9TH INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM OF EDUCATION AND VALUES HELD IN COLLABORATION WITH EMU AND TDK

Organized in collaboration with Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) and the Turkish Language Association (TDK), the 9th International Symposium of Education and Values (ISOEVA) was held on 7-9 October 2025. The event brought together scholars from Türkiye, North Cyprus, Kosovo, Malaysia, Macedonia, Nigeria, Romania, and other countries, offering an international scientific platform in the field of values education.

The event was attended by EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç, Member of the Board of Trustees (VYK) Beyhan Güngöze, EMU Vice Rectors Prof. Dr. Osman M. Karatepe and Prof. Dr. Sonuç Zorlu, EMU General Secretary Derviş Ekşici, Chair of the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus Atatürk Teacher Academy Prof. Dr. Güner Konedralı, TDK Vice Chair Assoc. Prof. Dr. Harun Şahin, Dean of EMU Faculty of Education Prof. Dr. Ahmet Pehlivan, Mersin University Academic Personnel Prof. Dr. Kadir Ulusoy, as well as department chairs, academics and students.

“The Role of Education is not Only to Teach Information but Also to Cultivate Values”

At the beginning of the symposium, Prof. Dr. Ahmet Pehlivan, Dean of EMU Faculty of Education, highlighted that education goes beyond merely imparting knowledge; it is a humanizing process that shapes one's identity, conscience, sense of aesthetics, and awareness of social responsibility. Prof. Dr. Pehlivan pointed out that values form the essential principles that give life to a society, yet in today's fast-paced digital world, they are sometimes quietly overlooked. Furthermore, Prof. Dr. Pehlivan emphasized that the role of education is not only to teach information but also to cultivate and sustain values. He described values education as an ongoing awareness that extends to every aspect of life, influencing teacher behaviors, parental involvement, school environment, and student actions. Concluding his remarks, he wished the participants a successful symposium and stated, “Values are not taught in classrooms—they are nurtured in the human heart. The purpose of education is to touch that heart.”

“The Shared Association of the 350-Million-Strong Turkic World”

Assoc. Prof. Dr. Harun Şahin, Vice Chair of TDK, expressed his pleasure at visiting Cyprus, saying, “It is a great honor to be here in the presence of members of the Turkish Resistance Organization, as well as our martyrs and veterans.” He underscored



that the TDK serves not only Türkiye but the entire 350-million-strong Turkic community, emphasizing that “Turkish is more than a tool for communication; it is a way of thinking and a marker of identity.” Assoc. Prof. Dr. Şahin added, “Values begin with language, live through language, and are sustained by language,” noting that protecting Turkish identity is intrinsically linked to preserving the Turkish language. Highlighting Atatürk's commitment to the Turkish language, he stated that the TDK has continued its mission with unwavering dedication for 93 years.

“Values Education: A Fundamental Need in Today's World”

EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç expressed his pleasure at hosting the symposium and extended his warm greetings to all attendees. He highlighted that education is not just about conveying knowledge, but about cultivating individuals to be just, tolerant, and responsible, making values education one of the most crucial needs of the modern era. Noting the importance of safeguarding human values amid rapid technological advancements, Prof. Dr. Kılıç emphasized that the symposium, which brings together scholars from various countries, fosters intercultural understanding. Prof. Dr. Kılıç also pointed out that

the panels, presentations, and teacher-led sessions provided a valuable platform linking science with humanity and knowledge with values. He concluded by expressing his gratitude to the Faculty of Education, the Turkish Language Association, the academics, and all participants for their efforts in making the event a success.

On the first day of the event, “Education Policies within the Context of Values Education” panel moderated by EMU Faculty of Education Dean Prof. Dr. Ahmet Pehlivan, featuring Prof. Dr. Güner Konedralı, the Chair of Atatürk Teacher Academy; Prof. Dr. Kadir Ulusoy from Mersin University; and Assoc. Prof. Dr. Harun Şahin, the Vice Chair of Turkish Language Association as panellists were held.

As part of the symposium, multiple scientific presentations took place concurrently in different halls, both online and in-person, within international sessions highlighting the significance of social sciences and values education. Alongside the oral presentations, participants were able to attend “Best Practices in Education” sessions developed with teacher contributions. The event concluded with the evaluation and closing speeches.

