Year Fall Semester were presented with their white coats. On the other hand, ranking students of 2024-2025 Academic Year Spring Semester received their honour and high honour certificates.

The congress seeks to bring together academics, industry professionals, and researchers from around the world to host scientific studies that will help shape the future of tourism.

MTCON serves as an internationally renowned platform showcasing high-quality academic research

in areas such as tourism management, sustainability, destination development, digitalization, customer experience, innovation, and global tourism policy.

Expressing his contentment on the matter, Prof. Dr. Kılıç stated: "Tourism is not just a key sector that connects the world; it is a strategic field central to sustainability, innovation, and global cooperation. Serving as co-chair for such a prestigious international event is a tremendous honour both personally and for Eastern Mediterranean University. The event will boost our university's global profile and foster new partnerships by linking our academics' expertise with researchers from across the globe".

"One of the Oldest Professions in the World"

Following a moment of silence and national anthem, the event continued with opening speeches, EMU Faculty of Dentistry's Dean Prof. Dr. Hikmet Solak provided insights on Dentistry Day which has been celebrated for the 117th time this year. Noting that the profession of dentistry is one of the oldest professions in the world, Prof. Dr. Solak touched on the history of dentistry and highlighted the differences between dentistry as a profession and being a dentist. Prof. Dr. Solak spoke about the founding of the Turkish Dentistry Organization and the declaration of World Oral Health Day on 22 November. He noted that the dental school began its education in 1909 and reflected on the evolution of dental education and the profession over time. Stressing that dentistry is a respected field, Prof. Dr. Solak emphasized that maintaining its sustainability is a shared responsibility. Moveoer, Prof. Dr. Solak also reaffirmed that the EMU Faculty of Dentistry will continue to lead advancements in the profession and extended his congratulations on Dentists' Day and Oral Health Week.

Prof. Dr. Simel Ayyıldız, Dean of the Faculty of Dentistry at the Health Sciences University, highlighted that the ceremony was not merely about wearing the white coat, but about honouring the profession, embracing the responsibility of tradition, and committing to the service of humanity. Quoting Mustafa Kemal Atatürk— "Every effort devoted to medicine is the most valuable investment in the health of the nation"— Prof. Dr. Ayyıldız noted that today reflects the purest and most hopeful expression of that investment. She also provided details about the joint dentistry program with EMU. Emphasizing that the white coat represents more than attire, she described it as a symbol of cleanliness, responsibility, knowledge, and conscience. She concluded by congratulating everyone on Dentists' Day and Oral Health Week.

Said protocol was signed by Ceren Boğaç and Barçık Boğaz and, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç at EMU Rector's Office building. The protocol aims to ensure the preservation, display and the transfer of artworks on to future generations.

Present during the signing session were, EMU Vice Rector for Student Affairs Prof. Dr. Sonuç Zorlu, EMU Vice Rector for Promotion and Institutional Communication Prof. Dr. Ali Öztüren, and EMU Art and Design Center's Art Coordinator Zehra Şonya.

During his speech at the signing ceremony, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç noted that the protocol was established to honour the legacy of one of the nation's distinguished artists, Baki Boğaç, to introduce him to future generations, and to preserve his works for the future. Prof. Dr. Kılıç highlighted that the protocol will not only support education and academic development, but will also enrich the artistic dimension of society. Prof. Dr. Kılıç also informed attendees about Baki Boğaç, expressing that the initiative reflects the university's artistic vision and its commitment to art, and wished for the protocol to bring positive outcomes.

Ceren Boğaç also made remarks during the signing session, expressing their gratitude and delight that their father Baki Boğaç's works will come to life at EMU. She added that seeing the





artworks become part of EMU's artistic archive and leave a lasting legacy for future generations carries great significance for their family.

Following his sister's address, Barçın Boğaç also expressed that he shared his sister's feeling and thanked EMU for their sentimentality: "Nowhere else but EMU could we have safeguarded this spiritual legacy. EMU is like a home to us, an institution that truly values

art. We are deeply grateful to EMU for this opportunity".

She shared her delight that two of his pieces will be added to the EMU Art Collection and highlighted the artist's importance to the Famagusta art community.



"INCLUSIVE PEACE"

SEMINAR HELD AT EMU

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU), Cyprus Policy Center (CPC) and Faculty of Business and Economics, Department of Political Science and International Relations co-organized a seminar titled "Inclusive Peace". The event commenced with an opening speech delivered by Prof. Dr. Ahmet Sözen, EMU CPC Chairperson and Head of Department of Political Science and International Relations. Then, panellists Dr. İpek Borman and Department of International Relations student Aysel Rahmanova provided insights on the contents of the event.

In his speech, Prof. Dr. Ahmet Sözen discussed the role of Track II diplomacy in conflict resolution, noting its distinction from Track I diplomacy conducted by official actors such as heads of state and diplomats. He stressed the importance of taking into account the needs and interests of all parties involved. Furthermore, Prof. Dr. Sözen referenced UN Security Council Resolution 1325 (UNSCR 1325), highlighting the need to include groups that have historically been excluded from peace processes.



Then seminar continued with a speech by EMU International Relations Department student Aysel Rahmanova who talked about her internship process last summer in the Nicosia buffer zone and her observations of conflict resolution practices in Northern Ireland and South Africa. Rahmanova analysed the effects of Track II diplomacy in these contexts and discussed how the lessons learned might be applied to the Cyprus issue. Moreover, she emphasized key aspects such as international ownership, conditional inclusivity, technical drafting processes, and civil society engagement in the examples she examined.

