In the highly prestigious "Golden Turkish Chef of the Year" category, Fatma Öztünç claimed the gold medal and trophy, while Nujin Karakulak secured the silver medal and trophy. Additionally, the team of Elif Asarlık, Günseli Kafa, and Nujin Dilba Karakulak earned a gold medal in the "University-Level Modern Turkish Cuisine Team Competition". Fatma Öztünç also won a gold medal in the "Restaurant Dessert Plate" category, while Günseli Kafa received a silver medal in the "Golden Young Chef of the Year" category. In the "University-Level Student Chef Pasta Competition," Nujin Dilba Karakulak took home the gold medal, and Elif Asarlık was awarded the silver medal.

The team honored with the trophy in the "Best University Team of the Year"

category also achieved individual distinctions by winning bronze medals. In the "University-Level Student Chef Restaurant Dessert Competition", Günseli Kafa earned a silver medal, while Elif Asarlık and Nujin Dilba Karakulak received bronze medals. Elif Asarlık and Günseli Kafa also secured silver medals in the "University-Level Student Chef Fish Competition." In the "University-Level Student Chef Main Course Competition," Elif Asarlık and Günseli Kafa were again awarded silver medals, while Nujin Dilba Karakulak claimed a bronze medal. Furthermore, Fatma Öztünç was awarded a silver medal in the "Masters' Fish" category and a bronze medal in the "Lamb" category.

The talk event feature Col. Murat Keleş – Founding Leader of SoloTürk and first ever air show pilot. Held at Mustafa Afşin Ersoy Hall, the said event was also attended by EMU Vice Rectors Prof. Dr. Osman M. Karatepe and Prof. Dr. Ali Öztüren, EMU Faculty of Tourism Dean Assist. Prof. Dr. Karatepe also shared comprehensive information about EMU, emphasizing that it is the island’s oldest university established by law. He pointed out that EMU was

Providing further details about the EMU Faculty of Tourism, Prof. Dr. Karatepe underlined its global recognition and its distinction through academic publications, and encouraged students to value both their University and the Faculty of Tourism. During the talk, Col. Murat Keleş, the founding leader and first demonstration pilot of SoloTürk - a team established within the Turkish Air Force and recognized as a national symbol at both national and international levels - shared insights into the team’s formation and his inspirational journey with the audience. The event concluded with Prof. Dr. Karatepe presenting Col. Keleş with a silver plate in recognition of his contributions.





## CONSTRUCTOR UNIVERSITY VISITS EMU

Officials from Constructor University, one of the prominent higher education institutions of Germany, visited Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU). Within the scope of the visit, Alper Demirkan – Regional Manager of the Constructor University – met with EMU students at Senate Meeting Hall, sharing detailed information about the educational programs they offer. EMU Vice Rector for Promotion and Institutional Communication Prof. Dr. Ali Öztüren was also present during the said meeting. During the meeting, students were introduced to the “4+1 Dual Degree

Program” offered as part of the ongoing collaboration between EMU and Constructor University. The program enables graduates of the Business Administration and International Trade and Business programs under EMU Faculty of Business and Economics to complete an additional year of study at Constructor University in Germany and earn an International Business degree from Constructor University. Students’ questions were answered, and detailed information was provided on tuition fees, accommodation options, and living conditions in Germany.

As part of the visit, delegation also paid visits to EMU Vice Rector for Academic Affairs Prof. Dr. Osman M. Karatepe and Prof. Dr. Mustafa Besim – Dean of EMU Faculty of Business and Economics – and presented extensive information of their educational programs. Throughout the visit, meetings were conducted with International Academic Relations Office Coordinators to evaluate potential future academic partnerships and collaborative projects between the two institutions. At the end of the visit, Constructor University officials were presented with a gift unique to EMU.





## EMU DEPARTMENT OF ARCHITECTURE ORGANIZES ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE AND PEDAGOGY GATHERING: "AI IN ARCHITECTURE" SEMINAR SERIES

Throughout the 2025 Academic Year, Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU), Faculty of Architecture, Department of Architecture organized a series of academic seminars under the theme "Artificial Intelligence (AI) in Architecture". Led by Assoc. Prof. Dr. Ceren Boğaç from the department, the seminar series explored the educational, ethical, and design-related implications of artificial intelligence in architecture through a comprehensive and multidimensional approach.

"An Introduction to Research, Education and Design" seminar, the first session of the series, was delivered by Assoc. Prof. Dr. Ceren Boğaç and provided an in-depth discussion on the role of artificial intelligence in academic research, its influence on student participation, its role in creative practices, and its ethical considerations. Attended by research assistants and postgraduate students, the session offered a collaborative examination of the present and future impact of artificial intelligence on the architectural discipline.