COLLABORATION PROTOCOL SIGNED BETWEEN EMU AND THE CHAMBER OF CIVIL ENGINEERS

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) and the Union of the Chambers of Cyprus Turkish Engineers and Architects (KTMMOB), Chamber of Civil Engineers (IMO) has recently signed a collaboration concerning the organization of the 4th National Civil Engineering Symposium. The protocol was signed on Tuesday, 30 September 2025 at 01:30 p.m. at the EMU Rector's Office building by EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç and Chairperson of the Chamber of Civil Engineers Assoc. Prof. Dr. Abdullah Ekinci.

Present during the signing session were; EMU Faculty of Engineering, Department of Civil Engineering academic staff member Prof. Dr. Khaled Hamed Marar, IMO Executive Board Members Assoc. Prof. Dr. Ayşe Pekrioğlu Balkis and Nüşhet İlktuğ, and organising committee member Dr. Hamza Saeed.

The protocol focused on discussing the framework of the 4th National Civil Engineering Symposium, which is set to be organized with the aim of advancing the civil engineering profession, enhancing collaboration between academia and industry, and contributing to the country's engineering community. Stating that they had gathered for a very meaningful cause, Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç underscored that that the meeting marked the start of a meaningful collaboration between EMU and the IMO, with the protocol set to strengthen their partnership. The protocol was signed to organize the 4th National Civil Engineering Symposium, jointly hosted by EMU Civil Engineering Department and IMO, aiming to make scientific contributions to the construction sector, a key driver of the national economy. Prof. Dr. Kılıç expressed pride in EMU's role in supporting the country's economy through this symposium, acknowledged those who helped prepare the protocol, and wished the event's outcomes to benefit the country.

Assoc. Prof. Dr. Ekinci expressed his pride in being at EMU, emphasizing that



collaborating with the country's flagship university strengthens the IMO. He noted that EMU has consistently supported the national professional chambers and stated that they are pleased with this continued support. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Ekinci explained that the aim of the 4th National Civil Engineering Symposium is to bring together industry and academia, allowing the accumulated knowledge in the construction sector to be applied effectively for the benefit of the industry.

Furthermore, he highlighted that this will be the first time the symposium is held at a university, and although it is referred as a national event, participants will include representatives from many Turkish chambers, universities, as well as international universities, making the symposium an international-level event. Lastly, Dr. Ekinci extended his best wishes for the success and positive outcomes of the protocol and the symposium.

EMU ACADEMIC STAFF MEMBER ASSOC. PROF. DR. SÜHEYLA ÜÇİŞİK ERBİLEN REPRESENTS THE POWER OF WOMEN IN TURKIC WORLD DURING AN EVENT HELD IN BAKU

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU), Faculty of Education academic staff member, EMU Center for Women's Studies (CWS) Executive Board Director and Umay Ana Turkic World Women's Association Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC) Representative Assoc. Prof. Dr. Süheyla Üçışık Erbilin represented EMU at the "2nd International Women's Workshop in Turkic World" event organized by Umay Ana Turkic World Women's Association (UMAY ANA TDKB) on 2-3 October 2025 in Baku, the capital of Azerbaijan. The gathering of pioneering and entrepreneurial women from different parts of the Turkic world took place at Khazar University with strong participation, under the theme "Pioneering and Entrepreneurial Women of the Turkic World".

The event was held with contributions of significant associations such as the Ministry of Culture and Tourism of the Republic of Türkiye (TR), Turkish Collaboration and Coordination Agency (TIKA), Presidency for Turks Abroad and Related Communities (YTB), International Organization of Turkic Culture (TURKSOY), World Union of Ahıska Turks (DATUB), Union of Turkish Women Academics (TURKKAB), Istanbul Gedik University, Women Entrepreneurship Application and Research Center (KAGIMER) and, Istanbul Azerbaijan Solidarity and Culture Association (ISTAD).

Participation from 63 Countries

The workshop was led by Prof. Dr. Mualla Uydu Yücel, a faculty member of Istanbul University Department of General Turkish History. Participants from 63 countries took part in the event, representing regions and communities such as the Ahıska Turks, Azerbaijan, Bulgaria, East Turkistan, the Gagauz Autonomous Region, Iraqi Turkmens, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Crimea, Kosovo, the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus, Uzbekistan, Turkmenistan, and Türkiye.

