### Protocols signed with IBTAV and Kırıkkale University

EMU signed protocols with Kırıkkale University

and IBTAV on Wednesday, 3 December 2025 at 12:00 p.m., at EMU Senate Hall. The protocol with Kırıkkale University was signed by EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç and Kırıkkale University Rector Prof. Dr. Ersan Aslan. On the other hand, EMU's protocol with IBTAV was signed by once again EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Kılıç as well as IBTAV Chairperson Mecit Çetinkaya and IBTAV Board of Trustees member Necmeddin Bilal Erdoğan.

The collaboration protocols signed with the two institutions are designed to foster joint educational and research programs, facilitate cooperative

projects, and launch a range of initiatives aimed at enhancing academic partnerships.

guided by 'Fuat Hoca', a vision for a comprehensive history of science. IBTAV Chairperson Mecit Çetinkaya extended his best wishes for the success of the protocol and seminar and thanked all participants for their involvement

"The History of Science is one of the Core Fields"

Stating that the history of science is one of the core fields, Necmeddin Bilal Erdoğan, IBTAV Board of Trustees member, noted that Prof. Dr. Fuat Sezgin pursued it for his own distinctive reasons. He emphasized that Prof. Dr. Sezgin devoted his academic career to documenting the often-overlooked contributions of Muslim scientists by European scholars. Erdoğan highlighted that progress in science and technology does not require a Western cultural background, and that Prof. Dr. Sezgin's work demonstrates how one can achieve excellence in science, history, and technology while embracing a Muslim identity.

On the other hand, Prof. Dr. İrfan Gündüz from the Board of Trustees at İbn-i Haldun University underscored that each study carried out would honor the legacy of Prof. Dr. Fuat Sezgin. Saying; "Do not look to the skies alone for the future; it also lies in our roots", Prof. Dr. Gündüz expressed his belief that the signed protocols and organized seminar would be fruitful.

EMU VYK President Dr. Erdal Özcenk also made an address, expressing his satisfaction in hosting two key collaborations that advance the university's scientific vision. He highlighted that the protocol with IBTAV demonstrates their dedication to preserving and transmitting the rich heritage of our scientific history to future generations. #### "Islamic Civilization has pioneered Scientific Achievement for Centuries"

At the seminar, IBTAV Board of Trustees member Necmeddin Bilal Erdoğan reflected on his acquaintance with Prof. Dr. Fuat Sezgin, highlighting his singular role in the history of science. Erdoğan detailed the efforts to strengthen Prof. Dr. Sezgin's connection to Türkiye and to transfer the outcomes of his research in Frankfurt to Istanbul. He emphasized that Islamic civilization has long

Making a speech at the Protocol Signing Ceremony, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç offered insight on the history and institutional development of the university, expressing their pleasure expressing his pleasure at formalizing collaborations that will significantly advance EMU's academic vision. Emphasizing the university's focus on higher education and academic growth, Prof. Dr. Kılıç noted pride in signing these meaningful agreements, which are expected to enrich areas ranging from education and research to academic mobility and scientific output. been a leader in scientific achievement and that progress in civilization arises not from religious or cultural differences, but from dedication and viewing science as a collective human heritage. Erdoğan also underscored that with confidence, young Muslims can once again become pioneers in science and technology, noting that Türkiye's 'Century of Türkiye vision reinforces this goal.

### "Muslims Hold a Vital and Unshakable Role in the Scientific Heritage of Humanity"

In his speech, IBTAV Chairperson Mecit Çetinkaya touched on Prof. Dr. Fuat Sezgin's life and work, highlighting his crucial role in appreciating the historic contributions of Muslim scientists. He explained how Muslim scholars approached science in a systematic manner and how much of Western scientific knowledge was derived from the Islamic world, noting that Western societies have, over time, sought to downplay this fact. Using examples ranging from Ibn-i Sina to the maps created by Muslim geographers, Çetinkaya emphasized the Islamic world's defining role in the history of science and reaffirmed that Muslims occupy a strong and indispensable position in humanity's scientific heritage.

### "Knowledge, Science, Wisdom and Future" EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç emphasized that

the seminar was a valuable platform underscoring the exceptional role of Islamic civilization in humanity's collective scientific legacy. He pointed out that

the methods developed by Muslim scholars over many centuries laid the groundwork for modern science, and highlighted the importance of the universal character of science and cross-cultural interaction in advancing human knowledge. Prof. Dr. Kılıç noted that EMU views science not merely as academic production, but as a driving force for societal progress, adding that the university continues to provide its students with the highest-quality research and educational opportunities guided by the principles of "knowledge, science, wisdom, and future". Adding more, Prof. Dr. Kılıç thanked IBTAV for preserving Prof. Dr. Fuat Sezgin's scholarly heritage and stated that the collaboration protocols signed between EMU, Kırıkkale University, and IBTAV would make valuable contributions to both education and research.