The following sessions, entitled "Artificial Intelligence in Architecture: Research and Education Foundations" and "Artificial Intelligence in Architecture: Design," focused on how artificial intelligence is employed as a research tool in architecture, its role in literature reviews and data analysis, and the emerging discussions it has introduced within the context of academic ethics. Joined by the EMU Department of Interior Architecture, the seminars also addressed the influence of generative AI on design workflows, its connection to sustainability objectives, and its transformative impact on creative decision-making processes.

The series' session dedicated to students took place on 22 December 2025 and was titled "Artificial Intelligence for Architecture Students: Studio Skills and the Practice of the Future". The seminar explored, through practical examples, how artificial intelligence can be integrated into studio projects, design development, and visualization processes, while also aiming to build students' critical awareness of the boundaries, potential risks, and ethical responsibilities of AI-supported design.

In her remarks on the seminar series, EMU Faculty of Architecture academic staff member Assoc. Prof. Dr. Ceren Boğaç noted that artificial intelligence is becoming increasingly prominent in architectural practice and education. She continued; "Rather than focusing solely on how we use these tools, it is crucial to consider how we situate ourselves in relation to them. The primary aim of launching this series was to view artificial intelligence not just as a short-lived trend that enhances productivity,

but as a pedagogical domain that calls for critical engagement, ethical sensitivity, and AI literacy".

In her speech, Prof. Dr. Rafooneh M. Sani, Chair of Department of Architecture, stated that the seminar series serve as an important learning environment that supports creative and critical thinking in architecture education. She added; "The seminars go beyond simple knowledge sharing, helping to broaden the intellectual perspectives of our students

and faculty members. Our department will continue to regard technology not merely as an instrument, but as a pedagogical force that plays a key role in shaping the future of architecture."

In the upcoming phases of the seminar series, undergraduate students are expected to take a more active role through workshop-based activities, while the discussions will be carried forward from a wider educational perspective.

## EMU CUP OF NATIONS FUTSAL TOURNAMENT CHAMPIONS: TRNC IN WOMEN'S AND KENYA IN MEN'S CATEGORY

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Cup of Nations Futsal Tournament, organized by the EMU Student Development, Activities and Sports Affairs Directorate, concluded with the semi-final and final matches held at Lala Mustafa Paşa Sports Complex. The Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC) team completed the tournament as champion in the women's category, while the Kenya team claimed the championship in the men's category.

In the women's category, the tournament featured teams from the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC), Kazakhstan, Türkiye, Lebanon, and Nigeria. Following the semi-final matches, the TRNC team defeated Kazakhstan 2-0, while Türkiye overcame Lebanon with a 3-0 victory, advancing both teams to the final. In the final match, TRNC defeated Türkiye 2-0 to claim the championship. In the third-place match, Kazakhstan beat Lebanon 3-0 to finish the tournament in third place.

Total of 17 teams competed in the men's category of the tournament. In the semi-finals, Nigeria edged past Palestine with a 5-4 win, while Kenya secured a 3-2 victory over Sudan, advancing to the final. In an

exciting championship match, Kenya put on a strong display to defeat Nigeria 3-2 and claim the EMU Cup of Nations 2025 men's title. Meanwhile, Sudan defeated Palestine 1-0 in the third-place match to finish the tournament in third position.

### EMU and Parliament Face Off in an Entertaining Match

As part of the tournament program, a friendly match took place between the EMU team and the TRNC Parliament team. The Parliament side, featuring UBP MP Emrah Yeşilirmak, Independent MP Hasan Büyükoğlu, former MP Mesut Genç, and former Yeniboğaziçi Mayor Mustafa Zurnacılar, competed against a team made up of EMU staff. The match concluded with a 2-0 victory for the TRNC Parliament Team.

### Special Awards Presented

Special awards were presented in various categories during an awards ceremony held after the tournament. The "Most Sportsmanlike Women's Team" award went to Kazakhstan, while the "Most Sportsmanlike Men's Team" award was given to Türkiye. Malcolm from Kenya team was named the "Most Valuable Male Player (MVP)" of the tournament. On the

other hand, Nisanur from TRNC team was awarded with the "Most Valuable Female Player (MVP)" award. Furthermore, Kenya was named the "Best Student Society". Nehir from TRNC team received "Best Female Goalkeeper" award and, Nadir from Kenya team also received "Best Male Goalkeeper" award.

The awards were presented by EMU Rector Prof. Dr. Hasan Kılıç, EMU Vice Rector for Student Affairs Prof. Dr. Sonuç Zorlu, Project and Infrastructure Management Director Sami Ömer, Former Mayor of Yeniboğaziçi Mustafa Zurnacılar, Sports Affairs Coordinator Aydın Kayol and, personnel at the Student Development, Activities and Sports Affairs Directorate.