The two-day workshop, which brought together women academics, writers, civil society representatives, and public officials, explored the roles of women in science, culture, social development, and entrepreneurship. Designed to evaluate the leadership potential of women in the Turkic world from an academic standpoint, the event consisted of five sessions. Alongside Prof. Dr. Mualla Uydu Yücel, the opening remarks featured Khazar University Rector Prof. Dr. Razia İsayeva, Azerbaijani Members of the Parliament Sevil Mikailova, Sabina Salmanova, and Dr. Tamam Caferova, DATUB Secretary General Fuad Uçar, Kosovo Member of the Parliament Fidan Brina Jilta, TRNC Representative in Baku Ufuk Turganer, and Turkish Ambassador to Baku Prof. Dr. Birol Akgün. The speeches emphasized the



importance and role of women in society, the state, and within the family.

The workshop showcased pioneering women across history, literature, science, society, and entrepreneurship. The opening session, "Azerbaijan in Historical Context," examined the Khojaly Massacre and Türkiye-Azerbaijan relations. In the "Pioneering Women in Literature and Media" session, figures such as Şefika Gaspıralı, Süreyya Ağaoğlu, and Zeyno Ganiyeva were highlighted. The "Pioneering Women in Science and Academia" session focused on the contributions of female scholars from the Turkic world.

The "Women in Social Life" session addressed topics such as family cohesion, motherhood, and women's roles in society. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Süheyla Üçışık Erbilin delivered a presentation titled "Distinguished Figures of Northern

Cyprus: Female Fighters", emphasizing the crucial contributions of Turkish Cypriot women to the independence movement. The closing session, "Women in Leadership and Entrepreneurship", explored female leadership, entrepreneurial examples, and highlighted Nezihe Muhiddin's pioneering influence. The workshop, aimed at strengthening communication networks among women in the Turkic world, encourage entrepreneurship, and increase women's participation in scientific endeavors, concluded with notable outcomes. Participants underscored the historical strength of Turkic women across all sectors of society and stressed the importance of women continuing to assume active, productive, and leadership roles in the future. The joint statement issued at the end of the event highlighted the message: "The strong women of the Turkic world will guide the future by following the path of the past".

Completing Tourism Management and Gastronomy training in Bremen, Germany, Tolgar Mireli commenced his career at Ankara Hilton and Sheraton hotels. He gained international experience working alongside a two-Michelin-star chef at Le Canard Nouveau in Hamburg and at Al Muntaha in Dubai's iconic Burj Al Arab. Mireli continued his career at Austria's two-Michelin-star Restaurant Hubertus, Switzerland's Restaurant Vertigo, and London's two-Michelin-star Le Gavroche, and also served as Junior Sous Chef at San Francisco's Michelin-starred Gary Danko. He later took on the role of Sous Chef at the Michelin-starred Stromburg in Germany, led by Johann Lafer.

After returning to Türkiye, Mireli launched his own restaurant, Para Gastroteka, in Ankara and later served as Executive Sous Chef at Istanbul's Swissotel The Bosphorus, managing seven à la carte restaurants. He has also contributed to culinary education, mentoring future chefs at EMU. Continuing his gastronomic journey, Mireli opened Sia Eli in Bodrum Gümüşlük, earning a spot in the 2024 Michelin Guide and the Gault&Millau Hat Award.

Most recently, he led the kitchen at Aliee Istanbul, one of Türkiye's most prestigious hotels, located in the historic Tersane district, shaping its culinary vision from its opening.

Mireli, Once Again at EMU! In the 2025–2026 Academic Year, Tolgar Mireli will join EMU Faculty of Tourism, Department of Gastronomy and Culinary Arts as an instructor,

According to a statement from the EMU TOLES Exam Center, which has coordinated TOLES exams in Cyprus since 2012, candidates this year took the exam at the Foundation, Higher, and Advanced levels and achieved notable results. The statement also highlighted that participants' average scores have consistently improved over the years.

A First

Gürsu Bengihan and Ece Gömdeniz set a milestone by achieving the highest score in their respective categories. In the Foundation level, Gürsu Bengihan scored 96 followed by Melike Şafak with 91 and Sevcan Kapan with 86 points. Moreover, in the Higher level, Ece Gömdeniz achieved 97, followed by Şevval Sude Dumanoğlu with 80 and Başak Gülten with 76. In the Advanced level, Arzu Alp successfully completed the exam with a score of 71.