"All Scientific Fields Influence One Another" In his speech, Kırıkkale University Rector and IBTAV Vice Chair Prof. Dr. Ersan Aslan expressed that today's young participants would carry lasting impressions from this event in the years to come. He underlined that those who understand their heritage and can accurately interpret the present are better equipped to move confidently into the future, drawing attention to the significance of family, self-awareness, and knowing oneself. Prof. Dr. Aslan added that the intellectual accumulation and skills of past generations play a vital role in shaping what lies ahead, emphasizing that all scientific fields influence one another. He concluded by stating that the scientific achievements of one society inspire and illuminate the path of others.

Making an address at the opening, Prof. Dr. Mehtap Malkoç, Dean of EMU Faculty of Health Sciences, highlighted the significance of the meeting and expressed pride that EMU was hosting the SABDEK General Assembly for the second time. Prof. Dr. Malkoç outlined how the Faculty has scientifically addressed the region's need for health professionals since its founding and shared insights about the Faculty and Cypriot culture. Prof. Dr. Malkoç concluded by wishing the assembly to be inspiring, productive, and fruitful.

#### "A Strategic Role"

Prof. Dr. Bülent Elbasan, Chair of the SABDEK Executive Board, stressed that Faculties of Health Sciences play a strategic role in shaping the quality

of the nation's healthcare. He pointed out that growth has naturally created vulnerabilities in capacity, quality, and employment, which would be discussed at the meeting. Addressing rising quotas and graduate numbers, Prof. Dr. Elbasan stressed the need to evaluate academic staff and infrastructure. Moreover, Prof. Dr. Elbasan emphasized that the General Assembly aims to be a solutionoriented platform rather than just identifying problems, expressing confidence that the meeting would mark a new milestone and help establish a critical roadmap.

Delivering next, Famagusta Mayor Dr. Süleyman Uluçay shared his experiences from his student years, noting that the first Faculty of Health Sciences in Türkiye was established at Hacettepe University. Drawing on his own experiences, Dr. Uluçay also discussed the significance of Türkiye for the Turkish Cypriot community.

### "To Lead to Future of Health Sciences Training"

EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç expressed his pride and honor in hosting the 18th General Assembly of the Health Sciences Deans' Council at EMU, describing the event as a valuable platform for shaping the future of health sciences education. He noted that national collaborations in health sciences align with EMU's commitment to fostering a culture of quality in higher education and strengthen communication with academic stakeholders. Prof. Dr. Kılıç continued by saying; "I truly believe this meeting will contribute significantly to advancing health education at our university, in the TRNC, and in Türkiye, not only by evaluating the current state but also by developing proactive, solution-focused strategies for the future". Highlighting the qualities required of future health professionals, Prof. Dr. Kılıç stressed that students should not only master technology but also excel in human connection, communication, and empathy. He also underscored that EMU aims to train health professionals who leverage

science and technology while keeping human values at the forefront.

#### "Common Expertise to be built"

EMU VYK President Dr. Erdal Özcenk stressed that the meeting goes beyond a mere gathering, serving as a platform to build collective expertise in health sciences, set innovative goals, and guide future health professionals. He highlighted that bringing together the Faculties of Health Sciences from Türkiye and the TRNC under one umbrella reflects a shared societal responsibility. Furthermore, Dr. Özcenk stated; "Guide your students beyond professional knowledge, teach them to value humanity, show empathy, uphold social responsibility, and maintain principled conduct in all situations. True healthcare thrives on respect for people, ethical commitment, and professional integrity. At the General Assembly, the focus will be on generating solutions, exploring new opportunities, and fostering collective wisdom to advance faculties into the future. EMU takes pride in fulfilling its role in this endeavor, and I hope the Assembly will

bring fresh momentum to health policy and the scientific community".

