adult female turtles have still been attacked and killed. In fact, eight female turtles have been killed by dogs along the İskele - Gazimağusa shores this year.

Many of the stray dogs are hunting or commercially valuable breeds. This issue stems from people abandoning their pets when they no longer want to care for them. Owners who do not fully understand



the responsibilities of pet ownership often abandon their animals, which harms the well-being of the animals and endangers the natural ecosystem.

The attempts by the relevant institutions to capture and transfer the dogs to shelters have been inadequate. Without a prompt resolution, the likelihood that the soon-to-emerge hatchlings will successfully make it to the sea is very slim.

The Veterinary Department, working together with local municipalities, is setting up shelters and moving stray dogs into these centers to tackle the issue. Nonetheless, simply constructing shelters is insufficient. Releasing street animals back into nature is not a genuine act of 'kindness'.

We call on all animal rights groups and dog enthusiasts to support the immediate removal of these dogs from the area and to aid in their adoption. It is crucial to report those who abandon their dogs on the streets to the authorities. Furthermore, pet adoption regulations should be revised to prioritize animal welfare, with proper identification for animals and the implementation of rigorous monitoring systems."

PROF. DR. OSMAN M. KARATEPE RELEASED A MESSAGE ON BEHALF OF EMU-ATAUM ON THE 50TH ANNIVERSARY OF 20 JULY PEACE AND FREEDOM DAY

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU), Vice Rector for Academic Affairs Prof. Dr. Osman M. Karatepe released a message on behalf of EMU Atatürk Research and Application Center (EMU-ATAUM) on the 51st anniversary of 20 July Peace and Freedom Day. The message released by Prof. Dr. Karatepe reads as follows:

"The 20th of July holds a great importance in the Turkish Cypriot history. This date signifies the foundation of the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC), ensuring the safety of the Turkish Cypriot people and achieving their prosperity and freedom.

The social conflicts between the Turkish Cypriot and Greek Cypriot communities started in 1955 with EOKA's dreadful actions against the Turks. From then on, EOKA actively pursued the organization of Enosis and a 19-year struggle commencing at night of 1 April 1955 and continuing until 20 July 1974 began. From 1955 to 1974, the Turkish Cypriot community faced intense struggles in all areas. In this difficult chapter of history, the dedication and steadfast support of Dr. Fazil Küçük, the leader of the Turkish Cypriot community, stand out as profoundly important and will remain etched in collective memory.

On 15 July, 1974, after the Greek Junta's coup against Makarios, Turkey, one of the guarantor powers, was forced to take military action on the



island. Prime Minister Bülent Ecevit was given full authority to implement all necessary measures for the nation's interests and safety. Ecevit publicly stated that the operation was aimed "not at war, but at peace; not only to bring peace to the Turks but also to the Greeks", thereby marking the beginning of the operation. Consequently, based on Article 4 of the London Agreement, the Cyprus Peace Operation was launched on 20 July, 1974.

The goal of the operation was to safeguard the Turkish Cypriot community and restore constitutional order on the island. Rauf Raif Denktaş, then President of the Turkish Cypriot Administration, informed the public with the announcement: "Today, at this very moment,

the brave Turkish Armed Forces are conducting landings across Cyprus from both air and sea. May your victory be joyous".

From that date forward, the effort to secure the existence of the Turkish Cypriot people was successfully achieved. The Turkish Federated State of Cyprus (TFSC) was established on 13 February, 1975, and this journey culminated with the creation of the TRNC on 15 November, 1983.

On this significant day, we wholeheartedly commemorate all the martyrs, salute our veterans and wish the Turkish Cypriot community a joyful 20 July Peace and Freedom Day."