The final speaker of the event, Dr. İpek Borman, who spent ten years as a member of the Turkish Cypriot negotiation team, presented on the Cyprus issue and gender policies. She highlighted the importance of gender in understanding power dynamics and pointed out the underrepresentation of women in high-level political positions in Cyprus. Dr. Borman also noted that gender-sensitive and inclusive negotiation processes are still underdeveloped, and criticized the tendency to prioritize security issues over gender equality. She stressed that the United Nations should strengthen its efforts to fully integrate gender considerations into all policies.

Receiving high participation, the seminar concluded with a question-answer session in which the speakers, moderated by Prof. Dr. Ahmet Sözen, discussed Track-II diplomacy and the impact of gender equality on Cyprus issue.



Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU), once again, participated in the IEEEXtreme 2025 Coding Marathon simultaneously organized all around the world by the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE). The EMU leg of the marathon was successfully organized by the Faculty of Engineering, in collaboration with the Department of

Annually organized by IEEE, with participation of 20.000 students from 75 countries last year, the international competition is recognized as one of the most prestigious international student competitions where students work on coding and algorithm problems within 24 hours.

During the applied workshop, participants were taught both basic and advanced level culinary techniques.

EMU ORGANIZES 'AYTOTORO ÇÖREĞİ' WORKSHOP: CULTURE, HARD-WORK AND YEAST-SMELL PASSED DOWN GENERATIONS

With the sponsorship of Yeni Boğaziçi Women's Association, Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU), Faculty of Tourism and Community Involvement Center (CIC) organized a workshop event with the aim of promoting "Aytotoro Çöreği" recognized as one of the unforgettable cultural heritages of Cyprus. The workshop was led by Raziye Oyuncu, a board member of the Yeni Boğaziçi Women's Association and recipient of the "Mother Earth" award from Slow Food Salamis in 2020, alongside her husband Güner Oyuncu. Participants had the opportunity to learn the traditional recipe of Aytotoro Çöreği, a regional specialty from Aytotoro Village, in a hands-on workshop guided by Chef Mine Adalıer, Instructor in EMU Gastronomy and Culinary Arts Program.

The said event saw participation from Acting Dean of EMU Faculty of Tourism Assist. Prof. Dr. İlkay Yorgancı, Vice Dean of EMU Faculty of Tourism Assist. Prof. Dr. Tuna Karatepe, EMU CIC's Chairperson Assist. Prof. Dr. Nazenin Ruso Kandemir, Yeni Boğaziçi Women's Association's Chairperson Nazenin Taşçıoğlu Şahali, board members of the association, faculty members and students.

"A Cultural Treasure Loved by All" In her speech, Nazenin Taşçıoğlu Şahali, Chairperson of the Yeni Boğaziçi Women's Association, noted that the village of Yeniboğaziçi (Aytotoro – Agios Theodoros) was a mixed village prior to 1974, connected to the Larnaca district. She emphasized that this bread is a cultural treasure loved by both Turkish and Greek communities in Cyprus, noting, "Named after Aytotoro Village, this unique bread stands out from other Cypriot breads due to its inclusion of milk and sugar. It is not merely a food item; it embodies women's effort, solidarity, and cultural heritage." Şahali also stated that a key goal of the association is to preserve and pass these cultural traditions on to future generations.

"Bearer of Collective Memory"

Raziye Oyuncu, honored as "Mother Earth" by Slow Food Salamis in 2020, pointed out that the bread's most distinctive feature is its yeast, carefully preserved over centuries. She referred to this yeast as a "bearer of collective memory," noting that each jar forms a living link between past and

future. Oyuncu also explained that serving Aytotoro Çöreği at births, postpartum celebrations, weddings, and special occasions has historically reinforced the continuity of this cultural tradition.

Participants, alongside students from EMU Faculty of Tourism, had the chance to observe the traditional bread-making process and experience the story of this unique delicacy first-hand. At the end of the workshop, attendees received certificates of participation. Moreover, appreciation certificates were presented to key organizers and contributors, including EMU CIC Chairperson Assist. Prof. Dr. Nazenin Ruso Kandemir, Acting Dean of the Faculty of Tourism Assist. Prof. Dr. İlkay Yorgancı, Chairperson of the Yeni Boğaziçi Women's Association Nazenin Taşçıoğlu Şahali, as well as the instructors Raziye Oyuncu, Güner Oyuncu, and Chef Mine Adalıer.


MESSAGE ON 24 NOVEMBER – TEACHERS' DAY

Hackathons are widely recognized as technology-driven marathons in which programmers, designers, and tech innovators work intensively within a limited timeframe to quickly convert creative ideas into functional prototypes. Organized by EMU Software and AI Development Club, the competition will be open to all university students from both Türkiye and the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus. The event specifically focuses on generating Alpowered solutions that support digitalization in the construction sector.

Last Date for Applications: 2 December 2025

The competition will host 10 teams of three participants each. Applications — accepted via https://hackathon.emu.edu.tr — are open until 2 December 2025. After the application period, a preliminary evaluation will determine which teams qualify, and the selected participants will be announced on the website on 3–4 December 2025. The submitted projects will be reviewed by an esteemed panel of judges, consisting of prominent professionals from various sectors of the industry.

3-day Intensive Marathon in Camp FormatThe three-day Hackathon will take place in a camp-style setting, with all accommodation and catering provided by the event sponsors, Cyprus Constructions and Califorian Restaurant. During the event, students will have the chance to engage with industry professionals while working on

their projects. The top-ranking teams will share a total prize pool of 150,000 TL.

Reflecting EMU's technology-driven vision, the Hackathon serves as a key platform for students to foster innovative ideas, tackle real-world industry challenges, and advance their expertise in AI and software development.