#### "EMU Leads Higher Education Sector"

In his remarks, Prof. Dr. Hasan Amca, Vice Chair of YÖDAK, highlighted that YÖDAK continues to work diligently, aiming not only to address current needs but also to establish a strong, forward-looking educational system prepared for future uncertainties. Noting that recent technological advances have brought a profound paradigm shift in higher education, with health sciences being particularly impacted, Prof. Dr. Amca expressed confidence that the 18th General Assembly would produce significant outcomes and provide guidance for the future, underlining the importance of EMU, a leader in higher education, in hosting such esteemed scholars. Prof. Dr. Amca also stated; "EMU's dedication to quality, innovation, and forward-thinking in higher education stands as a key reference point for the TRNC and the wider region. I firmly believe that your academic contributions will help shape our country's future. Wishing you all continued success".

Following the opening speeches, various sessions were held: 'SABDEK Action Plan' by Prof. Dr. Mehtap Malkoç and Prof. Dr. Bülent Elbasan; 'Prosthesis-Orthosis Core Education Program' by Prof. Dr. Sultan Taşçı and Assoc. Prof. Dr. Esra Dursun Atılgan, and lastly, 'Adaptation to Core Education Programs' session by Prof. Dr. Sibel Aksu Yıldırım and Prof. Dr. Salih Bardakcı.

The General Assembly proceeded with a threepart workshop for deans, department heads, and program coordinators, focusing on Program-Based Feasibility Analysis, Aligning Course Types with Teaching Methods, and Mapping Programs to Learning Outcomes.

## EMU AND ITU'S COLLABORATION IN ACADEMIC, SCIENTIFIC AND CULTURAL FIELDS TO BE STRENGTHENED

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) and Istanbul Technical University (ITU) signed a collaboration protocol aiming to strengthen cooperation in academic, scientific and cultural fields. The protocol was signed on Saturday, 6 December 2025 at 12:30 p.m. at EMU Rector's Office building by ITU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Mandal and EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç. The signed protocol seeks to initiate collaboration in areas such as the sharing of physical facilities at undergraduate and graduate levels, student and faculty exchanges, the sharing of scientific publications, the organization of joint events, academic advisory activities, and national and international promotional efforts.

Present during the signing session were; ITU North Cyprus Campus Rector Prof. Dr. Burçkin Dal, EMU Vice Rectors Prof. Dr. Osman M. Karatepe, Prof. Dr. Sonuç Zorlu and Prof. Dr. Ali Öztüren.

Speaking at the ceremony, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç highlighted that entering into a cooperation agreement with one of Türkiye's oldest and most prestigious universities—a sister institution—marks a significant step toward collaborative projects, research, and initiatives. Prof. Dr. Kılıç expressed his pleasure at seeing the protocol signed between the two sister countries and their universities, noting that its prompt implementation is expected to bring new insights to the scientific field.

Also making a speech, ITU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Mandal underscored that the collaboration protocol signed between EMU and ITU – two prominent universities from TRNC and Türkiye – holds great significance for both institutions. Stating that the relation between ITU North Cyprus Campus and EMU is already a strong one, Prof. Dr. Mandal added that, as ITU,





they aim to take action in realizing this communication. Prof. Dr. Mandal explained that many joint projects will be carried out within the framework of joint diploma matters and specified focal fields. He also expressed his hope for a fruitful protocol.

### SIGN COLLABORATION PROTOCOL IN THE FIELDS OF EDUCATION AND CAREER

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) and North Cyprus Turkcell signed a collaboration protocol covering the fields of education and career. EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç and Group Director of North Cyprus Turkcell Human Resources and Procurement Serhat Gezgin signed the said protocol on Thursday, 4 December 2025 at 04:00 p.m. at EMU Rector's Office building. The signing session was also attended by EMU Vice Rectors Prof. Dr. Osman M. Karatepe and Prof. Dr. Sonuç Zorlu, and Kübra Yalçın, Talent Manager at North Cyprus Turkcell.

The protocol seeks to create a framework for cooperation between North Cyprus Turkcell and EMU in education, career development, research, and innovation. It aims to support the growth of students and graduates, combine academic expertise with industry practice, and jointly carry out projects that will benefit society.

In his speech, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç stated that the two institutions gathered together for a meaningful collaboration that would reinforce the relation between them. Noting that the students will be provided

job and internship opportunities through the signed protocol. Prof. Dr. Kılıç also highlighted the importance of uniting EMU—an institution that has grown from the roots of this country and become an integral part of it—with North Cyprus Turkcell, a powerful and internationally recognized organization. He concluded by expressing his hope that the protocol brings positive outcomes for both parties.