Deans Office at EMU Faculty of Law stated that TOLES exam, which enhances students' and alumni's proficiency in international legal English, provides a significant opportunity for advancing their careers.

Through its athletic scholarship program, the university offers up to 50% tuition fee support to students who have represented their country and actively compete in EMU sports clubs. Depending on the decision of the University Executive Board, this support can even be extended to cover full tuition.

Branches of Sports at EMU and Their Contributions to TRNC Sports

EMU plays an active role in national sports through its teams competing in volleyball, basketball, athletics, tennis, handball, billiards, chess, wrestling, cycling, table tennis, triathlon, and football tennis. The university also participates in interuniversity tournaments and leagues with its cricket, bowling, darts, swimming, futsal, and football teams, where all student-athletes enjoy scholarship opportunities. Thanks to its modern facilities, professional coaches, and strong infrastructure, EMU stands among the leading institutions fostering the growth of sports in the TRNC. In the 2024–2025 Academic Year, EMU proudly secured championships in men's billiards, men's darts, men's futsal, men's wrestling, women's chess, women's swimming, as well as both men's and women's volleyball.

EMU Offers Sports Opportunities at International Standards

Lala Mustafa Paşa Sports Complex at EMU offers students and the public access to modern, fully equipped sports studios, expert instructors, and flexible membership options. Facilities include cardio, fitness, TRX, spin bike, aerobics, pilates, and bosu studios, along with a table tennis hall that can be used free of charge.

EMU also offers a wide range of outdoor sports facilities, including three basketball courts, a volleyball court, two artificial turf fields, two beach volleyball courts, two beach tennis courts, and a skate park, all accessible day and night via a reservation system. Indoor facilities include



squash courts, a jiu-jitsu studio, and a multi-purpose sports hall with a 3,500-person capacity. The university stadium features a tartan athletics track and a natural grass football field, making it a standout venue.

From EMU to the World Championship

Ese Brume – Long Jump / Athletics

Ese Brume, a 2020 graduate in Tourism and Hotel Management, has made a remarkable mark in athletics. She competed at the 2017 World Championships in London and won a bronze medal at the 2019 World Championships in Doha, Qatar. At the 2019 KoçFest Interuniversity Athletics Championship, she set a Turkish record with a 6.76-meter jump and later secured a bronze medal in long jump at the Tokyo 2020 Olympics. Brume also won gold at the 2022 Commonwealth Games and has claimed

three consecutive golds at the African Athletics Championships, holding both Nigerian and African records.

Ayşe Mullacuma – Football Tennis

Exercise and Sports Sciences Department 2016 graduate Ayşe Mullacuma has earned numerous awards with the TRNC Football Tennis National Team. Mullacuma secured silver medals in singles, doubles, and women's triples at the European Championships in Türkiye (2013, 2022) and Romania (2015, 2016, 2017, 2024). She also helped the TRNC women's triples team achieve third place at the 2012 World Championship in Hungary and claimed second place in singles and doubles at the 2014 and 2016 World Championships in Nicosia. Additionally, she finished third at the Esther Jordi Women's Singles Tournament in Basel in 2018.

Tuğba Aydın –Long Jump / Triple Jump

Tuğba Aydın, a 2017 graduate of the Exercise and Sports Sciences Department, has achieved notable success in long jump and triple jump. She claimed the Turkish long jump title in 2012, 2013, 2016, and 2017, and earned silver in triple jump in 2015 and 2017 before winning gold in 2018. At the International Athletics Indoor Championships, she set a personal best of 13.05 meters in 2019 and went on to improve her mark to 13.44 meters, finishing third at the 2020 Balkan Championships in Romania.

Alara Ghaffari – Billiards

EMU Public Relations and Advertising Department student Alara Ghaffari won a gold medal in 2025 Estonia European Billiards Championship.

Osman Şanlısoy – Billiards

A 2013 graduate of Department of Translation and Interpretation, Osman Şanlısoy, secured a silver medal in U23 division of 2021 European Billiards Championship held in Türkiye.

Mustafa Alnar – Billiards

Mustafa Alnar, who graduated in 2023 from the Exercise and Sports Sciences Department, claimed the gold medal in the U23 division at the 2021 European Billiards Championship in Türkiye.

Team Achievements of EMU

In 2020, EMU Chess Team and Billiards Team both captured the Turkish Interuniversity Championship titles.