In his address, Serhat Gezgin, North Cyprus Turkcell Human Resources and Procurement Group Director, stressed the importance of universities and the business sector working together, especially given the rapidly changing global landscape, and noted that the newly signed cooperation protocol holds great value in this regard. In this regard, each chapter includes test questions, with an answer key provided at the end of the book. Focusing on the legal framework of capital markets—where medium- and long-term funds are traded—the book also highlights recent legislative developments related to legal practices in this field.

### THE INTERNATIONAL STATISTICS CONGRESS IRSYSC 2025



Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) hosted the 9th International Researchers, Statisticians and Young Statisticians Congress (IRSYSC 2025) organized in collaboration with the Adana Alparslan Türkeş Science and Technology University. Held on Friday, 28 November 2025 at the Rauf Raif Denktaş Culture and Congress Center, the event brought the recent research in the field of statistics and applied sciences together with international science society.

Serving as a follow-up session of the congress organized in Adana on 26-27 November, the scientific event was attended by Zorlu Töre, the former Chairperson of the Parliament of the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus; EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç; Vice Rector for Academic Affairs Prof. Dr. Osman M. Karatepe; Prof. Dr. Hülya Çıngı, retired academic from Hacettepe University; and Congress Organizing Committee Chairperson Assoc. Prof. Dr. Selim Gündüz.

"A Potential to Initiate New Collaborations, Projects and Friendships"

In his speech, Congress Organizing Committee Chairperson Assoc. Prof. Dr. Selim Gündüz thanked everyone attending the congress and emphasized that the scientific process of the congress that began in Adana and continued in Famagusta, was a potential to initiate new collaborations, projects and friendships. Expressing his particular interest in the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Gündüz said he was honored to begin, with this congress, the project he has long been developing toward the vision of making it a 'scientific hub of the Turkic world'. He highlighted that statistics is more than just numbers, as it evolves into practical concepts influencing social well-being through fields like economics, artificial intelligence, finance, and public policy. He stressed the importance of combining accurate data from the field with proper methodologies, especially in an era of growing uncertainty. Concluding his remarks, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Gündüz thanked all institutions and stakeholders for their support, adding that every new collaboration formed during the congress will contribute not only to scientific advancement but also to societal progress.

#### "The Science of Statistics Has Established Its Roots"

Former academic staff member of the Hacettepe University, Prof. Dr. Hülya Çıngı, also made

an address at the event, commencing by saying that they experience the same excitement for organizing the 9th congress, just as the first one. Touching on history of IRSYSC, Prof. Dr. Çıngı noted that the very first congress was held at Hacettepe University, followed by subsequent congresses held respectively at Konya Selçuk University, Ege University, Süleyman Demirel University and Yıldız Technical University, reaching an international level. Prof. Dr. Çıngı recalled that statistics first gained its academic foundation in Türkiye in 1967 with the establishment of the Department of Statistics at Hacettepe University, and pointed out that the field became firmly rooted with the later openings of statistics departments at Middle East Technical University in 1975, Ondokuz Mayıs University in 1984, and Yıldız Technical University in 1990. She further stated that statistics programs are now available at 23 universities, demonstrating the discipline's considerable academic and scientific advancement.

#### "A Strategical Platform of Science"

EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç conveyed that the congress extends beyond being merely a scientific gathering, it is also a testament to the ever-growing scientific collaboration between Türkiye and the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus. Noting that IRSYSC 2025 serves as a strategical platform of science that brings interdisciplinary studies together, Prof. Dr. Kılıç expressed that the congress will foster enduring value through fresh ideas, joint initiatives, and academic contributions. He emphasized that with its 46-year legacy, EMU acts as a bridge connecting science, cultures, and communities. Underscoring their trust in emerging scholars,

Prof. Dr. Kılıç noted that young researchers are central to the scientific work that will shape the future. He pointed out that the history of the Turkish Cypriots is frequently debated in negotiation and discussion settings, making reliable data essential. Töre stressed that scientific work, especially statistical findings, is key to informed decision-making, and added that events like this congress play an important role in generating accurate knowledge and ensuring it is passed on to future generations.

Following the opening speeches of the International Researchers, Statisticians and Young Statisticians Congress, internationally acclaimed academics shared their knowledge and experiences.

The congress covered a wide range of topics, from core disciplines like statistics, biostatistics, econometric analysis, biometrics, and operations research to contemporary research areas such as data science, artificial intelligence applications, actuarial science and risk management, as well as economics, business, and finance.

Karatepe and Prof. Dr. Ali Öztüren, EMU General Secretary Derviş Ekşici, Chairperson of TEA Prof. Dr. Hasan Kazdağlı, Dean of EMU Faculty of Business and Economics Prof. Dr. Mustafa Besim, faculty deans, department heads, academics and students.

The 3-day event commenced on Thursday, 13 November 2025 with the opening speeches by EMU Faculty of Business and Economics Dean Prof. Dr. Mustafa Besim, TEA Chairperson Prof. Dr. Hasan Kazdağlı, TRNC Central Bank Chairperson Rifat Günay, EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç and TRNC Minister of Economy and Energy Olgun Amcaoğlu.

On this first day of the conference, Prof. Dr. Hakan Kara from Bilkent University approached the recent monetary policy in Türkiye during his speech titled "The Great (Monetary) Experience". On the other hand, Prof. Dr. Erol Taymaz from Middle East Technical University delivered a presentation with the title of "Sınai Kalkınma ve İmalat Sanayiinde Yeşil Dönüşüm / Green Transition in Industrial Development and Manufacturing". Throughout the day, participants exchanged insights and experiences in sessions addressing a variety of topics, including the transformation of the Northern Cyprus economy, firm dynamics and international trade, corporate finance,





risk management and governance, labour markets and employment, macroeconomic modelling and policy, household behaviour, technological transformation, technological transformation, research and development, and digitalization.

On the second day of the conference, Prof. Dr. Kamil Yılmaz from Koç University was among the invited speakers of the event. Head of EMU Department of Business Administration Assoc. Prof. Dr. Burak Erkut and doctoral students Saba Shirzadifooladi, Mehrza Shafiei Shahidlu and Obioma Obijama presented their research. The special session titled "Sosyo-Ekonomik ve Kültürel Dönüşüm Dinamikleri / Socio-Economic and Cultural Transformation Dynamics" was chaired by Prof. Dr. Sami Fethi from EMU Department of Business Administration.

Assoc. Prof. Dr. Burak Erkut, Head of EMU Business Administration Department, presented his research on technology and entrepreneurship in a talk titled "The Digital Entrepreneurship Divide: National Digital Infrastructure as a Predictor of High-Growth Aspiration Entrepreneurship in Emerging Economies". The study, based on panel data analysis, explored how digital infrastructure in emerging economies influences the prevalence of early-stage, high-growth potential ventures. The findings revealed that digitalization often produces many subsistence-level entrepreneurs alongside a few high-tech-focused entrepreneurs, highlighting the existence of a 'digital entrepreneurship divide'.

EMU Department of Business
Administration doctoral student Mehrza
Shafiei Shahidlu's study titled "Dynamic
Integration and Volatility Spillovers in
Technology-Focused Financial Markets"
offered extensive insight on volatility
spillovers within exchange traded funds. The
finding that increased simultaneity in the
technology sector weakens the effectiveness
of diversification offers important insights
for regulators who monitor systemic risk
closely.

Within the framework of the research on market resilience, EMU Department of Business Administration doctoral student Saba Shirzadifooladi's presentation, "Assessing Volatility Spillover Effects between Sustainable and Non-Sustainable Firms in the Energy Sector", stood out. Analyzing data from 2010–2024, the study revealed that traditional oil companies primarily transmit shocks during crises, whereas renewable energy firms mainly absorb them. The research also emphasized that sustainability plays a key role in enhancing market resilience.

The study titled "Exchange Rate Policy and Crisis Signals: Constructing an Exchange Market Pressure Index for Nigeria" carried out by Department doctoral student Obioma Obijama, jointly with Foday Joof, introduced a foreign exchange market pressure index for Nigeria, offering policymakers a valuable tool to detect early signs of stress in the currency market.

Another key academic contribution from the department was the special session on 'Socio-Economic and Cultural Transformation Dynamics,' chaired by Prof. Dr. Sami Fethi. Combining insights from four studies in religion, education, and tourism, the session offered an in-depth discussion forum for exploring socio-cultural transformation processes.

During the talk event which will be organized with the contributions of Famagusta Municipality, Beşikcioğlu will deliver a speech titled "Bir Tiyatro Yönetmek, Bir Kent Yönetmek / Directing a Theatre, Managing a City", sharing his experiences in the field of theater as well as his knowledge gained during his time as the mayor. Beşikcioğlu's talk will offer a striking perspective on how the discipline of art on the theater stage finds its counterpart in urban governance.

A statement released by the Directorate highlighted that EMU views art as an essential part of campus life and places institutional priority on initiatives that motivate student groups to take an active role in cultural production. It also underlined that the traditionalized 4th 'Duvar' Workshop Days are a key element in the university's efforts to enhance artistic expression and social interaction.
